When I was in seventh grade I had an opportunity of a lifetime. For his birthday, a friend invited me to Amarillo to watch a tractor pull. I had never gone before, but I knew it had to be the greatest thing in the world, after all, the announcers on TV made it sound irresistible. Anyway, we arrived and we saw all those monster engine dragsters with tractor tires sitting in rows waiting to share their roar. And roar they did! After the second one my friend and I anxiously looked for the guy selling ear plugs.

The concept behind a tractor pull is to pull a weighted sled for a set distance. The further the tractor goes the weight moves up the sled making it heavier. Engines are blown, many fail to complete the distance and at the very least a lot of noise is created.

It is funny how people do the same thing with sin. For whatever reason, they decide they will deal with their sins themselves and so they back up, hook on, and dig in. 
#### **Eusebio Ramos**






and will try to finish the first round undefeated in Tulia on Saturday.






