### FFA team heads to state

The Friona FFA team of Coke Capshaw, Sawyer Osborn, and Brady Hansard won the Area 1 Leadership Development event in Radio Broadcasting held last Saturday at WTAMU in Canyon. They competed against 11 other Radio Broadcast teams that qualified for the Area contest from the six FFA districts in Area 1.

Only the top two teams from each area qualify to go to the State FFA Leadership Development event held at Sam Houston State University in Huntsville. Ten areas make up the Texas FFA so Friona's team is already in the top 20 in the state.

The Friona FFA's Radio Broadcasting Team delivered a radio program over Texas Wind Energy and the impact that industry is making on small rural communities in the Panhandle and South Plains of Texas. They will compete in the semi-finals on Friday November 30 and hopefully will advance to the finals that are held on Saturday December 1. The Friona FFA ag instructor is Tracy Blount.

The premise of Project Christmas Card in the beginning many years ago was for people to donate to the hospital auxiliary instead of spending on Christmas cards. Over the years the auxiliary has been able to provide many different pieces of equipment to the hospital. They hope this year will continue the tradition.

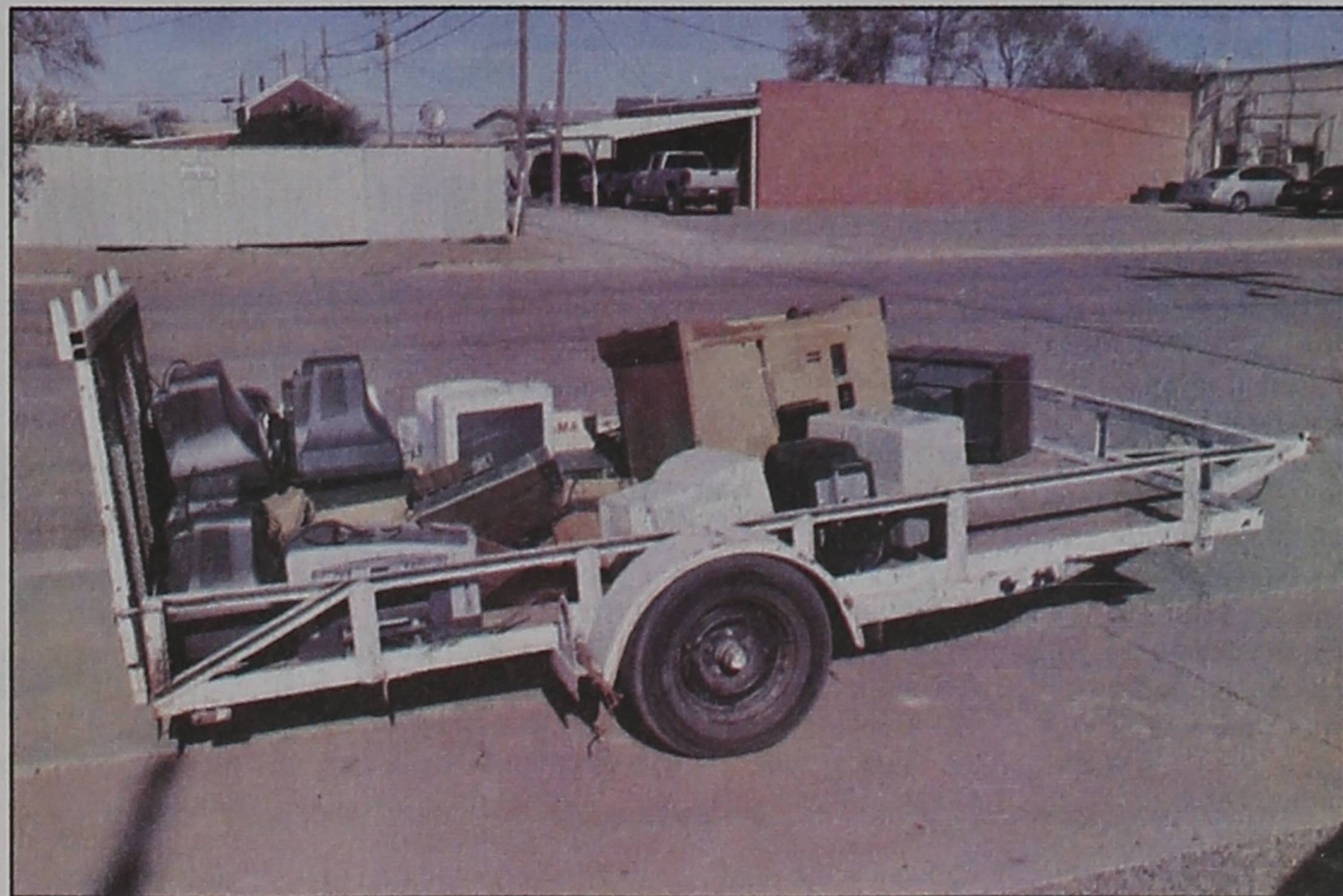

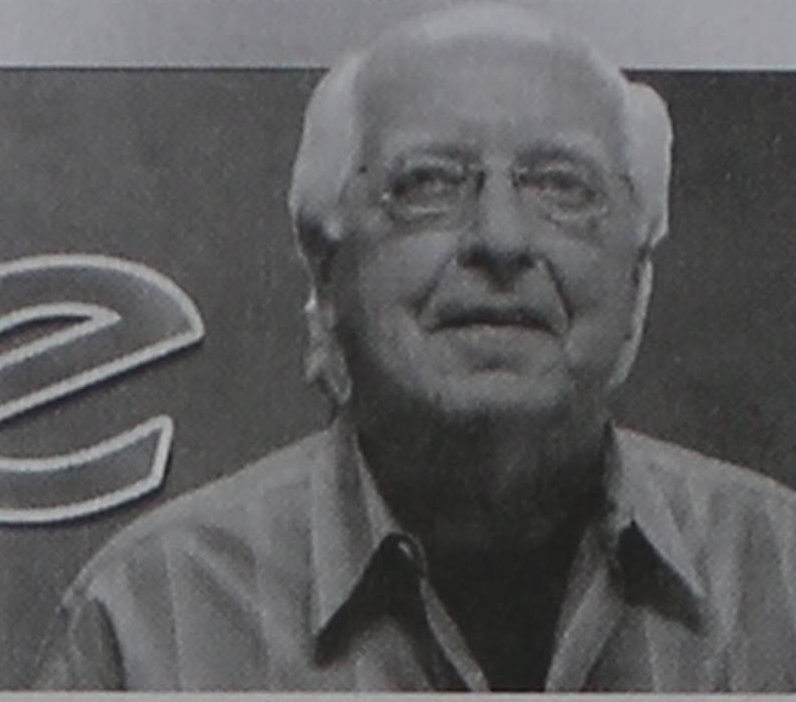

## EPA denies corn waiver request

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) denied the request by U.S. ranchers including the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association (TSCRA), to waive the current Renewable Fuels Standard (RFS). The request for a waiver was made in light of corn shortages and soaring feed costs across the country.

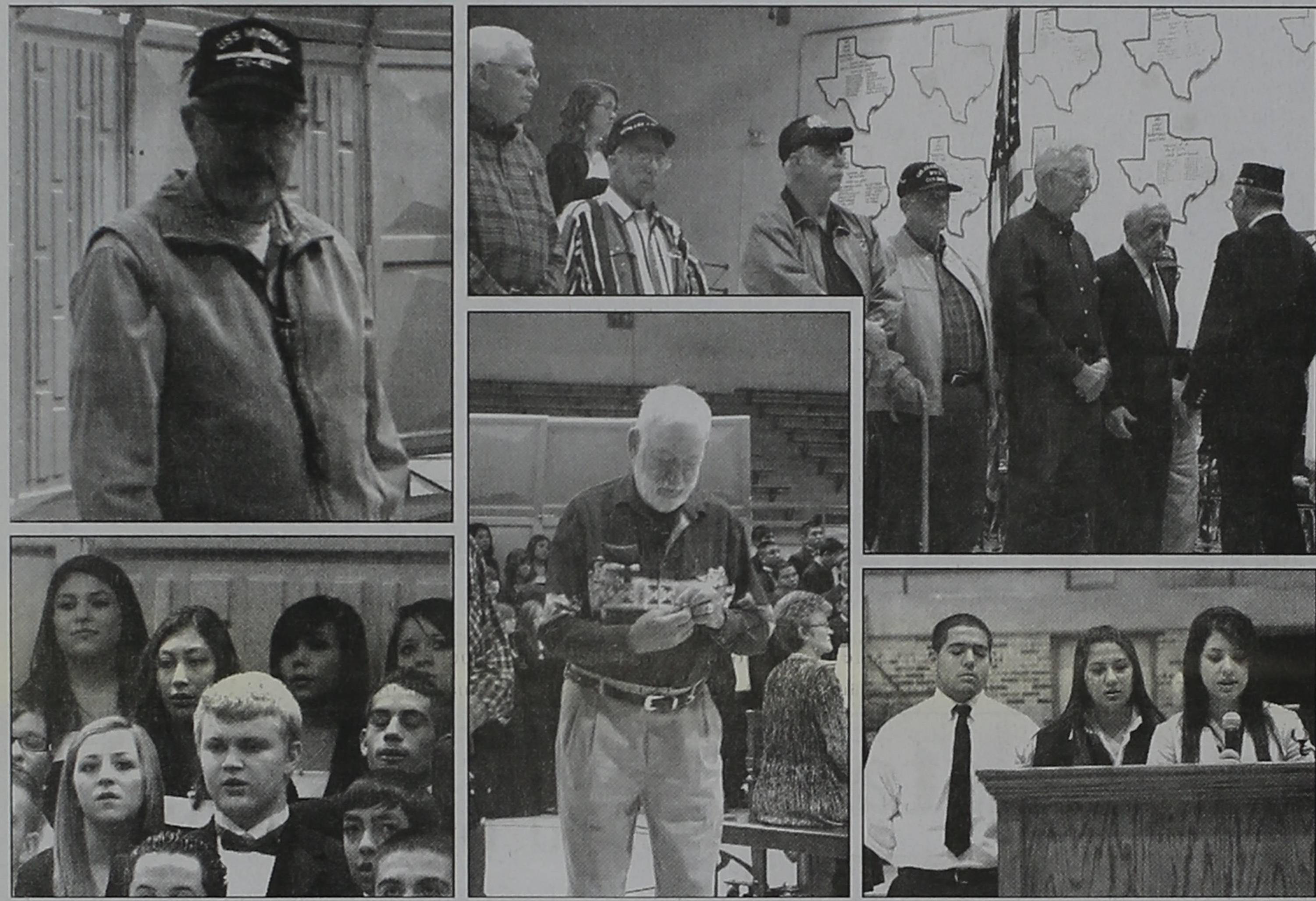
"It is truly unbelievable that a government agency would ignore the fact that we are facing a dire corn shortage in this country," said Joe Parker Jr., rancher and TSCRA president. "By continuing to mandate that 40 percent of the very small U.S. corn crop go directly toward ethanol production, the government is escalating an already dire situation by bolstering an artificial market that will further push some ranching families out of business."

Parker says that as long as corn supplies continue to tighten across the U.S. the current RFS standard will only compound the situation by reducing the already extremely limited amount of corn available for feed. This

situation is particularly severe in Texas, the leading cattle producing state in the nation.

"The EPA had an opportunity to show their support, in some regard, of the U.S. cattle industry," continued Parker. "Instead they continue to put our food and fuel in competition with one another by giving one commodity a leg-up at the expense of another. Chalk this up to another instance in a long line of examples that demonstrates that the government, particularly the EPA, does not support the cattle industry or the free market."

(TRSCA is a 135 year-old trade association and is the largest and oldest livestock organization based in Texas. TSCRA has more than 15,000 beef cattle operations, ranching families and businesses as members. These members represent approximately 50,000 individuals directly involved in ranching and beef production who manage 4 million head of cattle on 76 million acres of range and pasture land primarily in Texas and Oklahoma, but throughout the Southwest.)



## No insurance exchange for Texas

Gov. Rick Perry today, in a follow-up letter to U.S. Health and Human Services Secretary Kathleen Sebelius, reiterated Texas' decision not to implement a state insurance exchange as part of Obamacare. The deadline to inform the federal government of a state's inten-

tion regarding a state exchange is November 16.

"As long as the federal government has the ability to force unknown mandates and costs upon our citizens, while retaining the sole power in approving what an exchange looks like, the notion of a state exchange is merely

an illusion," Gov. Perry's letter said. "It would not be fiscally responsible to put hard-working Texans on the financial hook for an unknown amount of money to operate a system under rules that have not even been written."

Any state exchange must be approved by the Obama Admin-

istration and operate under specific federally mandated rules, many of which have yet to be disclosed. Gov. Perry previously made clear Texas' intention not to implement a state exchange or expand Medicaid under Obamacare in a letter to Secretary Sebelius in July.
