# Editorially Speaking

## Do the Fundamental Laws Change With the Age?

minds of our country is possessed by Benjamin of the world to take the wealth of America by F. Fairless, president of United States Steel; yet force of arms. his observations are so down to earth that they can be appreciated by all of us. We are this week reprinting sketches from a recent graduation address delivered by Mr. Fairless, touching upon the three securities—political, economic, and spiritual—as related to the "Ten Commandments." We quote:

For nearly twenty years we have been told that the laws which were made by our forefathers, and the principles which they established 175 years ago have become obsolete, Government about it. We were told that those fundamental laws and difficult problems which we face in this modern industrial age. We were told that the and new principles.

Now that sounded so logical—and so perfectly seasonable—that we fell for it, hook, line and sinker. We didn't stop to think that the laws of navagation are centuries old, yet they still apply to airplanes just as well as ships. A thousand years ago men reckoned in dozens what they now compute in billions, but the laws of mathematice remain immutable. And so do the laws of physics . . . and of chemistry . . . and God.

Ever since Moses come down from the mountain, the Ten Commandments have been the basic laws of civilized men. They are the laws upon which this nation was founded; and they are as inexorable today as they were in the days of the Pharaohs. But that never occurred to us. We had to have change for the sake of change—so we set up new laws and new principles.

We began to repeal the Ten Commandments starting with the one which says: Thou shalt not covet." And—since we had no legal right to stead from our neighbor the things that we coveted we empowered the Government to do it for us. That we could not legally confer upon the Government a power which we did not morally possess never bothered us

We merely laid aside the laws of God and created a welfare state in the image of Robin Hood. We ordered it to plunder the "haves" and distribute the booty amony the "havenots"-minus certain unavoidable deduction,s of course, for the benefit of our bureaucrats and their friends.

We did not stop to think how dangerous it would be if this doctrine, which we wrote so brazenly into our statutes here at home, were suddenly to be applied to our international affairs. It did not occur to us that if we ourselves proclaimed the right of men to take the wealth of others by political focre, we could

So we went merrily along our way, redictributing the wealth-but not necessarily on the basis of need nor always to the children of misfortune. The controlling factor in most cases was the ability of the recipients to deliver a bloc vote at the polls. And in time, some of these groups became so proficient in the art of voting that we conferred upon a privileged few of them the right to break the Commandments all by themselves without even bothering the



We accepted dishonesty as a necessary ingredient of politics; and the idea that "pubic office is a public trust" was everywhere regarded as quaint and old-fashioned.

Yet all that we did was done with the best of intentions. We sought to protect our fellow men against adversity.
