## New police policy in effect for unlicensed, uninsured drivers

the city council meeting Monday Friona Police Chief Frank Mooney informed coun-
cil members of a new policy in town regarding unlicensed and un-
insures. Following is an explanation of the policy as furnished by Chief Mooney to the by Chief Mo
Friona Star:
It is the position of the Friona Police Department that unlicensed, uninsured drivers, and drivers whose licenses are invalid represent a hazard to themselves and the community at large. Unlicensed drivers are not only violating state law while operating a motor vehicle ona public roadway, but are less likely to be able to operate a motor vehicle safely, due to failure to know or understand the traffic laws of Texas.
Uninsured drivers also present a threat to other drivers due to their inability to meet the fisability to meet the fis-
