## Council will adopt budgets and tax rates

The Friona city council will meet in regular session Monday September 10 at 6:30 p.m. in council chambers, 619 Main St. All council meetings are open to the public.

The first item of business will be to hear comments from the public regarding the proposed city budget for fiscal year 2012-2013. (See public notice elsewhere in this Star.)

The proposed 2012-2013 budgets for Prairie Acres Nursing Home and the Friona Economic Development Corporation

(FEDC) will be considered. Action will be taken on approval of appointments to the FEDC board of directors.

Item 9: Consider and take action on approval of ordinance adopting budget and making appropriation for support of city government for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2012 and ending September 30, 2013.

Item 10: Consider and take action on approval of ordinance adopting tax rate of \$0.79/\$100 valuation for use and support of the municipal government of the city of Friona, Texas, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2012 and ending September 30, 2013.

Item 11: Consider and take action on approval of tax rate and providing for the interest and sinking fund of \$0.2498/\$100 valuation.

Item 12: Consider and take action on approval of ratification of adopted 2012 tax rate of \$0.79/\$100 valuation which will raise \$106,650 more revenue from property taxes than raised in 2011.

The council will also take action on awarding bids to sell a 1967 motor grader and purchase a 1996 or newer motor grader; discuss the August payables and financial statements; take ac-

tion on vote for board of trustees places 11-14 for the Texas Municipal League intergovernmental risk pool; and consider approval of an agreement with Friona Rural Health Clinic.

Agenda items shown here make up the tentative agenda and are subject to change. The final official agenda is posted on the front window at city hall 72 hours prior to the meeting.

Only entries on the official entry blank will be accepted and judged. Copies of the entry form are okay but entries on scratch paper, notebook paper, or paper sacks will be discarded. Local entries can be dropped off in the red mailbox in front of the Star office and at Dorothy's Beauty Shop in Bovina.

If we make an error and include a game that is not played, the game will be tossed out of the judging. We will compute the weekly standings, keep account of the individual point totals, and publish them in the following week's paper.

A word of caution to contestants that fax entries. Make sure you fax a clean copy of the entry form. We often receive faxed copies that are smudged or too dark to read. And remember we need your name, written legibly, a phone number, and an address so we can mail your check if you win.

god and nature didn't create our rights

A few weeks back I subscribed to the Progressive Magazine.

I thought it would be helpful to understand more about progressives and their view of the government. These days when you subscribe to a magazine they ask for your email address to send occasional random stuff. That's fine. After all emails can be quickly deleted.

They offered 12 issues for \$14.97, a paltry sum for a look at the progressive mindset. The magazine has been published since 1909 and I'm just now hearing about it.

After receiving a couple of issues I couldn't find anything very controversial, just a bunch of opinions that I do not agree with. Progressives believe in government, the more the better.

Last week an email arrived from Progressive Magazine edi-

tor Matthew Rothschild. The title of the email was Paul Ryan Has it Wrong on Where Our Rights Come From. Here is what Mr. Rothschild wrote. (You can form your own opinion.)

"A lot of commentators are focusing, understandably, on the exaggerations and distortions in Paul Ryan's speech. But I'd like to focus on something more philosophical.

In his speech, Paul Ryan repeated a line he delivered on the morning Mitt Romney selected him. Here's the line: 'Our rights and religion and privacy, for income from nature and God, not from government.'

Let me try to unpack that one, bit by bit. I'm an atheist, so the idea that our rights come from God is a nonstarter for me. But do they come from nature?

Now I believe in universal human rights, but some mythi-

cal Mother Nature didn't bestow these rights upon us, either. No, these human rights—and the ideas and the ideals that conceived them-came from the minds of men and women who wrestled with the big questions: What is fair and just? Over time, a commonly held sense of right and wrong developed, which was then enacted into law by-yesgovernment.

Laws, if they are just, enable us to exercise our rights—to freedom of speech and assembly stance. And to suffrage and our freedom to participate equally in our governance.

And to the freedom to clean air, and clean water, and safe workplaces. And government also defends our freedom from discrimination, robbery, assault, murder, and invasion, for that matter.

For all these protections, some form of popular government is needed, or the most brutish person or gang member may rule and then trample on our rights.

So, in actuality God and nature didn't create our rights, and they sure don't preserve our rights.

We did that, and we do that, by ourselves, and through our instrument, government, it is truly democratic and respectful of our finest principles.

But Ryan, by positing that our rights come from God and nature, can foist his anti-abortion beliefs or his anti-regulation beliefs upon us under the cloak of the phantom God or nature's way, neither of which is subject to rational refutation or any truly democratic debate. They are just trump cards. And he plays them cleverly."



Enjoyed the Friona Star this evening.



Get a pen and your calendar. You are going to need it for this week's Town Talk, full of activities you will want to remember, support, and attend. Check out the Maize Days schedule on the Cargill sponsored page. Going to be a busy couple of weeks. How about chocolate covered bacon on a stick? Look for it.

Spoke with Superintendent Kenny Austin this week. The FISD enrollment on the first day of school was 1,179, compared with 1,183 last year. High school enrollment is 336. He said enrollment usually increases by a few students after Labor Day. The school board approved a tax rate of \$1.01 per \$100 valuation, which includes \$0.09 per \$100 for the school bond. Contracts were let for the improvements and construction of the new parking lot and activity center at the high school.

The banquet was held in the new Bovina XIT Recreation Center. It was reported that 350 people attended.

Dr. Mindy Neal's Bone Joint Clinic in Bovina has moved into their new and remodeled building at 1100 Hwy 86. It is the former Bovina Pump building. Joining Dr. Neal is Kim McArthur, FNP and her Family Healthcare Clinic.

Bovina police chief Andy Chester has resigned effective September 14. He is returning home to Winnsboro and has accepted the police chief position there. Jana Pitcock, Bovina city manager has also resigned as of August 31. The Bovina city council is taking applications for both positions.

Parmer County Commissioners have approved funding for air conditioning the Parmer County Museum here in Friona. The cost is estimated at \$7,000 with each precinct contributing a share of the cost. Sheriff Randy Geries said the department stopped a vehicle last week and thanks to the Clovis drug dog they seized \$20,000 in cash found under the dash.

If Parmer County drivers receive a traffic citation and fail to appear before the Justice of the Peace they can now have their driver license suspended. Commissioners approved par-

The FHS Class of 1967 will hold its 45th year class reunion on September 14-15, 2012 in conjunction with the annual Maize Days celebration.


Planned activities include evening cookouts, participation in the parade, lunch, and visiting at the city park. A class picture of reunion participants will be


taken after the parade. Dale and Joe Bob Mann will host class members at their home, 201 West 14th Street, beginning Friday, September 14, at 4 p.m.


#### Blakeley Shae Baldridge

After purchasing a ranch northwest of Clarendon, Charles H. and Grace Dow Bugbee hired Grace's brother, a prominent Boston architect, to design a four-bedroom, one-bath Prairie-style house around the furniture style.

In 1914, the Bugbees moved from Lexington, Massachusetts, into the newly-built home where their fine furniture and decorative arts graced two formal parlors, a formal dining room and two of the four upstairs bedrooms.

The exhibition showcases their Rococo Revival, Renaissance Revival, Colonial Revival and Arts & Crafts furniture in addition to family heirlooms such as a desk once owned by President George Washington's Secretary of War, Henry Knox, and Minton ware and art glass once owned by U.S. Army General Richard Henry Pratt.

With the beautifully furnished interior and an Asian garden, goldfish pond, and an allée of trees on the exterior, the Bugbee home was a showplace for Donley County and the region.

## Residency requirements for first-time CDL applicants

The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) has announced that it will begin implementing the new proof of residency (domicile) requirement for obtaining a commercial driver license (CDL) effective September 4, 2012. The requirements, which only apply to first-time CDL applicants, are the result of legislation approved by the Texas Legislature and comply with federal regulations.





#### What is that smell?

When I was in college, I opened a lid to "something" found in the back of the refrigerator that had made a transformation. Curiosity often kills the cat, but in my case, it got my goat. Whatever "it" was, the smell made me gasp. It is a horrible feeling when the scent of something detestable hits your nostrils. You turn you head, close your eyes, hold your breath and do anything to get away from it. We have all come across something with a smell that deters us. I say all this not necessarily to make light of things that stink, but as a simple reminder that sin to God really stinks.

God does not like sin, he detests it. God cannot be around sin, because not only does it smell bad, it doesn't look any better. The only thing that could make Him turn around while Jesus suffered on the cross was sin. When I was younger, I worked in a feed yard, and after a while I got used to the smell. I didn't even notice until I went home and the door was locked by my mom, until I took those clothes off outside. I wasn't allowed in the house wearing that smell. What a similarity it is with Heaven.

As Christians, we cannot let sin permeate our lives to where we don't even notice the smell. We need to clothe ourselves in righteousness, look for the sin and avoid it when things begin to smell, as you would a skunk, a rotten potato, or a rotten egg. I encourage you to take a deep smell spiritually. Does it smell like a dying soul or one that is alive and fresh?

#### Does creation matter?

Building a biblical worldview apart from Genesis is like building a skyscraper without a foundation in the middle of the Texas Panhandle. Psalm 11:3 says, "If the foundations are destroyed what can the righteous do?" Sadly the theories of modern science have crumbled many a Christian's foundational doctrines that are found in Genesis.

What you believe, and your church teaches about creation matters because many doctrines found in the rest of scriptures have their beginnings in the first few chapters of Genesis such as creation, the created order, humanity's uniqueness, biblical environmentalism, God's judgment, marriage, work, sin and redemption.


