A call to action: Don't hang up on rural America

"I believe in looking reality straight in the eye," the radio host Garrison Keillor once said, "and denying it!" This sounds like the approach taken by some government agencies when they announce they are "reforming" some major policy.

Frankly, it seems to be happening with the Federal Communications Commission's reform of the Universal Service Fund. That's the fund that makes sure that even rural and high-cost areas of the country get affordable telecommunications services.

The FCC, in its new ruling, takes apart the high-cost part of the USF and uses the money for its new Connect America Fund, repositioning the money to support broadband-capable networks. The problem is the plan does not include any specific program for promoting or sustaining broadband in rural America over the long run. The FCC insists that this reform plan will be good for rural America. But this could be another case of "looking reality straight in the eye and denying it".

It has been 16 years since Congress wrote new legislation governing U.S. telecommunications. That was itself the first revision since the 1930s. So it was a reform full of promises. But there have been more breathtaking changes in telecommunications over the past 16 years than in the previous 62 years, when they wrote the first federal policies governing the telephone business. Telephone service now includes video, voice and data. It also includes landlines and wireless. **ACROSS** 41 TXism: "can stay neck

In the early days of telephone use, the government knew that it would be costly to reach rural and high-cost areas, so it created a universal service policy to help make that happen. Over the years that fundamental policy, and the specific USF program that Congress created in 1996, has successfully ensured that small towns and family farms had affordable service.

Now, with all of the recent technological and market changes, the FCC has decided to dismantle the USF and turn it into a broadband fund to "connect America", as the commission explains. It's an admirable goal to make sure that broadband is seen as essential and that networks are built and supported to enable that service.

But the Connect America Fund has no plan that covers all of rural America. Without continuing Universal Service Fund support, there are real questions about whether the FCC can or will keep the promise offered by the government commitment to universal service for so many years.

I grew up in a town of 300 people and know how easy it is for government policies to leave behind small towns and rural areas. In this age of video, voice and data, areas left behind are also left out. They won't be able to take advantage of telemedicine, distance

education, real-time financial information and so much more.

The FCC needs to study the effects of its Connect America Fund on rural consumers and small businesses to avoid unintended consequences. To do so, the FCC can leverage an organization I helped create with the 1996 Telecommunications Act.

That legislation created the Federal-State Joint Board on Universal Service, which comprises consumer advocates, state utility commissioners and FCC commissioners. This board provides the platform for thoughtful partnership between federal and state regulators and stakeholder discussions about how to make certain the philosophy of universal service is implemented as Congress intended. The joint board can take stock of important things--like whether the Connect America Fund is actually driving rural network deployment and keeping rural service rates reasonable.

Rather than rush to implement major policy decisions---with consequences that neither the FCC nor anyone else fully understands--- the FCC's next step should be to look to the joint board for analysis and review. Let's have another body---closest to the rural consumers and businesses that the Universal Service Fund is supposed to serve---look reality straight in the eye and tell us what it sees.

With all the serious issues facing our country today-staggering deficits, devastating drought, and stagnant unemployment-it may seem strange that so many people are arguing over chicken sandwiches.

But when Chick-Fil-A President and CEO Dan Cathy told the Baptist Press on July 16, 2012 that he supported the, "biblical definition of the family unit," he sparked an uproar. The mayors of Boston, Washington, D.C., and Chicago said they would prefer not to welcome Chick-Fil-A to their cities. Some consumers pledged to stop patronizing Chick-Fil-A, while others showed support either for Cathy's comments or his right to say them by turning out in droves to buy chicken and fries.


Personally, I support Cathy's position on traditional marriage, but even if I disagreed with him, I would support his freedom of speech and the right to share his opinion without being demonized.

After the controversy surrounding Cathy's comments, Chick-Fil-A issued a statement saying, "our intent is to leave the policy debate over same-sex marriage to the government and political arena." I'd like to update you on the status of that debate at the federal level.

I am a strong supporter of traditional marriage. To that end, I have cosponsored H.J. Res. 45, a Constitutional amendment that would define marriage as a union between a man and a woman. It says that, "neither this Constitution, nor the constitution of any State, shall be construed to require that marriage or the legal incidents thereof be conferred upon any union other than the union of a man and a woman."

I will continue working on behalf of my constituents to protect traditional family values with legislation.

Name change at AgriLife again

Once upon a time it was Texas Cooperative Extension. Then came AgriLife Extension. Now, effective September 1, 2012, the county extension offices will be known as Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service.

Four state agricultural agencies, three of which have served Texans for about 100 years, are adding Texas A&M to their names to reflect their connection to the system that includes Texas A&M University. The new names are Texas A&M AgriLife Research, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service, Texas A&M Forest Service, and Texas A&M Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratory.

According to the resolution adopted by the Texas A&M University System Board of Regents, "This lack of identification with the A&M System has the potential to cause confusion and to hinder A&M System and agency efforts to effectively communicate to constituents and stakeholders the mission, accomplishments, and public benefit of individual agencies and how these correspond with the other A&M System agencies."

Comptroller distributes sales tax

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs announced that state sales tax revenue in July was \$2.05 billion, up 10.1 percent compared to July 2011.

"Business spending in the oil and natural gas industry and other sectors continues to be robust," Combs said. "That spending, along with increases in consumer sectors such as retail trade, continues to boost sales tax collections. State sales tax revenue has now increased for 28 consecutive months."

The sales tax figures represent monthly sales made in June as well as April, May and June sales by businesses that report tax quarterly. Parmer County's August 2012 payment totaled \$62,108.71, broken down as Bovina \$11,446.85; Farwell \$14,257.64; and Friona \$36,404.22. In August 2011, the tax payment total was \$57,121.20.

Comparing tax receipts from the same period last year, payments were up 8.73%, broken down as Bovina 28.98%; Farwell 36.78%; and Friona -3.75%. For the year, Parmer County cities have received a total of \$393,954.75 as compared to \$377,463.47 for the same period last year, a 4.36% change.

Billions of years or six days?

Evolution says the world began an estimated 4.5 billion years ago, while the Bible says God created it in six days and rested on the seventh, and according to biblical timescales and genealogies the earth is 10,000-6,000 years old. Evolution needs billions of years to accommodate the slow changes that cause life to spring from no life and for one living molecule to evolve into all forms of life we witness today. According to the Bible, God created in six, literal 24 hour days.

Occasionally, there is a debate whether the "days" mentioned in Genesis represent thousands of years or "ages", but in Genesis 1 God is pretty clear that day means day. You see, in the Old Testament, the word "day" does occasionally refer to a time period greater than a 24 hour day, but it always means a 24 hour day, when it is paired with a number, and the phrase "evening and morning". For example, Genesis 1:13 says, "And there was evening and there was morning, the third day."

Adding clarity to a creation timescale, Exodus 20:11 proclaims, "For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea and all that is in them and rested on the seventh day", and in Matthew 19:4 Jesus says God instituted marriage "in the beginning", not billions of years later as some who mix creation and evolution would teach.

Eye of the hurricane


