## Mariah Wind Project approved for 1200 Megawatts of Wind Energy

We are pleased to announce that the Parmer County Mariah Wind Project, based in Bovina, Texas, has received approval from the Public Utility Commission of Texas to supply 1200 megawatts (MW) of wind energy into a new CREZ (competitive renewable energy zone) transmission line. The CREZ transmission line under construction southeast of Hereford is expected to be completed by the end of 2013 and will deliver power into the Texas ERCOT (Electric Reliability Council of Texas) grid. The ability to connect into the main Texas grid will offer many more opportunities for the Mariah project to sell its power to utility customers who are located in the large population centers of Texas.

New developments are also taking place in how the Mariah Project will be developed and marketed. Over the past

several months, our partners, Alpha Wind Energy (Denmark) and Havgul Clean Energy (Norway), discussed and agreed to the idea to divide the 1200 MW Mariah project into two 600 MW projects in order to more effectively develop and market the development. Alpha Wind Energy will work with Scandia Wind Southwest on development of the west and south portions of Parmer County as well as the Sherman County and Dallam County sites. Havgul Clean Energy will work with Scatec Energy in development of the "Mariah Northwest" (legal project name) site in northeastern Parmer County. Jim Swafford, CEO of Scandia Wind Southwest LLC, will continue working with both companies as they continue to push these projects forward.

Scatec Energy LLC (www.scatecenergy.com) has also

joined the team and we are extremely fortunate to have them on board. Headquartered in Denver, Colorado, Scatec Energy will play a lead role in developing and marketing the portion of Mariah located in northeast Parmer County. Scatec Energy's parent companies, Scatec Solar and Havgul Clean Energy, are experts in the development of utility-scale solar and wind projects, respectively. They have developed and delivered projects of this magnitude on several continents including North America (multiple projects here in the US), Europe and Africa. Since solar and wind power tend to be complimentary in their output, Scatec Energy has capitalized on the individual energy expertise of its parent companies in order to develop integrated renewable energy farms that produce energy from both wind

and solar resources-and the Mariah sites are some of the best in the US!

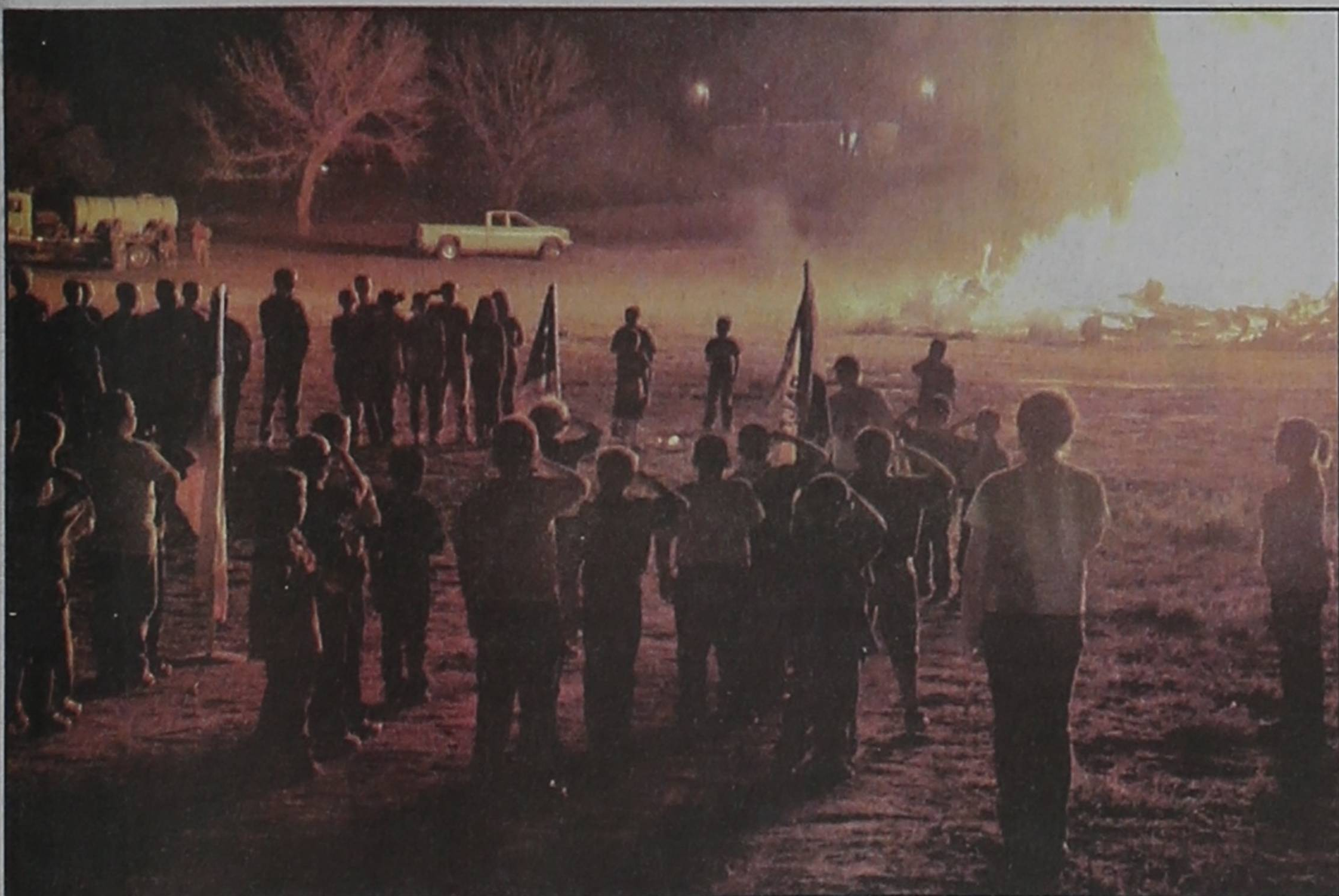
James Scott, CEO of Scatec Energy, is actively preparing the 600 MW site in northeast Parmer County. The Environmental Impact Studies (EIS) are well underway for avian and bat species habitats and archeologists have been on site conducting cultural and historical site reviews. In addition, a transmission right of way corridor is being leased to connect the CREZ substation now under construction southeast of Hereford. Finally, several more meteorological (met) towers are planned in order to supplement the six years of wind data already collected.

"We are excited to be working on the Mariah Project and it is our top priority at Scatec Energy. I am thrilled with the support from our partners, stakeholders and especially

the landowners of Parmer County. As a Texas native, I feel a strong sense of pride working on the Mariah Project and look forward to its success," says Scott.

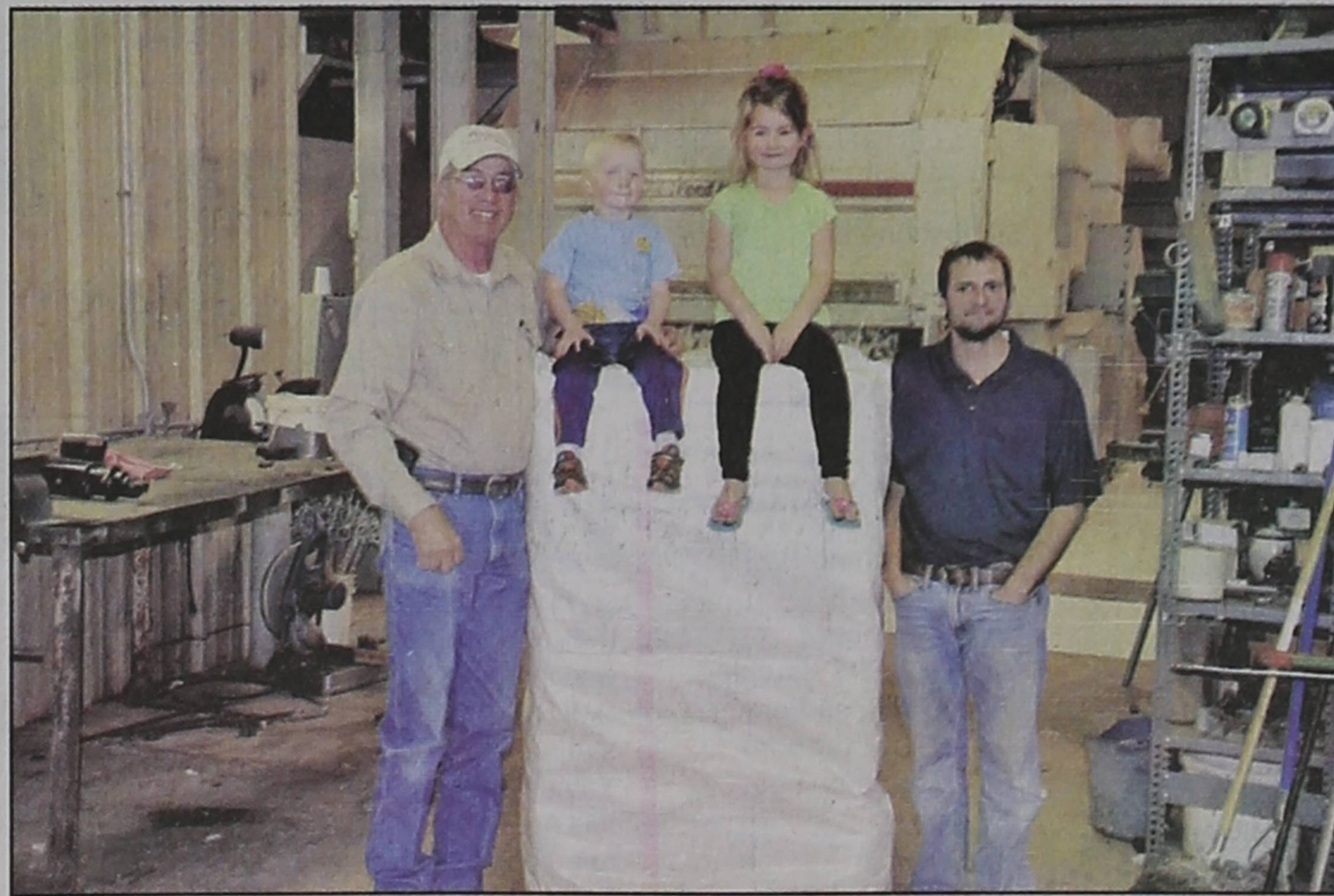
In other news current politics are impacting the wind industry as a whole. The Production Tax Credit (PTC) for the generation of wind electricity has been an effective policy tool in helping the growth of the wind industry in America. The credit is due to expire at the end of 2012 and election year politics and congressional gridlock have prevented a renewal of the credit. Most observers, however, expect that there will be some action taken towards renewal of the PTC after the presidential election.

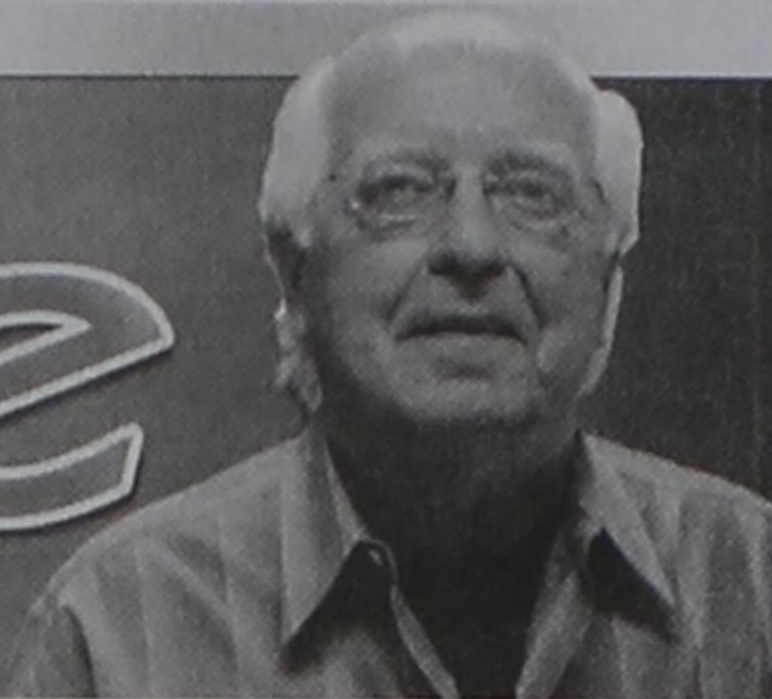

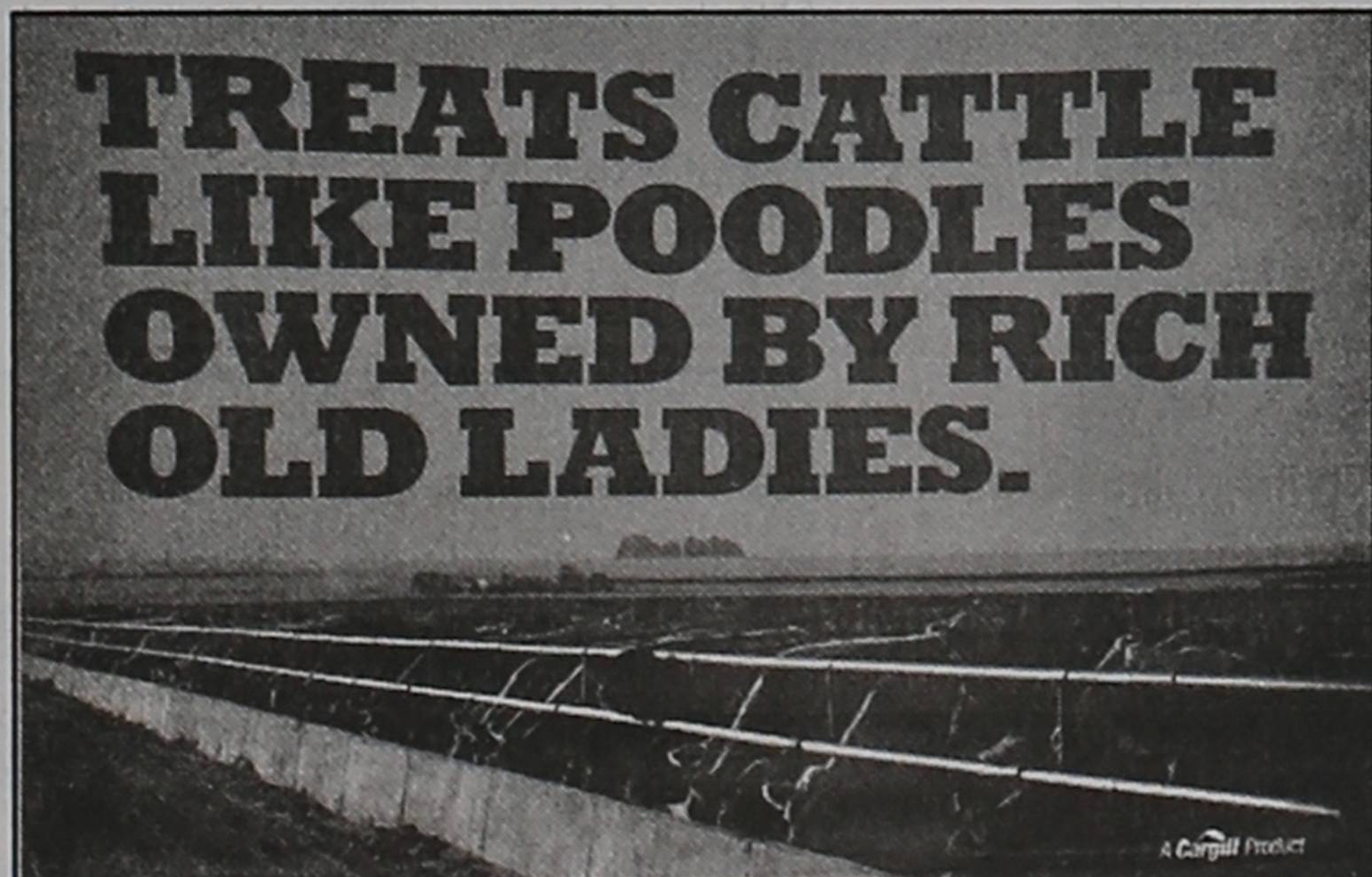

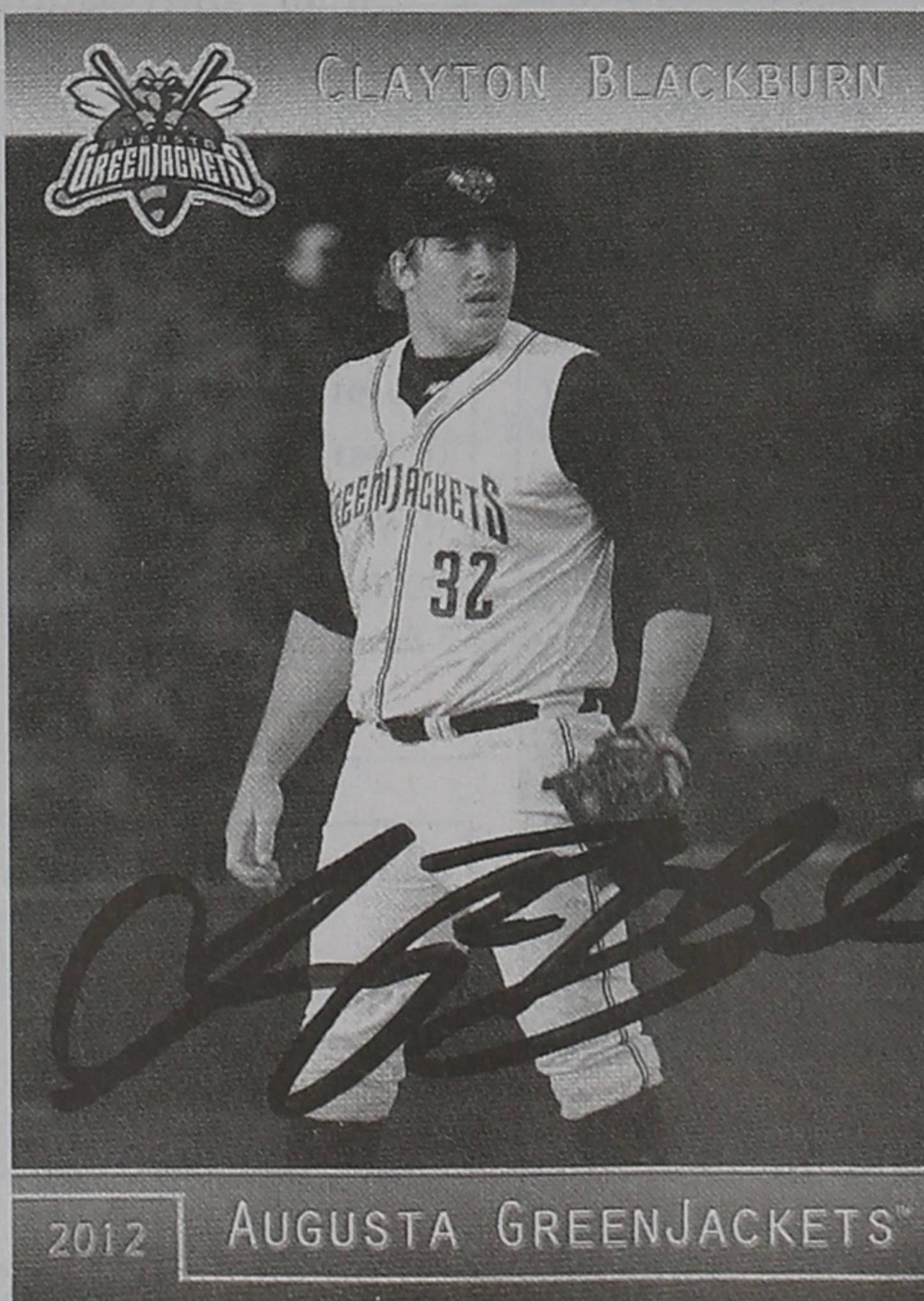

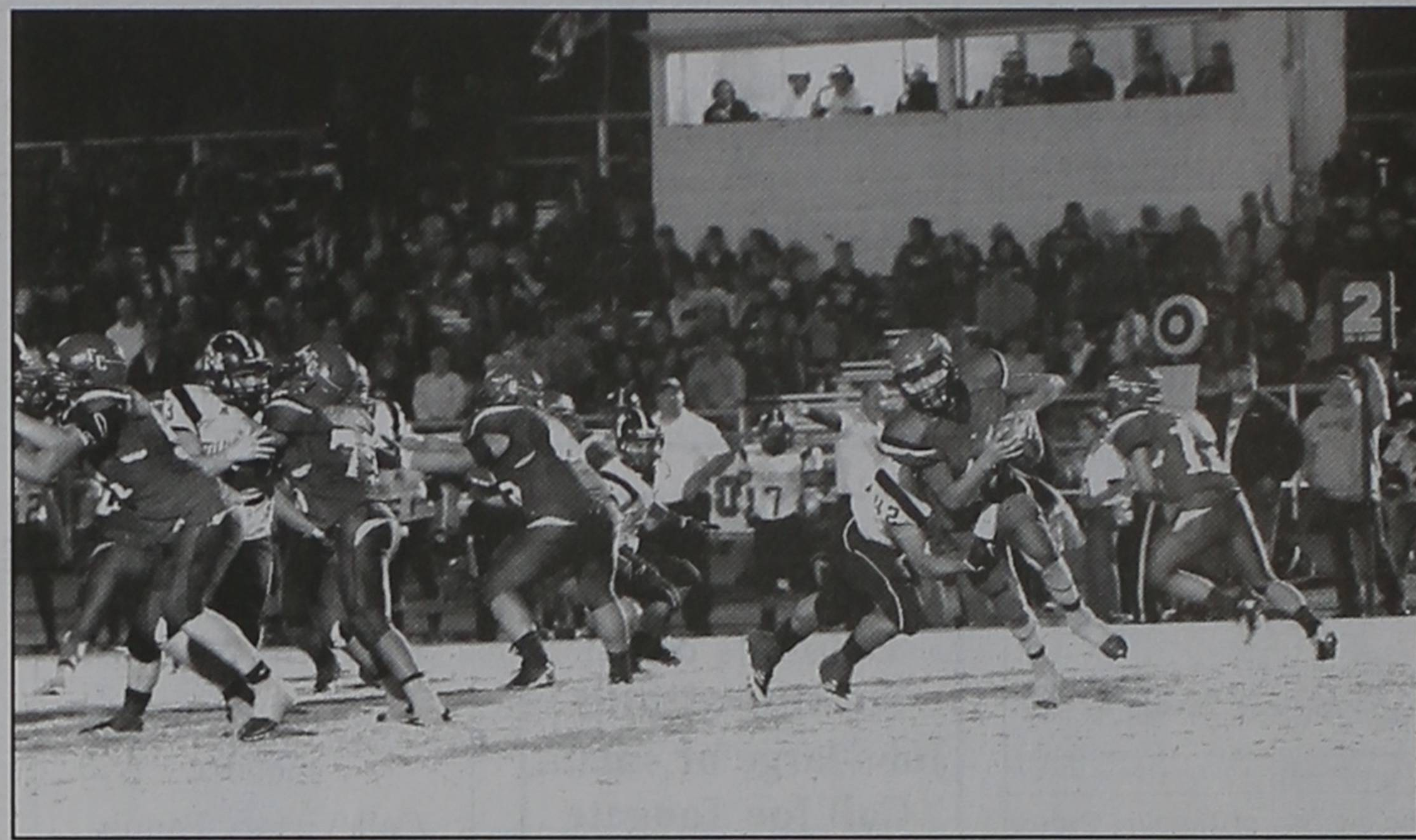

Construction has been underway for the Cargill Sweet Bran facility being built west of Bovina on Hwy 60. Workers have displaced over 75,000 yards of dirt in preparation for building the plant. Most of the dirt will be used to build up the railroad track that will service the plant. When completed in July 2013 the plant will employ 35-40 workers and dispatch 400 truck loads per day.
