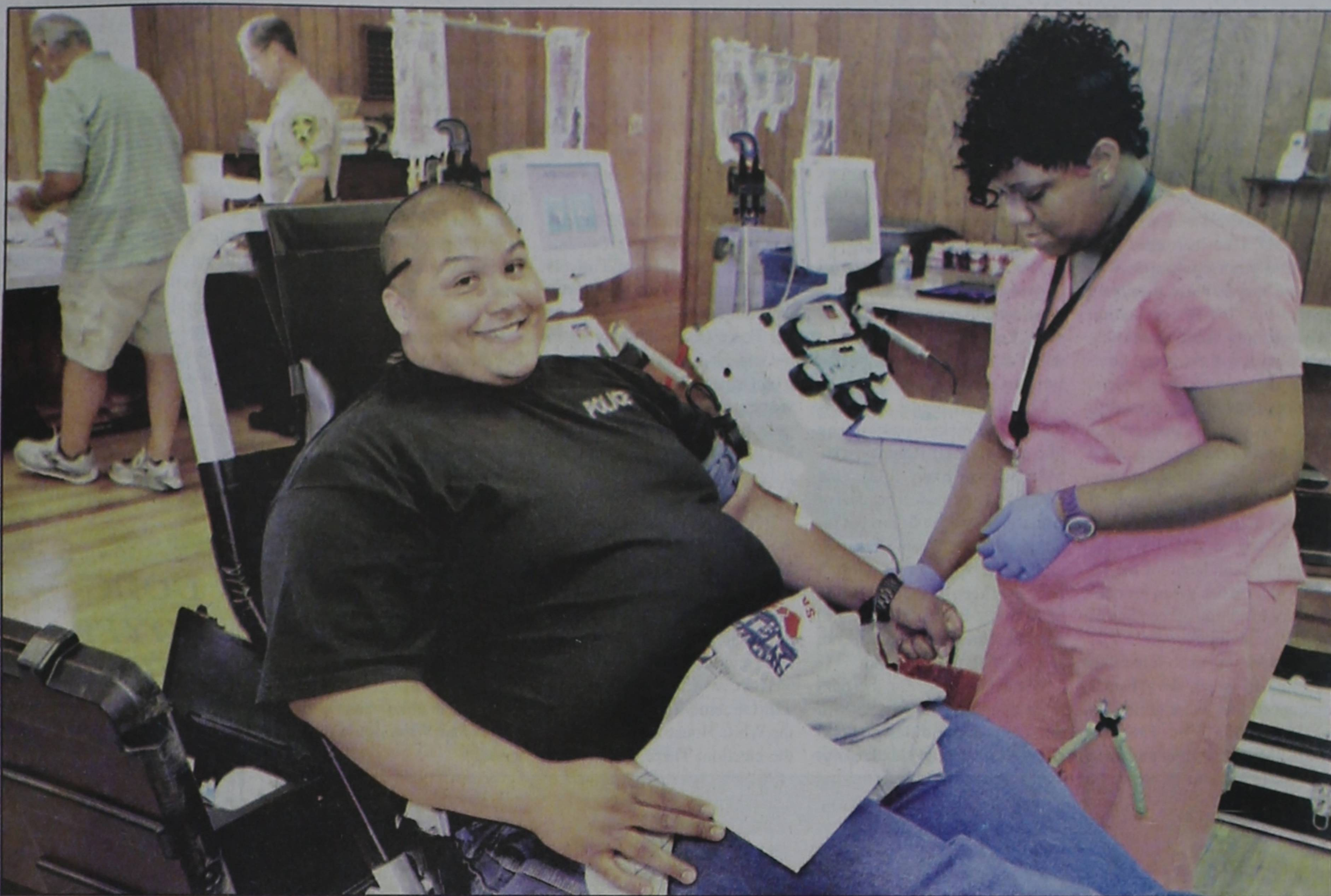
Crime Stoppers raffle winners

Parmer County Election results

In the Republican U.S. Senate race voting in Parmer County, Ted Cruz beat David Dewhurst by two votes, 218-216. A total of 441 votes were cast, not quite 10% of the registered voters in the county. Only seven Democratic votes were cast.

In other races: Railroad Commissioner, Warren Chisum 249 - Christi Craddick 176; Railroad Commissioner Unexpired Term, Barry Smitherman 276 - Greg Parker 113; and Justice Supreme Court Place 4, John Devine 202 - David Medina 180.

Cruz, Craddick, Smitherman, and Devine won the state-wide election. On the Parmer County Democratic ballot for U.S. Senator Paul Sadler 5 - Grady Yarbrough 2.

Parmer County now has a website

Parmer County commissioners have been working on a website for a few months and employed Lynn Hicks of Web-Pace in Muleshoe to build it. She says the site is now active but she will be working on refining it over the next couple of months.

The website address is www.parmercounty.org. The commissioners approved the website to assist the people of Parmer County in finding information about all county activities, departments, and personnel.

Hicks said she is still working on the Sheriff's Department section of the website. When complete, residents will be able to find out who is in jail, bond amounts, and other jail related information. "We will have a lot of useful information posted on the Sheriff's Department section

of the site within the next six weeks," Hicks said.

The site will introduce people to all of the employees and departments at the courthouse. Information about jury participants and updates on whether they need to appear for court will be available.

Other site features will be: online vehicle renewal, driver license renewal, apply for voter registration, dates of commissioners meetings, minutes of commissioners meetings, info and hours of all Justice of the Peace offic-

es, a link to pay citations online, links to all departments, and information links available under the County and District Attorney's office.

Hicks said, "The site will be constantly evolving and more information will be added in the coming months. Our goal is to make this site a useful tool for all the residents of Parmer County. If you have any suggestions of items you would like listed on the site, please fill out the contact form that is available for suggestions. We look forward to your feedback."

New police chief hired

The Friona city manager, city council, and mayor interviewed finalists for the Friona police chief position this week.

At our Wednesday press deadline, city manager Patricia Phipps said they had hired Frank Mooney as the new chief. He will report for duty on August 20. He will come to Friona from Jacksboro, Texas. Chief Mooney has 29 years experience in law enforcement. He and his wife have a 17-year-old son.

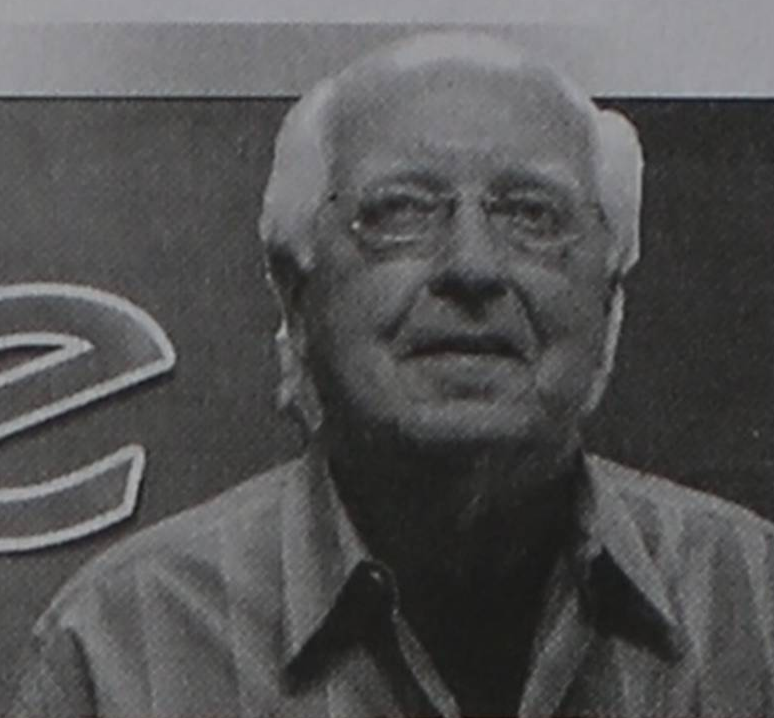

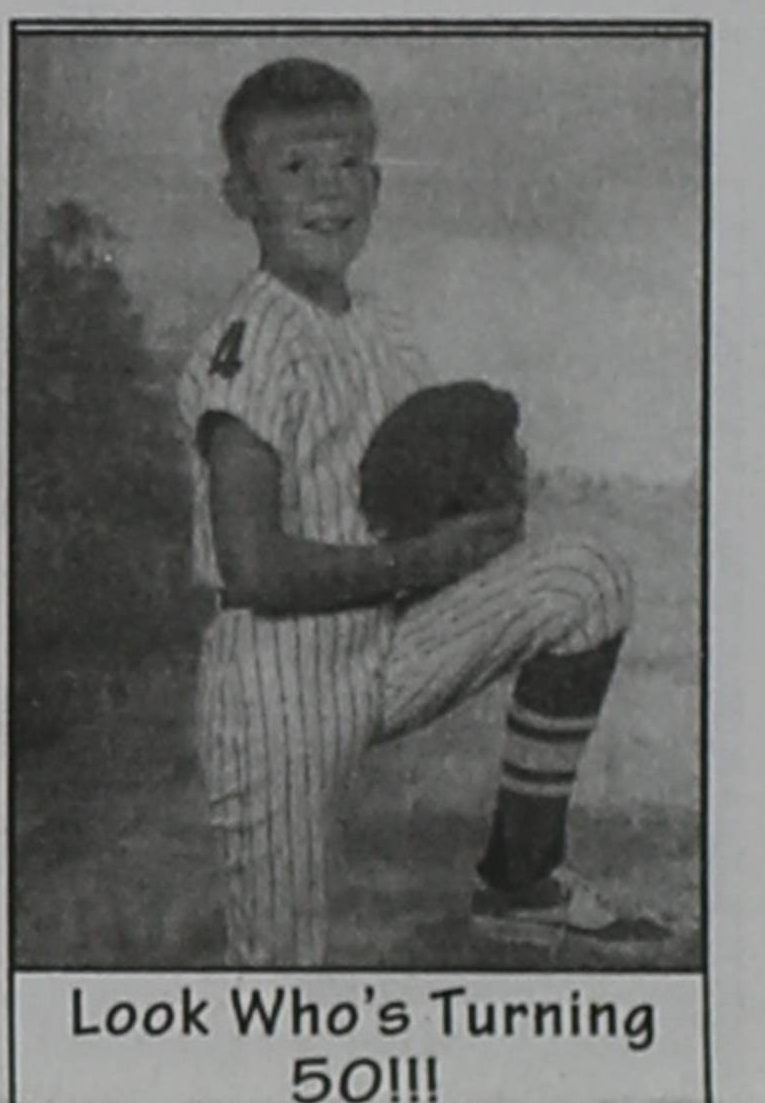

Heritage Estates and a bunch of fine dedicated employees.

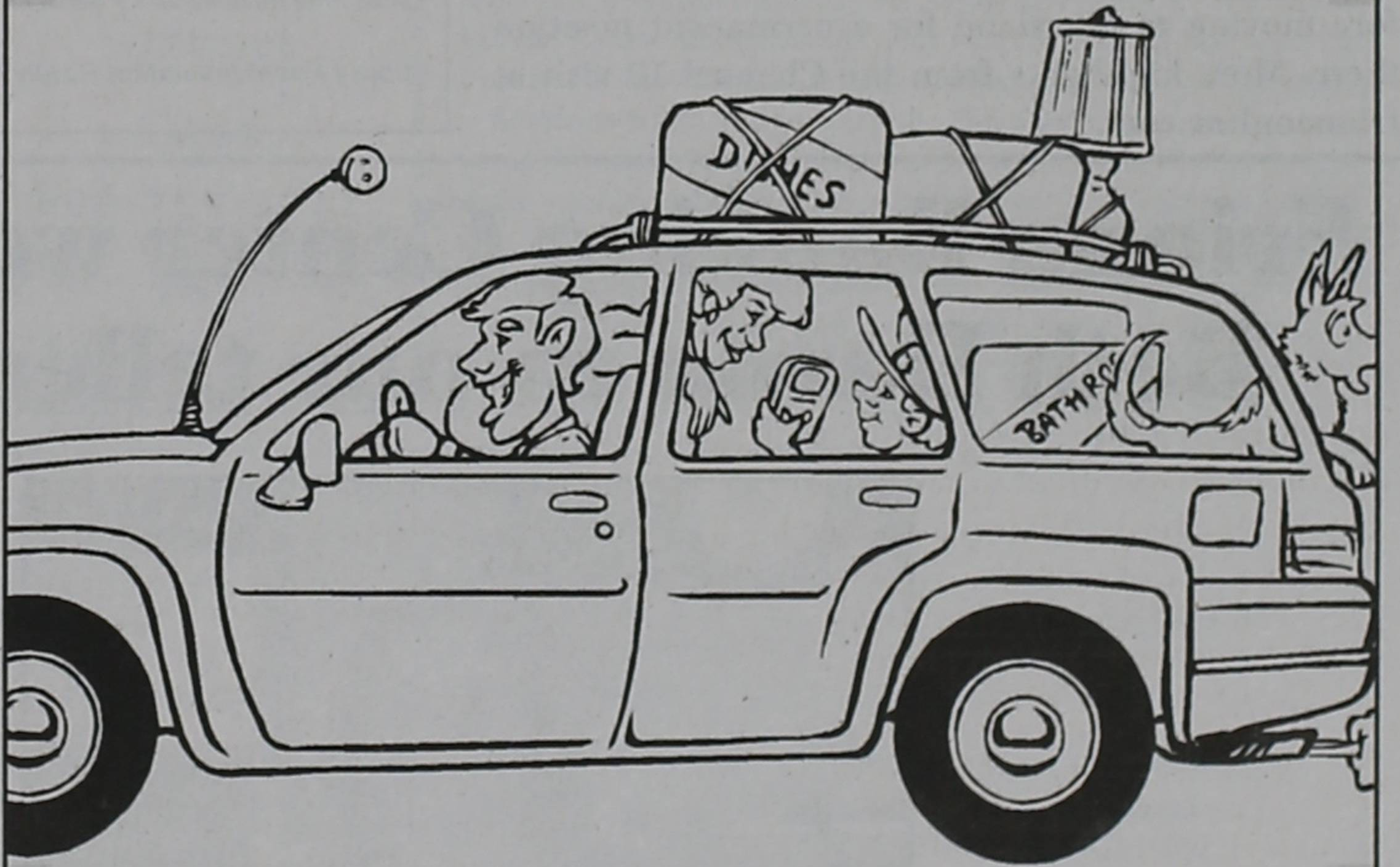

Drought conditions persist

By Monti Vandiver, Extension Agent-IPM

While many parts of Texas have seen some drought relief, the Northwest Plains and South Plains continue to be very dry. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, 100% of Bailey County, 95% of Lamb County, and the southwest half of Parmer County are under extreme drought conditions.

In addition the northeast half of Parmer County is under extreme drought conditions. These very dry conditions continue to tax irrigation systems at an elevated rate. Crop moisture demands have continued to ramp up, exceeding two inches per week. This high demand, exhausted soil moisture reserves, and continued hot dry weather, have continued to force producers to consider diverting irrigation resources in hopes of salvaging at least some of their crop.

Diverting resources from one crop to another is an extremely tough decision but in situations of extreme drought it may be the only way to save a portion of the crop and would be considered a good management decision. Consult your crop insurance agent before making your final decision.

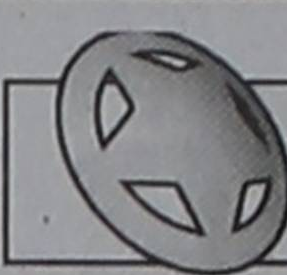

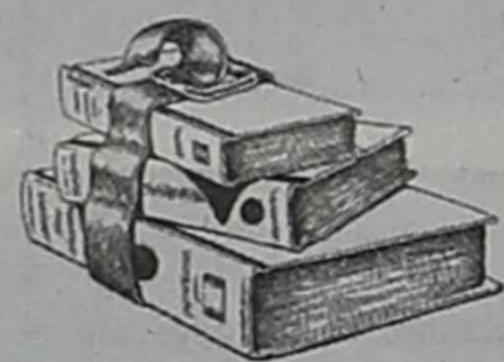
