VILLA'S FORCES NOW OCCUPY TOWN OF GOMEZ PALACIOS

Federals Retreat To Stronghold After Desperate Fighting-Gen. Benevides Approaching Torreon From East

By Associated Press.

Juarez, March 24.-Gomez Palacios was in the hands of the rebels today, according to information given out by General Chao here, and General Benavides at the head of the Carrgosa brigade moving against Torreon. No tatement of casualties in the desperate street fighting in Gomez Palacios was available.

Confirmation of the rebel victory in Gomez Palacios was received when a telegram from Villa was picked up here. It ordered that certain supplies be sent direct to Gomez Palacios.

Gen. Benavides is said to be advancing from the east after cutting the railroad to Saltillo. Strategists here think he will be the first to enter the federal stronghold. They believe the bulk of the federal forces was engaged at Gomez Palacios and although the federals returned they will not have time or spirit to unite against Renavides who is advancing from a different direction.

The real test of strength is expected to come when Villa hurls his force against the defense of Torreon. On this battle, it is conceded, hinges the fate of the revolution.

The mountain Cerro de la Pila lies to the right of the street car and railroad tracks and forms an advance portion of the Torreon

The preliminary skirmishing which enabled the insurgents to bring their batteries into action late Monday began at daybreak yesterday and the Federals and the Federals fought stubbornly. They retired from trench to trench on the plains until-driven back on the main force on the slopes of the mountain. The insurgents numbered 3,000, with Gen. Torbido Ortega at their head and Gen. Villa in the immediate back-ground.

Lerdo, where the largest shoe factories in Mexico are located, lies around a shoulder of Cerro de la Pila from Gomez Palacios. It was taken last night without material defense, as the main batteries were planted to command the approaches to Gomez Palacios. It was occupied by the combined forces of Gens. Tomas Urbano, Hernandez and Rodriguez.

The force of ooks as a swind training power is indoubted and books of doubtful val ie have just as much power for il loing as those of great value have for ill doing. So it is the task set before the modern library to train the tastes of its patrons so that they will read and enjoy those books

which can do them nothing but good 'And it would seem then that ev ry city need a library for the us of its students, for helpful instruc tion to the workers in its reach, for the distribution of knowledge and culture through the medium of 'its volumes to those who for various rea sons have had little opportunity to have the things that civilization calls worth while and for the training of modern literary tastes away from the doubtful books to those of undoubted and unquestioned value. 


