WILL USE MARINES TO ENFORCE DEMAND FOR SALUTE OF FLAG

WILL START TOUR TOMORROW DON'T AFFECT, VALLON ENTHER Wilson's Cabinet Meets This Morning And Decides That Admiral's Demand Shall Be Backed Up To The Very Limit. Daniels Issues Order

BRINGS NEW AND GRAVE CRISIS

Entire Naval Fighting Force Of United States Is Being Hurriedly Mobilized In Mexican Waters Today Ready For Eventualities.

Washington, D. C., April 14.—BULLETIN—A general concentration of the Atlantic Fleet at Tampico has been ordered by Secretary Daniels following a Cabinet meeting in which President Wilson laid before the members the urgency of enforcing the demand that the American Flag be saluted by the Huerta commander at Tampico as an apology for the arrest of American marines there recently.

All of the ships of the Atlantic fleet at Hampton Roads have been ordered to Tampico. The Battleship South Carolina en route to San Domingo has been intercepted by wireless and ordered to report at the Mexican port. The gunboats Nashville at San Domingo and the Tacoma at Boston have been ordered to proceed immediately to Tampico.

The torpedo boat Flotilla has been notified to be ready to join the battleships at Tampico on short notice. The transport Hancock with 800 marines has been ordered to proceed there.

The cabinet had discussed the situation in a two hours' meeting at which the general opinion was expressed that the salute must be fired. After the meeting of the cabinet there was a conspicuous silence on the part of all officers and

Secretary Daniels hurried to the navy department where he prepared the orders for the moving While the officials said that no ultimatum had been given the mobilization of the fleet at Tampico was intended to put the United States in a position to enforce one should immediate developments

make it necessary. Naval officials received the order eagerly and there was activity and anticipation on every hand. It was learned authoritatively that while further investigation of the affair had been ordered

here was a general feeling that the demand of Rear Admiral Mayo should be backed up. In the meantime it was ordered the American Charge O'Shaughnessy in Mexico City should con tinue negotiations with Huerta to accede to the demands of the admiral.

Members of the cabinet hope that no further steps will be necessary to secure compliance but they privately admitted the gravity of the situation.

Mobilization of the fleet under such circumstances whether the marines are landed or not, it is pointed out, in most instances would be construed as an act of war. It has been repeatedly held that the landing of marines under such circumstances would be considered an act of war,

It is said, however, that if the Huerta commander at Tampieo fails to resist any aggressive teps to secure the enforcement of the demand for a salute no serious consequences might result as the United States would feel satisfied with the enforcement of the apology.

Washington, April 14.-After onferences between President Wilson, Secretary Bryan and John Linds following a cabinet meeting this morning it was an nounced that before the United government proceeds further in backing up Rear Admiral Mayo's demand for a salute to the American flag by the Mexican commander at Tampico as an apology for the recent arrest of American marines there that a further investigation will be made into the facts surrounding the incident. All the cabinet. members were silent on a situation admittedly grave. They let it be known, however, that a delay did not indicate a disposition on the part of President Wilson to recede from Admiral - Mayo's demand.

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE CORN MEAL RECIPES.

Uncle Sam, as a culinary instruc ent is now issuing bulletins, telling le farmers of the nutritious values f food stuffs and the best way of eparing them.

The peculiar consistency of corn neal which is a disadvantage under ome circumstances, is a great ad antage in making griddle cakes and vaffles, for it makes them very tener, according to a new farmers' bullein issued by the department of agrilture today. Among the many corn recipes which the bulletin rec amends, are the following:

Corn meal pan cakes: Two cups of flour, one half cup of corn ancal, one and one half tablespoons of baking powder, one and one half teaspoons of salt, one-third cup of sugar, one and one-half cups of boiling water, one and one-quarter cups of milk,

Add meal to boiling water and oilstive minutes; turn into bowl, add nilk and remaining dry ingredients wixed and sifted, then egg well beaten and butter. Cook on a greased

Indian pudding. Three cups of milk, ne-third of a cup of corn meal, onehalf of a cup of molasses, one tea poon of sait, one teaspoon of sugar look milk and meal in a double boiler. or twenty minutes; add molasses. salt and sugar. Add one teaspoon of ginger, pour into buttered apudding lish and bake two hours in slow iven. Serve with cream.

It is often possible to substitute corn meal for part of the flour in making cakes. 




