Friona Police Dept. Instigates Program

The Friona Police Department is instigating a "Teddies Tots" program, for children in disturbed environments, including domestic violence and violent crimes.

Officer Ron Englett explains that when an officer responds to a situation where a small child may have been traumatized, they will be offered a teddy bear, to help calm them down.

Englett said the F.P.D. was asking citizens and/or businesses to donate to the department's teddy bear fund. The toys will be kept in plastic bags, and it will be the peace officers' plan to keep one of the toys in the patrol car at all times.

There will be a record made of where the "bears" are distributed, the FPD spokesman said. Contact Englett at 247-2711 if they wish to contribute.

He said that the FPD had statistics from officers in other cities where the teddy bear program has been tried, and it has proven successful.





NEW SHELVING....Lee Witten, chairman of the Friona Public Library board of trustees, is shown here as he helps shift books onto new shelving purchased with memorial





BRIEF EXPLANATORY STATEMENTS OF PROPOSED

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS SPECIAL ELECTION **AUGUST 10, 1991**

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT

Senate Joint Resolution 42 proposes a constitutional amendment that would authorize the newly created county education districts to hold elections to exempt from ad valorem taxation a percentage of the market value of the residence homestead of a married or unmarried adult. The percentage exempted could not exceed 20% of such market value, and the amount exempted could not be less than \$5,000. The amendment would also authorize county education districts to hold elections to exempt from ad valorem taxation not less than \$3,000 of the market value of the residence homestead of a disabled person or a person sixty-five years of age or older. Finally, the amendment would authorize elections in county education districts for the taxation of certain tangible personal property exempted from ad valorem taxation by the legislature.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment to allow the voters of a county education district to adopt certain exemptions from the district's ad valorem taxation for residence homesteads and to provide for the taxation of certain tangible personal property."

PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT


Senate Joint Resolution 5 proposes a constitutional amendment that would allow the legislature to pass general laws authorizing Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board or its successor to issue and sell up to \$300 million of general obligation bonds to finance educational loans to students. The maximum net effective interest rate to be borne by the bonds would be set by law. The amendment would also authorize the legislature to provide for the investment of bond proceeds and to establish an interest and sinking fund to pay the bonds and provide for the investment of such fund. Bonds authorized under this amendment would be paid from the first money coming into the treasury in each fiscal year that is not otherwise appropriated by the constitution, less any amount in an interest and sinking fund established at the end of the preceding year that is pledged to the payment of the bonds or interest.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows:

"The constitutional amendment providing for the issuance of general obligation bonds to provide educational loans to students."

IF YOU WEAR SOFT CONTACT LENSES...

Soft contact lens are, for most people, the most comfortable means of vision correction. Now and again, however, certain "glitches" occur. Do you know how to solve these little problems?


If your soft lens seems dry, soak it for at least a half hour in sterile saline solution. Once the lens is fully hydrated, it should return to its normal texture. It's important that you follow a complete lens-cleaning and disinfection routine before you insert the lens into your eye.

Discomfort or blurry vision are signs that something is wrong. First step is to remove the lens, then check: Is the lens in the wrong eye? Has it been turned inside out in error? Is the lens dirty? Is it torn or nicked?

Changing the lens, turning it right-side out and/or cleaning it should solve the problem. A torn lens must be replaced, of course. And if discomfort or vision problems continue, see your optometrist promptly. Brought to you as a community service by:
