



Drums, dancing mark debut

Powwow under way at coliseum here; to continue Sunday

With the pounding of drums and the shaking of gourds, the Third Annual Big Spring Powwow announced its presence Saturday morning with authority — and decibels.

More than 100 dancers and upward to 4,000 visitors were expected at this year's Powwow, which continues through Sunday at Dorothy Garrett Coliseum.

The numbers reflect the steady growth of the event since it was resurrected in 2005, organizers said.

"It's grown plenty," Powwow Committee President Robert Downey said. "The first year, we had 13 vendors and 40 dancers. This year, we have more than 100 dancers and 35 vendors ... My phone has been ringing off the wall for the past two weeks."

The event started a bit late — "We're on Indian time," Downey joked — but what it lacked in punctuality it more than made up for in intensity, as booming drums announced the start of gourd dancing, the Powwow's first event.

The grand entry followed at about 11:30 a.m.,

Contract Bridge

A Play Fit for a Queen

South dealer. Neither side vulnerable.

NORTH

Opening lead — six of hearts.

One play can make all the difference between making a contract and going down. Declarer should therefore be careful not to play too hastily when success or failure may hang in the balance.

Take this simple case where declarer gets to three notrump as shown and West lead the six of hearts. Let's say declarer plays the ten of hearts from dummy and East covers the ten with the jack.

South wins with the king, and, with the cards divided as they are, he must eventually go down at least two against best defense. East is bound to score four heart tricks as soon as West gains the lead with the king of clubs and returns a heart through dummy's Q-3. The same result accrues if declarer plays low from dummy on the first trick, in which case East's eight forces the king.

But South has a much better way to play the hand that will stop East-West stone cold dead. All he has to do to stymie the defense is to play the queen of hearts from dummy on West's opening lead.

What can East then do? If he takes the ace, he can't return a heart without establishing dummy's ten. Whether East continues or discontinues the suit, South has all the time he needs to wrap up nine tricks. And if East does not take the ace, he winds up in the same helpless position after declarer next leads the nine of clubs from dummy and loses the finesse to West's king.

The contract thus stands or falls on which card declarer plays from dummy at trick one. After giving due weight to East's one-heart overall, South must recognize the importance of putting up dummy's queen. Otherwise, the contract goes down the drain.

I've been in hurricanes, and I've been in traffic. Those of you, who know me, know I'll take a hurricane if given a choice. Our son, Derek, who lives in Dallas, was on the phone constantly; at first suggesting and then cajoling us to come to Dallas.

It was too late. Traffic was already at a stand-still in Conroe. We had no choice; we would ride it out.

My partner had long ago prepared us for any power outage, she deemed inevitable, when the millennium arrived. She had purchased two — not one, but two — gasoline-powered generators to get us through the weeks when all systems would most certainly fail at the stroke of midnight Dec. 31, 1999.

Needless to say, she's taken scorn and ridicule these last five years ... mostly in fun, not all, but mostly.

You might have thought that she was delighted at the thought of Hurricane Rita making a call. No, it wasn't Rita; it was the redeeming thought that I would be humbled and forced to use the generator for the first time.

I unpacked the generator, put oil

in the crankcase and fuel in the gas tank. We were ready for Rita. Then I began the process of checking it out — place choke in start position, open fuel valve, pull smartly on start rope. I pulled and pulled. In fact, I pulled until I was completely out of breath and not one hint of the thing firing, much less starting. I realized then; five years of inactivity was not good for a piece of machinery.

My partner was sympathetic, yet contrite. "Have you read the manual?" she asked sarcastically. She knew I never read the manual. It was just another engine and should start once fuel, air and spark met in the combustion chamber.

"No, dear, not yet," I replied. "Perhaps you should read to see if there's a sequence you've overlooked."

"OK, OK," I grumbled, "I'll read the manual." I read through the manual as she watched, and then I slowly slinked back into the garage with manual in hand.

"I heard the motor running. Was there something that you'd overlooked?" she asked as I came into the house.

With generator all set and food in the pantry, we were ready for anything. Or so we thought. At 2 a.m. our phone rang. When I

answered, a tired voice wanted to know if I was Doyle Driver and was I close to Marker 82 on Interstate 45. My answers were both affirmative.

"I'm Mark Rozelle, and my mom is your cousin," the voice on the other end said. "We've been on the road from League City since noon yesterday. My wife and babies are tired and hungry. Can we spend the night with you?"

"Of course you can!" I replied. "Take the next exit and we will see you in a few minutes."

Some two hours later they arrived with tired and hungry children and his in-laws. They had only traveled one mile in two hours.

Next morning, shortly after breakfast, Entergy began a series of four days of rolling power outages.

My partner grinned as I started the generator.

We read the manual and calculated the maximum wattage output we could expect. We could run a small window air conditioner, a microwave oven, a coffee maker, a refrigerator, four table or floor lamps, two oscillating fans and a television set.

As my partner moved about downstairs in cool comfort, she just smiled and giggled and smiled.

Thanks to my wife, we had three comfortable days and two nights with relatives and their charming in-laws, John and Judy Peterson.

I had not seen Mark in 20 years and had never met his wife, Angie, or his beautiful children, Alane and Andrew.

Isn't it strange how unpleasant circumstances bring good things to pass?

State briefs

Former Scout leader pleads guilty to sexual assault

EDINBURG (AP) — A former Boy Scout leader and coach already serving a 14-year prison sentence for possessing child pornography pleaded guilty Friday to sexually assaulting one of his former scouts and inappropriately touching several others.

Under the plea deal, Genaro Vela, 59, will be released from prison after serving his child pornography sentence. The guilty plea resolves all criminal cases against Vela.

Vela was among 125 people arrested nationwide in an Internet child pornography case in which subscribers purchased photos and videos of children engaged in sex acts with adults, federal authorities said.

Vela led Boy Scout Troop 83 in Mission for decades and was a teacher and track coach in the Mission school district.

Vela pleaded guilty in September to one charge of receiving child pornography. In exchange, federal prosecutors dropped a second child pornography charge against him.

The pornography case stems from a search of Vela's home this summer by Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents and Mission police. Authorities found a hidden staircase that led to a room where they recovered disks containing thousands of images of child pornography.

By then, Mission police had interviewed former Boy Scouts who alleged he abused them. Some said the abuse happened decades ago.

Man sentenced for killing landlord over \$10 late fee

WACO (AP) — A man who beat his landlord to death during an argument over a \$10 late fee was sentenced to 20 years in prison.

Johnny Loa, 43, who suffers from hallucinations, pleaded guilty to murder Thursday in the 2003 beating death of 69-year-old Warren Neal Young.

Loa was found incompetent to stand trial on three prior occasions because of his mental condition and was sent to state mental hospitals. However, doctors from the state mental hospital in Kerrville deemed him competent in October.

According to court records, Loa hit Young several times with a board during an argument over a \$10 late fee for Loa's rent at his apartment complex in West. Young died at a Waco hospital about a week later.

Loa's attorney, Stan Schwieger, said Loa should be eligible for parole in 10 years. He said Loa likely will be given credit toward his sentence for the three years he has been treated at state mental hospitals.

State officials open 27 investigations at youth prison in Edinburg

AUSTIN (AP) — A day after a federal report decried the "chaotic and dangerous" conditions at Texas' juvenile prison in Edinburg, state officials said Friday they have opened 27 investigations into a variety of inmate complaints.

The U.S. Department of Justice report said the rate of inmate-on-inmate assaults at the Evins Regional

Juvenile Center is about five times the national average for a comparable facility. Youths frequently fight each other without staff noticing or interfering, the report added.

The Evins facility is part of the Texas Youth Commission, which incarcerates about 4,700 offenders ages 10 to 21 who are considered the most dangerous, incorrigible or chronic.

State investigators were sent to all TYC facilities in early March as part of a widening probe into allegations that rampant sexual and physical abuse was covered up by agency employees.

Since then, investigators have opened four investigations into sexual assault claims at Evins and five investigations into claims of sexual misconduct. Two other cases involve allegations of inappropriate rela-

tionships between staff members and inmates and three were for physical assault.

The other cases ranged from threats to tampering with evidence.

3 dead after car crashes onto freeway in San Antonio

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Three people from Houston died when their car went over a wall along an Interstate 10 access road and landed 30 feet on the highway below, authorities said.

All three were pronounced dead Thursday night after the accident, according to the Bexar County medical examiner's office. The condition of a fourth person, the driver, was not available.

Plame testimony sparks stir on Capitol Hill, but sheds little light on CIA leak case

WASHINGTON (AP) — Valerie Plame put a glamorous face and a personal story to Democrats' criticism of the Bush administration, telling a House committee that White House and State Department officials "carelessly and recklessly" blew her CIA cover in a politically motivated smear of her husband.

Plame, the operative at the center of the leak scandal that resulted in last week's criminal conviction of a former top White House official, created more of a stir by her presence on Capitol Hill on Friday than by her testimony.

She revealed little new information about the case, which sparked a federal investigation and brought perjury and obstruction of justice convictions of Vice President Dick Cheney's former top aide, I. Lewis "Scooter" Libby. No one has been charged with leaking her identity.

Still, Plame's appearance before the House Oversight and Government Reform Committee was a moment of political theater that dramatized Democrats' drive to use their control of Congress to expose what they see as White House efforts to intimidate dissenters.

"My name and identity were carelessly and recklessly abused by senior officials in the White House and State Department," Plame testified in her first public comments about the case. "I could no longer perform the work for

which I had been highly trained."

Military panel finds soldier guilty of negligent homicide in deaths of 3 Iraqi detainees

FORT CAMPBELL, Ky. (AP) — A military panel found a 101st Airborne soldier guilty of three counts of negligent homicide but not guilty of premeditated murder in the deaths of three Iraqi detainees.

Staff Sgt. Ray Girouard, 24, smiled as he hugged his defense lawyer and family members after the verdict was read. He faced up to life in prison had he been found guilty of premeditated murder.

The panel, which deliberated for four hours, also found Girouard guilty of obstruction of justice for lying to investigators, of conspiracy for trying to conceal the crime and of failure to obey a general order.

Girouard could be sentenced to a maximum of 21 years in prison, said his lawyer, Anita Gorecki. He could get a maximum of three years for each negligent homicide charge, five years for the conspiracy charge, five years for obstruction of justice and two years for failure to obey a general order. The sentencing portion of the trial begins Monday.

Girouard was accused of telling his soldiers to release detainees they captured during the May 9 raid near Samarra, Iraq, and then shoot them as they fled. He is the last and most senior soldier from the 101st Airborne Division to face trial in the killings.

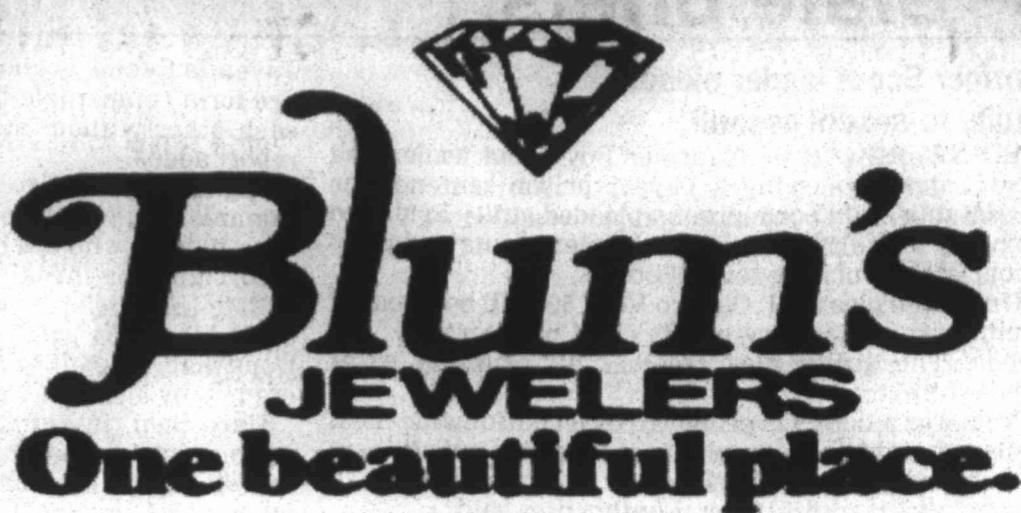
Crush of passport applications snarls travel plans; 1 million applications filed per month

CHICAGO (AP) — Thirteen-year-old Eli Rogatz applied months ago for a passport so that he could fly to Israel with his family for his bar mitzvah.

To his family's great relief, it finally came through Friday, with just days to spare.

"Given what else is being spent, we want to make sure he's there," Mitch Rogatz, a book publisher from the Chicago suburb of Glencoe, grumbled as he camped out in a federal office building for at least four hours, waiting for the passport.

Similar waiting games are being played out at passport processing sites across the country as the State Department wades through an unprecedented crush of passport applications.



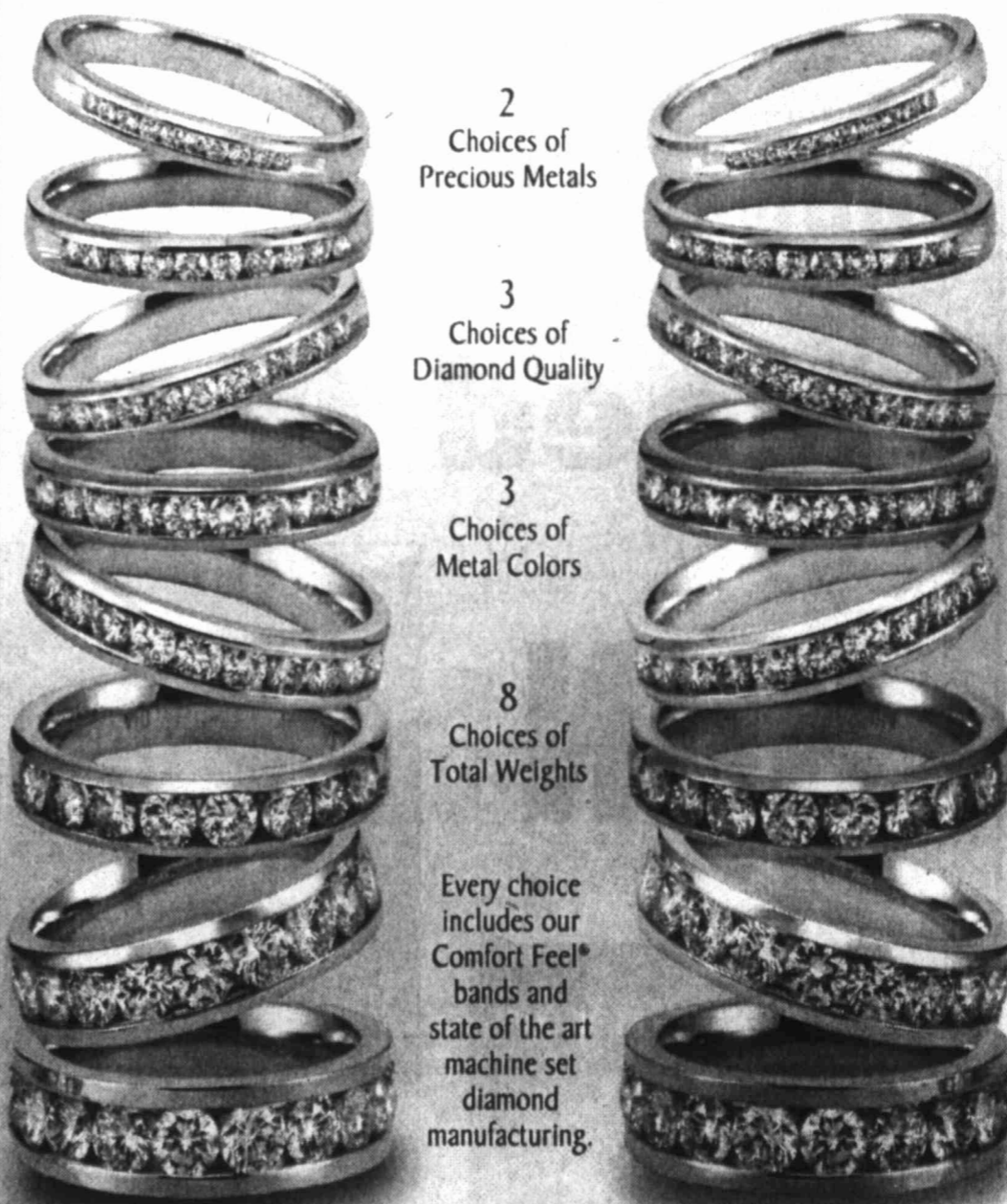

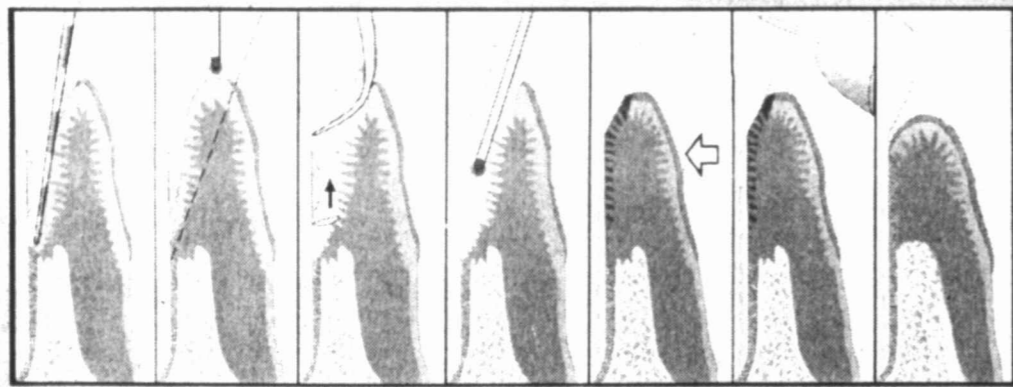

Former trucker convicted of killing 4 women sentenced to death

SAN BERNARDINO, Calif. (AP) — A former truck driver convicted of killing four women and dumping their mutilated bodies across California has been sentenced to death.

Before imposing the death sentence on Wayne Adam Ford on Friday, Superior Court Judge Michael Smith denied defense motions requesting a new trial or a sen-

tence more lenient than the death sentence a jury recommended last August.

Ford, who was mostly expressionless during the hour-long hearing, was convicted last June of four counts of first-degree murder for the 1997 and 1998 killings.

Ford, 45, was arrested in November 1998 after he walked into a sheriff's station in Northern

California with a woman's severed breast and told authorities it represented the "tip of the iceberg."

He was convicted of killing two California women, Patricia Tamez and Lanett Deyon White,

a Las Vegas woman, Tina Renee Gibbs, and an unidentified woman whose torso was found in a slough.

In a pre-sentencing report made public after the hearing, Ford apologized to the victims and

their families but said he was not guilty of first-degree murder.

"There was no struggling and no pain inflicted upon the victims," the report quoted Ford as saying. "All acts and activities were consensual. Anything that might have appeared to be painful or torturous was done post-mortem."

Ford was also quoted as saying: "Most serial

killers are proud of their work — not me."

The case will be automatically appealed.

California is under a death penalty moratorium as its lethal injection method has been found unconstitutional. Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger has ordered a new injection protocol to ensure that the condemned do not suffer unnecessary pain when executed.

Grand jury indicts officers in NYC shooting that heightened racial tensions

NEW YORK — Since the November morning when police fired a 50-bullet barrage that killed an unarmed man on his wedding day, his family members and their supporters have called for the officers involved to be punished.

But when lawyers said Friday that a grand jury had indicted three of the five officers, Sean Bell's backers gave only measured approval.

"There is no joy, no vengeance, no party here," said the Rev. Al Sharpton, who has acted as a spokesman for the family of Bell and two of his friends who survived the attack. "Charges are not convictions, and convictions ... will not bring back Sean Bell."

Lawyers for Marc Cooper, Giscard Isnora and Michael Oliver said Friday the officers were indicted and asked to appear in court Monday, but they did not know the exact charges. The three officers fired the most shots — Cooper, 4, Isnora, 11, and Oliver, 31 — in the Nov. 25 confrontation that killed the 23-year-old Bell and wounded Trent Benefield and Joseph Guzman as they left Bell's bachelor party at a strip club in Queens.

Lawyers were quick to proclaim the officers' innocence. They, too, pointed out that an indictment does not necessarily lead to a conviction.

"This is just the opening shot in a long war," said Philip Karasyk, who represents Isnora.

The Nov. 25 shooting stirred outrage around New York City and led to accusations of racism

against police. Bell was black, as are Benefield and Guzman. Cooper and Isnora are black. Oliver is white.

District Attorney Richard A. Brown said only that the grand jury had reached a decision and it would be announced Monday. He gave no reason for the delay, but indictments are often kept sealed until attorneys and their clients are notified and arrangements can be made for the defendants to surrender.

A person familiar with the case told the AP that the other two officers in the shooting — one black and one white — were not charged. The person spoke on condition of anonymity because the grand jury's decision has not been made public.

The case also brought back painful memories of other infamous police shootings in New York City, including the 1999 killing of unarmed African immigrant Amadou Diallo, who died in a hail of 41 bullets. The officers in that case were acquitted of criminal charges.

Police union officials defended the officers, arguing they were responding to reasonable suspicions the victims were armed and dangerous.

"This indictment sends a chilling message to all New York City police officers and to all law enforcement throughout the country," said Michael Palladino, president of the Detectives' Endowment Association. "You can act in good faith and there is no margin for error."

Isnora, 28, was "very

upset," attorney Philip Karasyk said. "But he is confident that once he has his day in court he will be vindicated."

The grand jury's decision came after three days of deliberations.

Peter St. George Davis, attorney for Sean Bell's parents, said his clients are devastated. "But they pray every day that somehow, out of their son's death will come a message or lasting legacy."

Sharpton said the charges marked an important first step in the fight for justice in the case.

"The only way you make sure it doesn't happen again is you stop it, and you punish it and you send a signal that we live in a society where laws have to be respected," he said. "So there is no joy, no vengeance, no party here."

A 23-person grand jury heard the case, and 12 grand jurors needed to vote for an indictment for charges to be brought. The panel included eight blacks, seven whites, and a mix of Hispanics and Asians.

The five officers were among the more than 60 witnesses who testified before the grand jury. Benefield and Guzman also gave their version, insisting the officers fired without warning.

Dog and cat food recalled amid reports of pet deaths

WASHINGTON (AP) — A major manufacturer of dog and cat food sold under Wal-Mart, Safeway, Kroger and other store brands recalled 60 million containers of wet pet food Friday after reports of kidney failure and deaths.

An unknown number of cats and dogs suffered kidney failure and about 10 died after eating the affected pet food, Menu

Foods said in announcing the North American recall. Product testing has not revealed a link explaining the reported cases of illness and death, the company said.

"At this juncture, we're not 100 percent sure what's happened," said Paul Henderson, the company's president and chief executive officer. However, the recalled products were made using wheat gluten pur-

chased from a new supplier, since dropped for another source, spokeswoman Sarah Tuite said. Wheat gluten is a source of protein.

The recall covers the company's "cuts and gravy" style food, which consists of chunks of meat in gravy, sold in cans and small foil pouches between Dec. 3 and March 6 throughout the U.S., Canada and Mexico.

Christians gather in Washington, D.C. for protest against Iraq war

WASHINGTON — Thousands of Christians prayed for peace at an anti-war service Friday night at the Washington National Cathedral, kicking off a weekend of protests around the country to mark the fourth anniversary of the war in Iraq.

Afterward, participants marched with battery-operated faux candles through snow and wind toward the White House, where police began arresting protesters shortly before midnight. Protest guidelines require demonstrators to continue moving while on the White House sidewalk.

"We gave them three warnings, and they broke the guidelines," said Lt. Scott Fear. "There's an area on the White House sidewalk where you have to keep moving."

About 100 people crossed the street from Lafayette Park — where thousands of protesters were gathered — to demonstrate on the White House sidewalk late Friday. Police began cuffing them and putting them on buses to be taken for processing.

Fear said 222 people had been arrested by Saturday morning. The first 100 were charged with disobeying a lawful order, and the others with crossing a police line. All of them were fined \$100.

The windows of the executive mansion were dark, as the president was away for the weekend at Camp David in Maryland.

John Pattison, 29, said he and his wife flew in from Portland, Ore., to attend his first anti-war rally. He said his opposition to the war had developed over time.

"Quite literally on the night that shock and awe commenced, my friend and I toasted the military might of the United States," Pattison said. "We were quite proud and thought we were doing the right thing."

He said the way the war had progressed and U.S. foreign policy since then had forced him to question his beliefs.

"A lot of the rhetoric that we hear coming from Christians has been dominated by the religious right and has been strong advocacy for the war," Pattison said. "That's just not the way I read my Gospel."

The ecumenical coalition that organized the event, Christian Peace

Witness for Iraq, distributed 3,200 tickets for the service in the cathedral, with two smaller churches hosting overflow crowds. The cathedral appeared to be packed, although sleet and snow prevented some from attending.

"This war, from a Christian point of view, is morally wrong — and was from the beginning," the Rev. Jim Wallis, founder of Sojourners/Call to Renewal, one of the event's sponsors, said toward the end of the service to cheers and applause. "This war is ... an offense against God."

In his speech, the Rev. Raphael G. Warnock, senior pastor at Atlanta's Ebenezer Baptist Church, lashed out at Congress for being "too morally inept to intervene" to stop the war, but even more harshly against President Bush.

"Mr. Bush, my Christian brother, we do need a surge in troops. We need a surge in the nonviolent army of the Lord," he said. "We need

a surge in conscience and a surge in activism and a surge in truth-telling."

Celeste Zappala of Philadelphia recounted how she learned of the

death of her son, Sgt. Sherwood Baker, who served in the National Guard. When a uniformed man came to her door asking if she was Baker's

mother, she said yes. "Yes," and then I fell to the ground and somewhere outside of myself I heard someone screaming and screaming," she said.

Olson out; Winthrop, UNLV move on in tourney

Say goodbye to Lute Olson, who will join his good friends Bob Knight and Mike Krzyzewski as spectators. The three coaching legends were booted from the NCAA tournament just as the fun was starting.

Olson's Arizona Wildcats ended an underachieving season with a 72-63 loss to Purdue on Friday night, joining Krzyzewski and Knight as first-round losers. This becomes the first tournament

since 1995 to start the second round without any of these Hall of Famers.

"I think all three of us will hope that never happens again," Olson said. "We'll be back."

Olson, 72, was coaching his 73rd NCAA tournament game, third on the all-time list. Krzyzewski is ahead of him and Knight is right behind at 70. Those coaches are also among the top five on the tournament wins list.

Olson was trying for career win

No. 47, which would've tied John Wooden for third place.

"I'm disappointed, just like they are," Olson said after the Midwest Regional loss. "It doesn't take a Rhodes Scholar to figure out that if you give them 19 more possessions then you're not going to get it done."

While Olson, and the two Coach Ks won't be chasing another title, Winthrop validated its credentials by beating Notre Dame. And UNLV sparked some memories of its championship

past by winning its first tournament game since 1991.

Craig Bradshaw, an import from New Zealand, scored 24 points and Torrell Martin added 20 and a career-high 11 rebounds as Big South champ Winthrop beat Notre Dame 74-64. Winthrop, 0-6 in previous tournament appearances, blew all of its 20-point lead in the second half before surging in the final two minutes to end Notre Dame's

Longhorns win NCAA opener

Late run holds off NM State

SPOKANE, Wash. — Kevin Durant had reason to be nervous.

It was his first NCAA tournament game — and possibly his last. At least that's how it looked until Texas took control against New Mexico State, thanks in part to their star freshman.

Durant had 27 points, including 11 of 12 free throws in the second half, and eight rebounds to lead fourth-seeded Texas to a 79-67 victory Friday night in the first round of the East Regional.

"Durant's a pro," said New Mexico State coach Reggie Theus, a former NBA All-Star guard, using the word no one in Texas wants to associate with Durant for at least another wondrous year in Austin.

"And pros know how to adjust. ... I will tell you from my own personal experience that when you're able to draw fouls, you will be a great scorer."

Even with a case of nerves.

Before Durant's seventh consecutive 25-point game, Wanda Pratt, called her son from Suitland, Md. She thought Kevin sounded unusually nervous. Even Texas coach Rick Barnes later he said he noticed his star was "jumpy."

But the 18-year-old freshman looked ever the cool veteran down the stretch.

Durant's long-armed tip-ins, smooth pivot moves, sudden pull-up jumpers

Decision time near for Durant

SPOKANE, Wash. — Back when his friends were going to movies, hanging out at parties, learning to drive and doing all the other things teenagers do, Kevin Durant was in the gym.

Basketball was always his first priority, his No. 1 love.

"He never followed the traditional route," says Taras Brown, the AAU coach who has mentored Durant since he was a lanky 9-year-old.

Durant chose to go to college at Texas, a school with little basketball tradition, when all the "places he 'should' have gone — North Carolina, Duke, Maryland — were banging down his door.

Now, conventional wisdom says the freshman — arguably the best player in college and certainly a can't-miss NBA prospect — will leave Texas after one year to move to the pros and cash in on the immense talent he honed in Brown's gym.

Nobody who knows him, however, can be quite sure — Durant has never followed the traditional route.

Before his first NCAA tournament game Friday night, a 79-67 win over New Mexico State in which he led Texas with 27 points and eight rebounds, he was focusing only on helping his teammates, living for the moment and winning.

"If God feels like it's his time, he'll go," Brown says. "I honestly don't know. I don't think he

Mavs return to winning ways, topping Celtics

Dirk Nowitzki scored 30 points, 19 in the final quarter, and Josh Howard matched a career high with 30 points to help the Dallas Mavericks bounce back from consecutive defeats, rallying from a 10-point halftime deficit to beat the Boston Celtics 106-101 on Friday night.

Howard kept the Mavericks close with 16 first-half points, and Nowitzki carried his team

down the stretch, hitting all five field-goal attempts and all nine free throws in the fourth quarter.

Nowitzki, Dallas' top scorer and rebounder, had only four first-half points and missed five of six from the field.

The Mavericks had a club-record streak of 23 straight wins at home snapped with Wednesday night's 129-127 double overtime defeat to the Phoenix Suns. Dallas had won a team-record 17 in a row before a loss to

the Golden State Warriors on Monday night.

Dallas' two-game losing streak was its longest since opening the season at 0-4.

Paul Pierce's 29 points, Gerald Green's career-high 25, and Al Jefferson's 20 points and 10 rebounds paced the Celtics, who had won six of their previous nine.

In other games, it was Miami 103, Sacramento 97; Philadelphia 89, Utah 88; Houston 114, Toronto

100; L.A. Clippers 102, Charlotte 93; New Orleans 92, New York 90; L.A. Lakers 116, Portland 111; Detroit 105, Phoenix 83; and Golden State 106, Minnesota 86.

Dallas led 100-99 when Nowitzki passed to Jerry Stackhouse for a dunk with 1:16 left.

After Pierce hit two free throws, Nowitzki converted twice from the free-throw line

and blocked shots had NBA scouts chuckling courtside. Even though he went the first 12 minutes of the second half without a field goal, he was effective from the foul line, finishing 15-of-16 overall.

Texas (25-9) made 25 of 26 of its free throws, with Durant's the only miss.

"Well, we expect him to make them all, you know," Barnes deadpanned.

Durant connected on two from the line after a rebound with 1:10 left to put Texas ahead 75-66 and essentially end the game.

Fellow freshman D.J. Augustin had 19 points and seven assists, and sophomore A.J. Abrams

added 16 points for the Longhorns, who start four freshmen and have seven on their roster.

Elijah Ingram had 16 points for 13th-seeded New Mexico State (25-9), which was making its first NCAA appearance since 1999 but still hasn't advanced past the first round since '93.

The Aggies rallied from 12 down with 16 minutes remaining to take a 58-57 lead with 7:10 left on two free throws by Jonathan Gibson, who had just air-balled a wide-open 3.

But then Durant got into a team huddle on the floor, clapped twice and said "Let's go!"

The Longhorns responded with a 12-4 run that featured Durant making six straight free throws and stealing a pass near midcourt.

does, either."

Nobody denies Durant would love his college career to go the way Carmelo Anthony's did at Syracuse in 2003: One year. One championship. Nothing left to prove at that level.

At 6-foot-9, Durant is a big man who does more than most big men. He shoots 3-pointers, makes good passes, has great feet and is steadily learning the nuances of posting up and playing interior defense. He showed that against New Mexico State, just as he has all season.

What his coaches notice as much as any of that is the way he smiles.

"You give him a basket-

ball and a basket, and he's going to be happy," says Josh Hutchison, an assistant at Towson University who helped coach Durant during his senior year of high school. "He's happy just shooting, happy being in the gym. I don't think it's work for him."

At least not yet.

In a few weeks, the swingman with the huge wingspan almost certainly will become the first freshman to be named college basketball's player of the year. And if he decides to go pro, he could be the first pick in the NBA draft. Another fabulous freshman, Ohio State's Greg Oden, also factors into that equation.

First, though, Durant must decide to leave the Longhorns. Nobody in his inner circle is ready to

proclaim it's a done deal, and Durant himself swats the question away like an opponent's ill-timed floater through the lane.

"Whenever the time comes, I'll make my decision about next year," he says. "I'm just worried about winning games in the tournament."

The Longhorns are 25-9 this season despite a starting lineup that features four freshmen and one sophomore. They have taken Kansas, largely regarded as the litmus test in the Big 12, to the wire in two close losses. Few expected them to be this good, this quickly, even with Durant on board.

Who's to say the best player in the country can't spark a six-game winning streak to capture a championship and force

the school to clear some room in the trophy case for "that other sport" at football-crazy Texas?

"That's the reason he came here," says Texas assistant coach Russ Springmann, the man who 'discovered' Durant when he was a high schooler in Maryland. "He wanted to help the University of Texas do something in basketball that hadn't been done before."

He came into the tournament averaging 25 points, 11 rebounds and nearly two blocks and two steals a game. His career high is 37 points, on Jan. 6 against Colorado.

The first guy to show up in the film room after that one? Durant.

"He's there asking us what he could have done better," Springmann says.

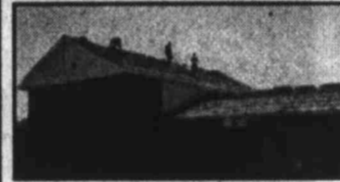

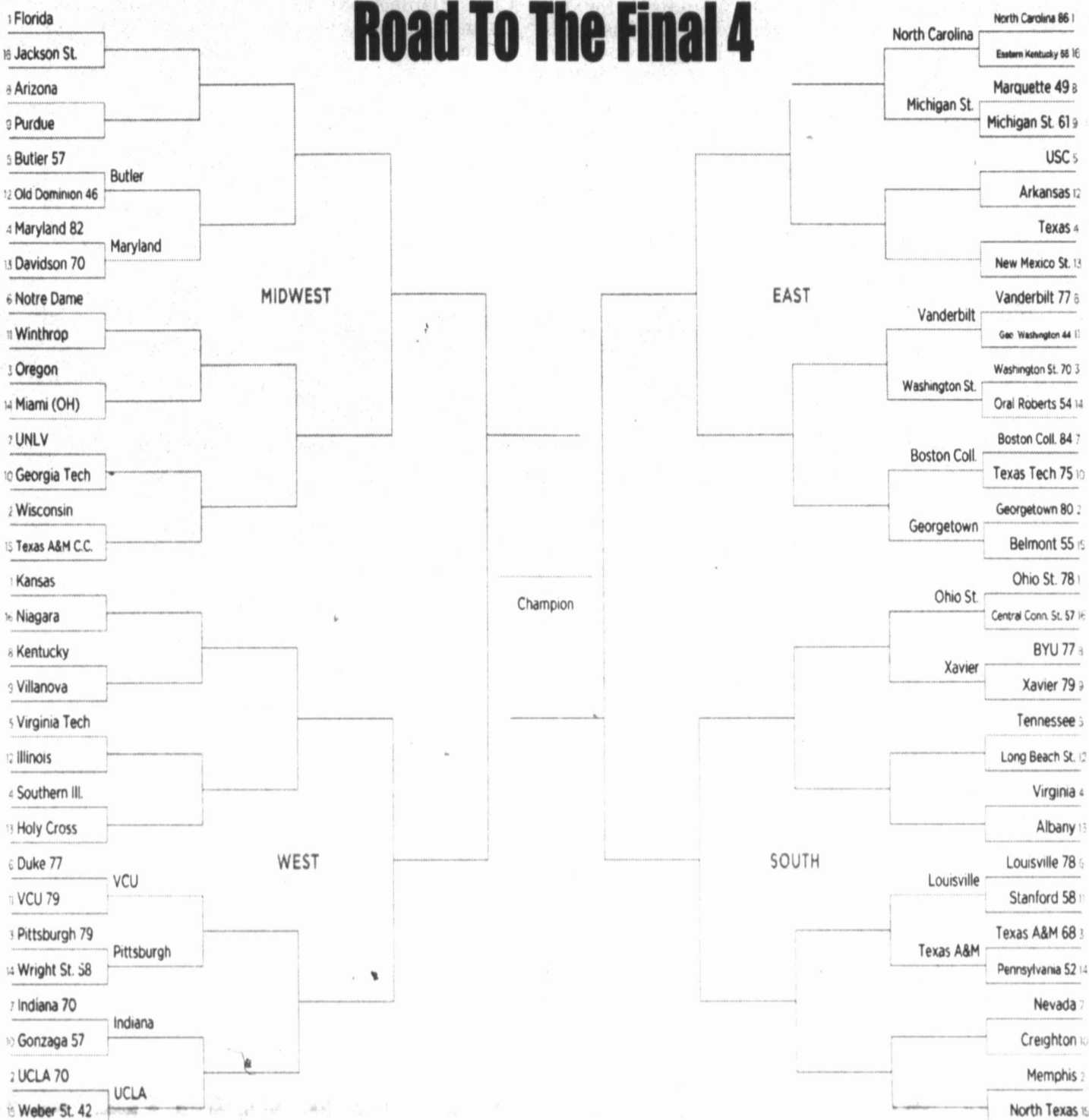

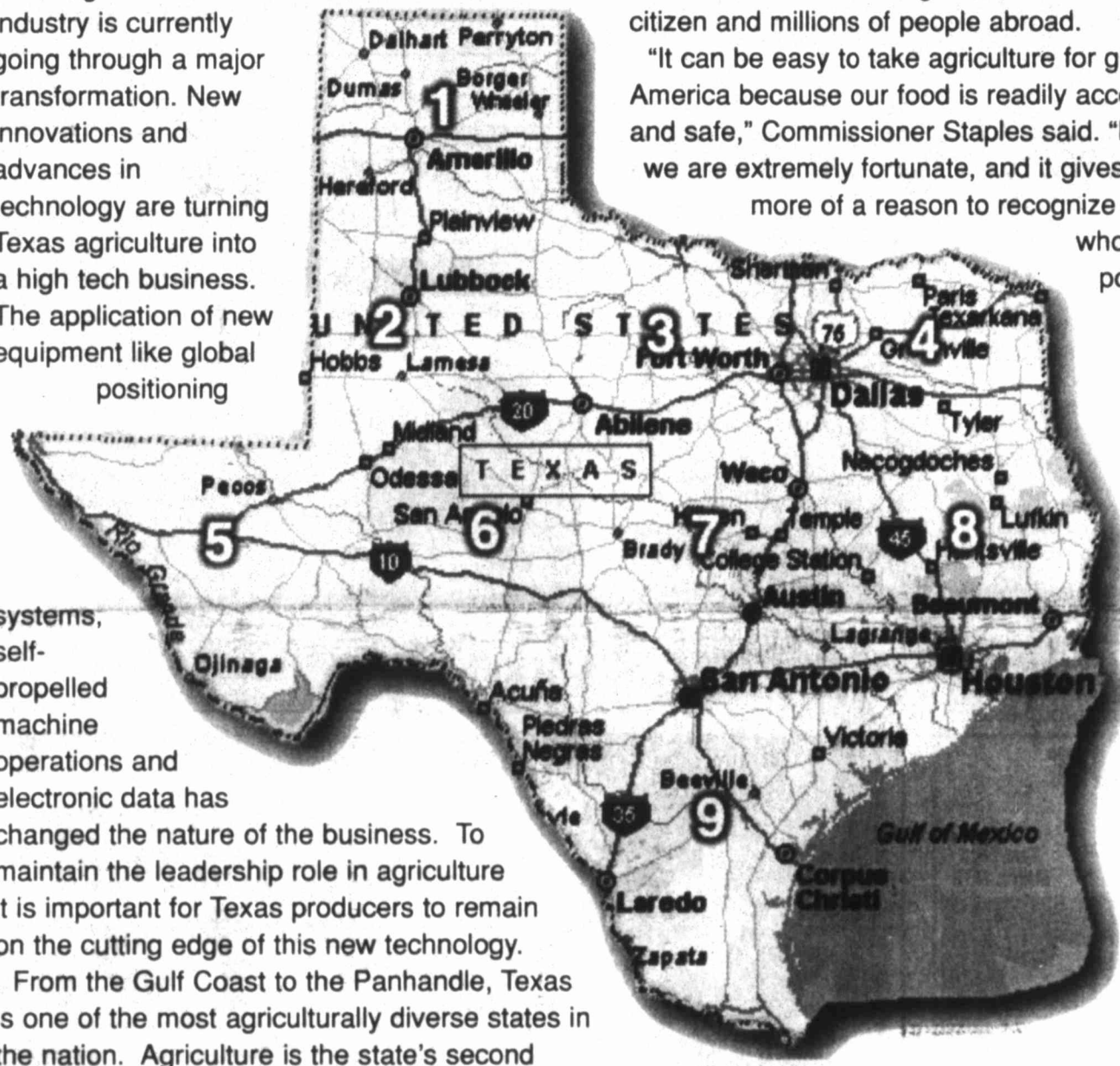
From the Gulf Coast to the Panhandle, Texas is one of the most agriculturally diverse states in the nation. Agriculture is the state's second

Genealogy and DNA testing results

Hello all! I am back again writing my genealogy column. I hope I can help you in your search for your elusive ancestors. I will start by showing you a few ways DNA has helped in sorting out my ancestors from the several possibilities I have for my ancestor Silas Rawls Sr. The results from the DNA project we now are in progress with have solved some problems and added some new ones.

First, because of circumstantial evidence, I truly believed that the father of Silas Rawls Sr. was the Rev. Gabriel Rawls. But with recent results, we now know that Gabriel was not the blood father of Silas. Our lines do not tie in for at least 2,000 years. Quite a shock to me and other researchers.

But it also proves a relationship to Willis Ralls. This Willis Ralls' descendants have the same DNA makeup as myself which proves a close relationship to my ancestor Silas Rawls. All along I stated I thought he was, but had only circumstantial evidence of that.

I now believe that as a Baptist minister in America and a Free Mason in England, that Gabriel possibly adopted Silas Rawls. But, finding paper proof may lead me to England for answers. To explain, Gabriel was on a land record in 1759 in Nansemond County, Va., and disappeared until 1770, at which time I believe he was in

England studying the ministry. His son, Joseph L. Rawls was born there on Oct. 20, 1764. Silas Rawls was a Loyalist serving in the South Carolina Militia under Capt. William Ballentine in the 1780s. Loyalist records are available from several places including the "Public Records Office" PRO in England.

Since our Rawls-Ralls DNA project was started we have made many great leaps in our search

for our ancestors. As we progress in our project we will make many more advances in our knowledge and pursuit of the truth.

Next week: A more in-depth explanation of how DNA is used in genealogy.

In knowing where we are going, we know where we have been. In genealogy this is comparing us to our ancestors.

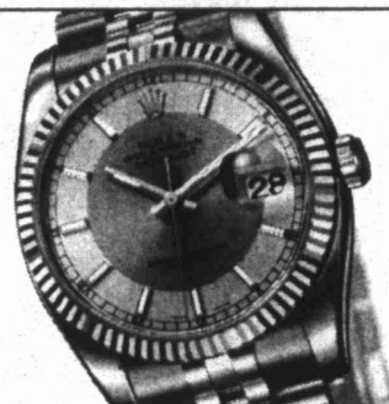

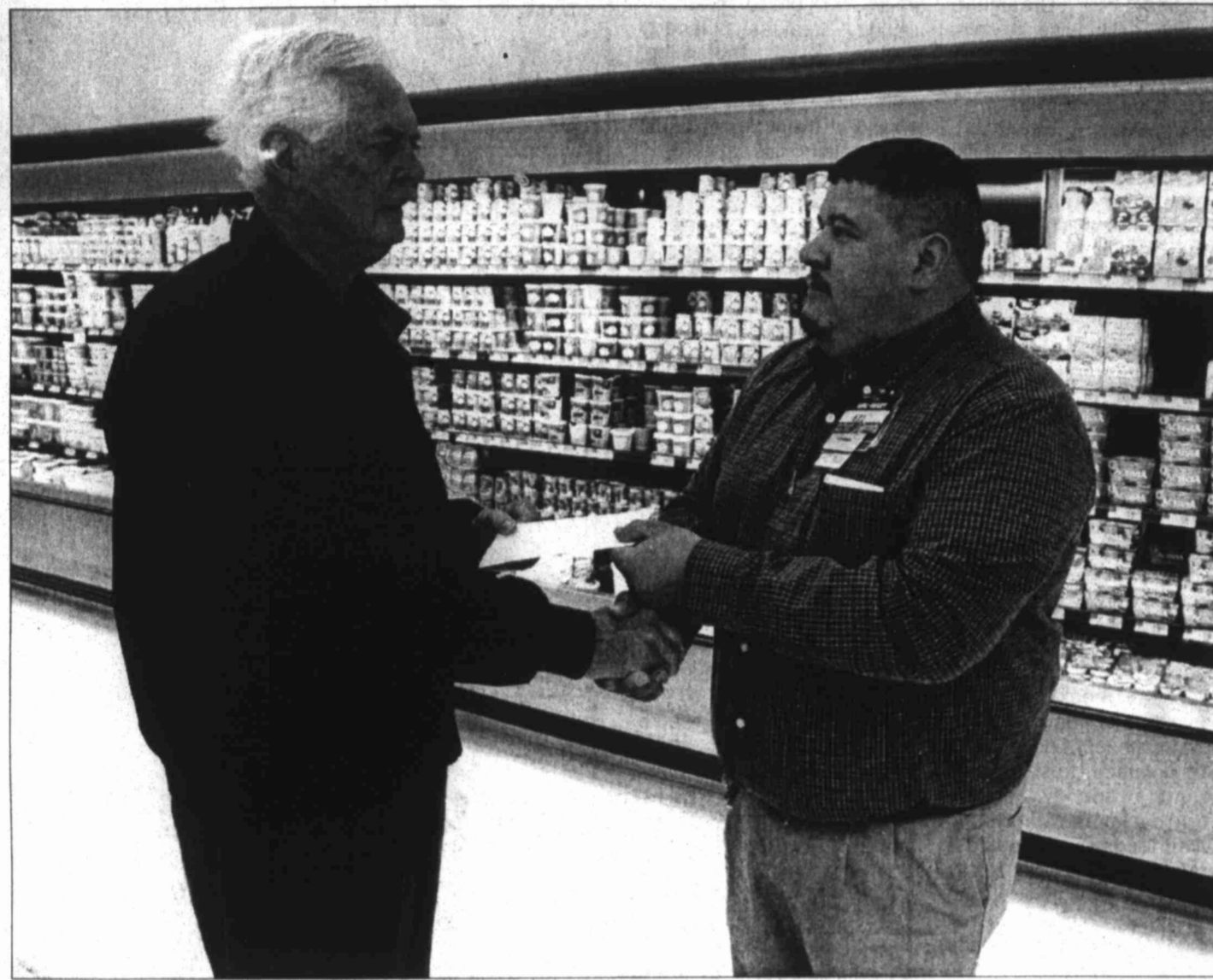

Cost-share funds now available to producers

Special to the HERALD

The deadline for producers in Howard County to sign up for 2007 cost-share funds through the Senate Bill 503 Water Quality Program is April 13.

The funds are primarily used to develop and improve irrigation practices. However, funds can be used for brush management, range seeding, livestock water development and terraces. This program also ensures proper nutrient and pest management practices are applied to enable agricultural operations to meet state water quality standards.

The advantage of participating in this program is that if a producer develops and maintains a site-specific water quality management plan through the local Howard Soil and Water

Conservation District — and the plan is certified by the Texas Soil and Water Conservation Board — the producer will be in compliance with state water quality law. They are also exempt from other state regulatory processes regarding nonpoint source discharge of pollutants.

A water quality management plan includes appropriate land treatment practices, production practices, management measures, technologies of any combination to achieve a level of pollution prevention or abatement.

For more information or to make an application, contact the Howard Soil and Water Conservation District before April 13 at (432) 267-871, ext. 3 or go by the USDA Service Center in Big Spring.

Pesticide applicator, handler training set

Area residents who are in need of a private pesticide applicator's license from Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) can attend a training in Lamesa on March 27. The private applicators license allows an individual to apply restricted use pesticides to their own property for the production of an agricultural commodity. This license does not allow one to apply pesticides to the property of any other individual for a fee; that requires a Commercial Applicator License.

Texas Cooperative Extension (T.C.E.) agents in Terry, Yoakum, Cochran, Gaines and

Dawson Counties will be working together to host and conduct this area-wide training, which is required by TDA before an individual can take the test for a license.

The training will be held at the Dawson County Community Building (South Eighth and Houston) March 27. The training will begin at 8:30 a.m. and end at lunch time. A Texas Department of Agriculture representative will then be at the same location at 1:30 p.m. to administer the pesticide applicator test (no fee to test).

Persons planning to attend need to call the Texas Cooperative Extension, Dawson County Office, (806) 872-3444, to make a reservation and order study materials.

There will be a \$20 fee collected for study materials.

Pricing plastic bags

Merchants turn toward making the world a greener place

"A nickel for a plastic shopping bag?"

That's nothing, said Tomma Clocker, of North Potomac, Md., who was born in Germany, where bags now cost about \$1.

"In Europe, you always bring your bags," said Clocker as she shopped at Ikea in College Park, Md. "Americans don't because they are not as environmentally aware, because of the size of this country. In Europe, people live closer together and in smaller places. Much more consideration is given to how you impact your neighbor, on the inside of your home and on the outside."

Ikea, which was founded in Sweden, brought a bit of that European sensibility to American shopping Thursday when it began charging for plastic bags. The move represents a step beyond the discounts that some retailers offer those who bring their own bags. Whole Foods markets, for instance,

knock off a nickel for each bag customers bring in for their groceries.

Customers paying for shopping bags? It's a seismic shift in the American way, akin to when ser-

vice stations started charging for air or drinking water became something bought in a plastic bottle.

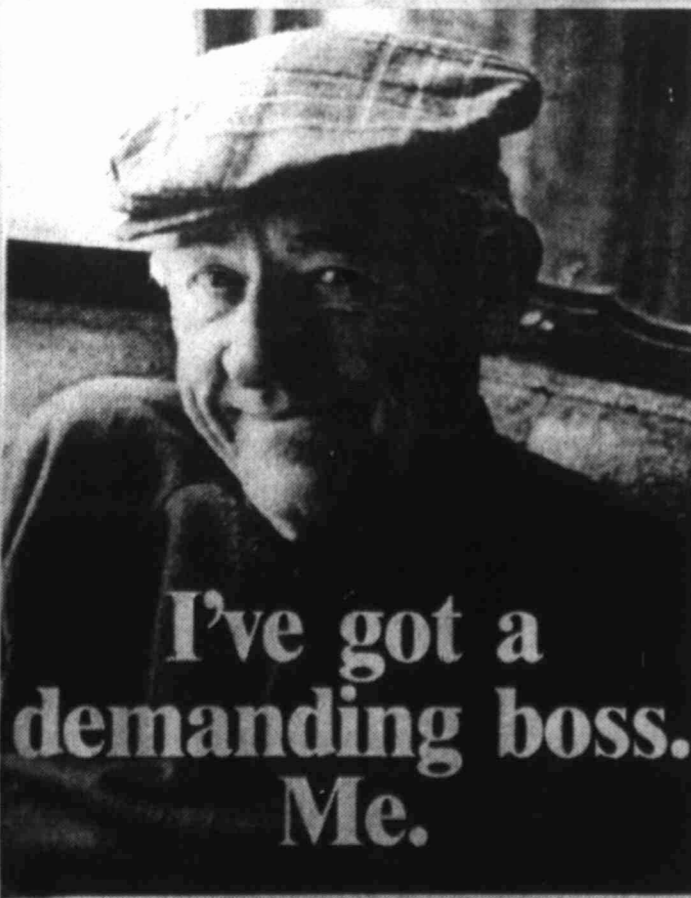

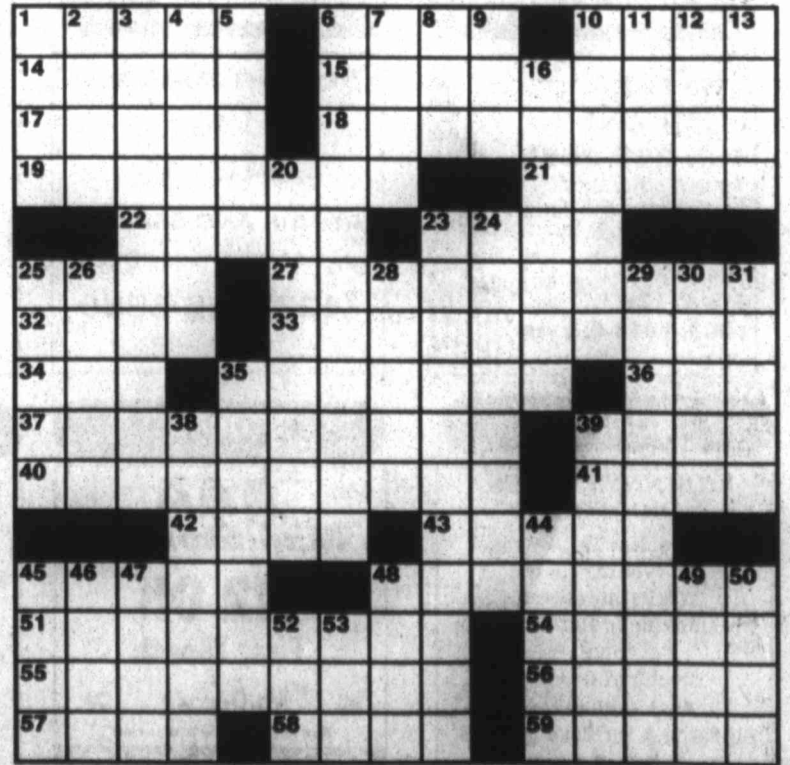

Under an agreement announced Thursday, YouTube will show CBS clips from the "March Madness" NCAA basketball tournament.

The disclosure comes as Viacom, CBS's former sister company, is alleging that YouTube allowed users to lift and post more than 150,000 unauthorized clips from scores of Viacom shows such as "The Colbert Report," "Ren & Stimpy" and "The Daily Show."

In an interview, Redstone praised the CBS deal with YouTube, saying that paying to use clips is the kind of arrangement Viacom should get as well.

"The deal that CBS did with YouTube is in no way inconsistent with the Viacom position, which is not to permit any person or company to misappropriate its product without paying for it," Redstone said.

Media observers said it's not unusual for Redstone, with his vast holdings, to employ the carrot and the stick in dealing with potential partners.

"More than anything else, they're trying to make a point, which is you license things from us in a commercial fashion and we'll play ball," said Larry Gerbrandt, senior vice president and general manager of Nielsen Analytics. "But when our stuff is on there illegally, and you don't take it down fast enough or don't monitor it, we have a problem."

Thursday's YouTube deal is the handiwork of CBS Chief Executive Leslie Moonves, who has embraced digital distribution and has touted YouTube's promotional prowess.

Public hearing topic: federal transportation cuts

The Texas Department of Transportation is seeking public input on how best to respond to an anticipated mandate for Texas to return approximately \$290 million in federal highway funds to Washington.

Although the Federal Highway Administration has not issued an official notice, a recent resolution continuing appropriations for Fiscal 2007 rescinded more than \$3.4 billion in previously authorized transportation funds across the nation. TxDOT has been advised Texas will be required to return approximately \$290 million in unobligated federal-aid highway funds.

Thursday, March 22, the Texas Transportation Commission will hold a special meeting to receive public comment on how to implement the expected order to return federal funding. The hear-

ing will begin at 9 a.m. at TxDOT headquarters, 125 East 11th St. in Austin.

"We want to hear from the public on how we should prepare to absorb these funding cuts," said Mike Behrens, TxDOT executive director. "We would like to have as little impact as possible on our ability to meet our goals to reduce congestion, enhance safety, expand economic opportunity, improve air quality and increase the value of transportation assets."

TxDOT anticipates it will have less than a month to respond once official notice comes from Washington, according to Behrens.

During the last 15 months, Texas has returned \$305 million in response to federal funding cuts.

During the same day, persons in need of the E.P.A. Pesticide Handler Card (green card) can attend one of two trainings. At 9 a.m., the training will be presented in English and at 10 a.m. in Spanish. There is no fee for this training. The Pesticide Handler Training is geared toward those persons who work around pesticide under the supervision of a licensed applicator. Hired hands, field scouts and any other person who handles pesticides or works with pesticides needs this safety training.

This time, Ikea officials said, it's for a good cause.

"The goal is an environmental cause: to help reduce the waste of the plastic bags," said Sharon Black, public relations specialist at the College Park store.

With the new policy, the chain joins a host of government agencies, environmental groups and corporations trying to make the world a greener place. The Maryland General Assembly is weighing bills to put cleaner cars on the road and more environmentally friendly soap in the dishwasher. Fairfax County, Va., is promising to buy more wind energy. Wal-Mart is selling a more efficient light bulb, and some major grocery chains recycle their bags.

Ikea officials said the home-furnishing chain gave away 70 million bags

in the United States last year and hopes to cut the number in half this year by charging for them. The chain will donate proceeds from sales of the clear bags to American Forests, the nation's oldest citizens conservation group. Ikea expects to raise \$7 million for the charity.

To make sure customers got the point, the store deployed "live sculpture." One actor, all in blue, including a blue Afro wig, represented Ikea's reusable blue shopping bag — made of durable plastic and now on sale for 59 cents instead of 99 cents. Another, all in white, portrayed the store's clear plastic shopping bag.

Customers who might have missed the store's postings about the bag charge paid attention to the actors and their message about waste. Ajax Joe Drayton, a founder of Joe's Movement Emporium, a perfor-

mance group in Mount Rainier, Md., said the actors were happy to take part as a way to encourage people to think about the waste they generate. The group provided its services as a thank-you for donated furniture.

"We live in the time of disposable everything: disposable razors, disposable bags, disposable dishes," Drayton said. "We use things and then we just throw them away and put them out of mind because it is faster that way."

No one seemed to mind paying for the plastic bags.

"We are very wasteful as a nation and that includes me," said Mildred Talbott, of Baltimore. "We don't have enough people speaking out like this and encouraging the rest of us to do the right thing."

Maria Loretta, of Bethesda, Md. brought her own bag — from Trader Joe's.

"I hate all of the waste in this country," said Loretta, a chef who was born in Colombia. "I think our children are not

going to have a planet if we keep it up this way. This was a good idea because it makes people aware."

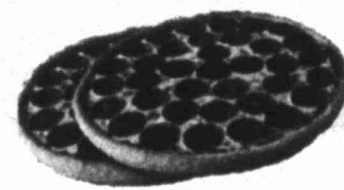

'Let's Go To Prison' beats the odds

Apparently, I keep missing the meetings where all the film critics get together and decide what movies they will support and which ones they will rip to shreds in one form or another each week.

Or maybe I'm just not invited.

Either way, I may very well be the only person in Big Spring — or on the planet Earth, for that matter — that thought "Let's Go To Prison" was as funny as a long-tailed cat in a room full of rocking chairs.

Yes, I know I completely screwed that analogy up, and it was on purpose. That's my story, anyway.

Unlike just about every other critic on the planet, I thought "Let's Go To Prison" was really funny. Yes, it's crass. Yes, its story is about as old as prisons themselves, as are many of the subjects for gags.

You're not going to have a jail house comedy that doesn't have a few scenes

with jokes about one man raping another. If you can't laugh at prison rape — and if not, then what can you laugh at, pray tell? — then this movie isn't going to be up your alley (no pun intended).

If, on the other hand, you don't find the concept inherently unfunny, and if you like Will Arnett ("Arrested Development"), Dax Shepard ("Employee of the Month," "Idiocracy"), and the comedy stylings of "Mr. Show's" Bob Odenkirk — who directed this movie and has a small role in it — then I don't see why you can't expect some good chuckles out of "Let's Go To Prison."

The plot here is pretty simple. Shepard plays John Lyshitski (no, I'm not making this up), a hapless three-time loser who keeps getting sent up the river by the same humorless judge.

Amazingly, the filmmakers show incredible restraint when it comes to jokes about the name Lyshitski.

After his third release, John decides to take a little revenge on the man he blames for sticking him in the harsh prison system. However, it's too late. The barrister has passed on, so

John turns his attentions to the man's son, Nelson Beiderman IV (Arnett).

John inadvertently helps his foe into a frame-up that gets him convicted, but getting Nelly incarcerated isn't satisfying enough as far as vengeance goes. So, John gets himself locked up so he can make Nelly's time as an inmate a living hell.

He bribes himself into the same cell and pretends to be the rich boy's friend, all the while setting traps that will lead to Nelly getting the mess kicked out of him. Naturally, Nelly manages to pick up some kind of good luck charm, inadvertently foiling John's plans in classic comedy fashion and pitting the two men in a battle of obnoxious wills.

I don't know what the beef with this movie is.

Bob Odenkirk was clearly weaned on the raunchy post-SNL comedies of the late '70s and early '80s, and he's shooting for a no-holds-barred adult comedy that isn't afraid to be a little silly and totally adolescent.

Shepard and Arnett work well together as the slick career criminal and the hapless stooge, and there were multiple times where I considered jotting down lines to quote at the top of this review. I know I'm going to start heckling friends by chanting, "Eskimo! Eskimo!" whether they know what I'm talking about or not.

Don't get me wrong, because I don't want to oversell this. "Let's Go To Prison" wasn't even close to being the funniest movie I've seen this



year, nor would it even have made my top 25 list. But who cares? I doubt that's what this movie was aiming for anyway. It wanted to make me laugh, and I did. Often.

It helps that the supporting cast is rounded out by David Koechner ("Anchor-man's" sport reporter), character actor Dylan

Baker (the Spider-Man series), and Boston Public's Chi McBride, a man with maybe the most imposing cranium ever.

McBride is particularly funny, subverting the role you would expect him to play with a couple of left turns that make his character more than the big black guy who pushes the little white guy around. He steals several of the best laughs from Arnett and Shepard, which is no mean feat.

And while his straight — again, no pun intended — role on "Boston Public" may have you questioning his role in this comedy, I need only point back to "Waiting," where McBride fully convinced me he's one of the best comedic talents working today.

Besides, it's worth the price of the rental just to see the suit he wears when he gets out of prison.

The 1.85:1 anamorphic widescreen transfer is on par with most of the major studio releases I've seen in recent memory. Nice colors, no glitches, a clean move over to DVD.

You have your choice of English, French, and Spanish 5.1 mixes of "Let's Go To Prison," as well as subtitles in all three languages. I stuck to the English. It sounded fine, no great shakes to the good or the bad, really.

The main extra on the "Let's Go To Prison" DVD is the most imperceptible. When you fire up the movie, you are offered the choice of an Unrated version or the original R-rated theatrical release.

I'll admit, I didn't watch both, I just watched the Unrated. I compared the running times, and they are exactly the same, and I've looked around online and can't find any info about what might be different. From what I can tell, the only major difference is that the Unrated

version has a framing intro/outro where a "real life" sheriff gives us a mock "scared straight" context akin to old instructional films they'd show us in school.

In all, the new pieces total about 2 minutes and 10 seconds. If that's really the only change, it may be one of the more shameless mis-uses of the unrated tag I've seen yet.

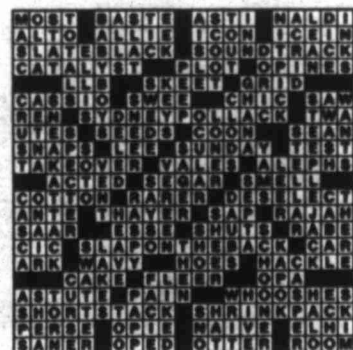
Other extras include an alternate ending (3:31) and two deleted scenes (4:30).



The deleted scenes are minor and probably wouldn't have helped the flow of the movie, and while the alternate ending is more cynical, I think I actually prefer what Odenkirk went with.

There is also a six-minute feature on the "Soundtrack Sessions." I have to say, I didn't notice the music in the movie, so this was a surprise. It focuses on the session musicians, most of whom are far too qualified for the job, having worked with Motown legends and other famous acts over the years.

Rahzel, an excellent human beatbox formerly with the Roots and who has worked with Bjork, among others, was also involved.



Diversions

Though much maligned when in theaters, if this critic has anything to say about it, "Let's Go To Prison" is going to find a second life on DVD. Yeah, this low-brow comedy isn't the most noble of cinematic efforts, but since most of my hate mail tells me to lighten up anyway — yes, I read your letter, rant lady — wouldn't a lot of you point out that not

every movie has to be?

When it comes to comedy, you can really only judge by your gut. Did the movie make you laugh or not? "Let's Go To Prison" made me laugh. So, rock on, Bob Odenkirk! You delivered!

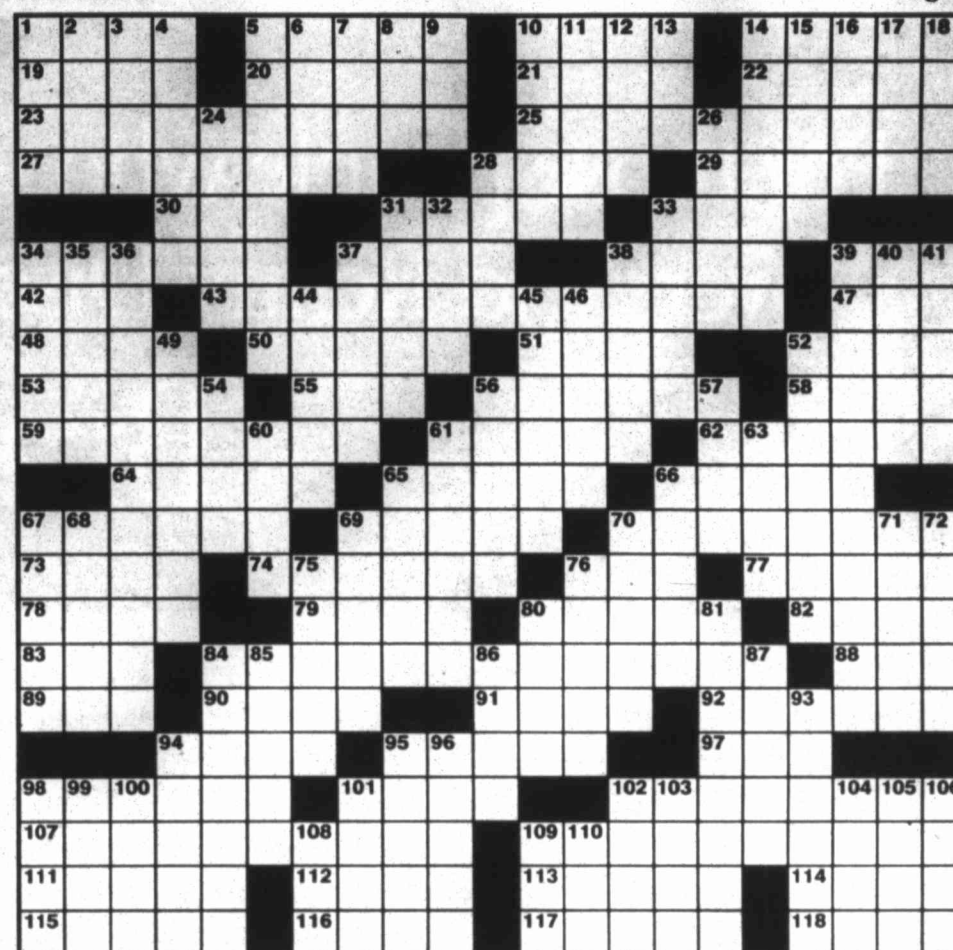

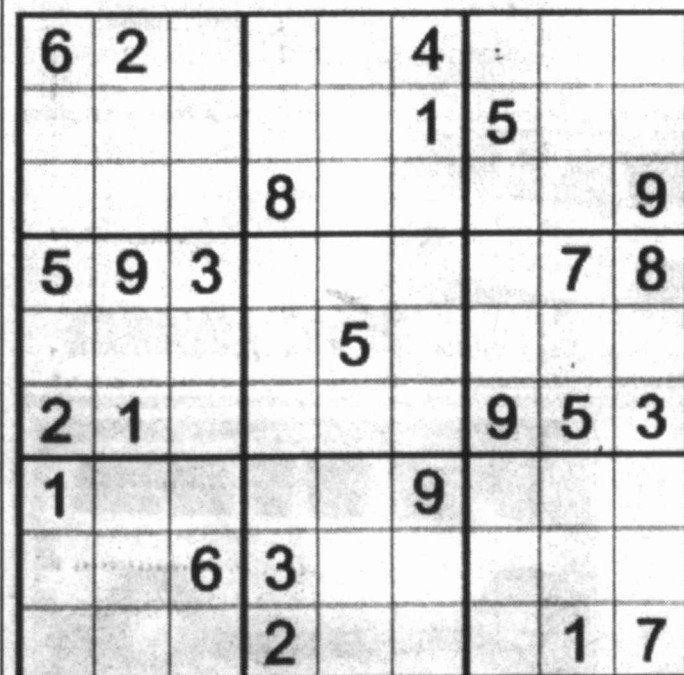

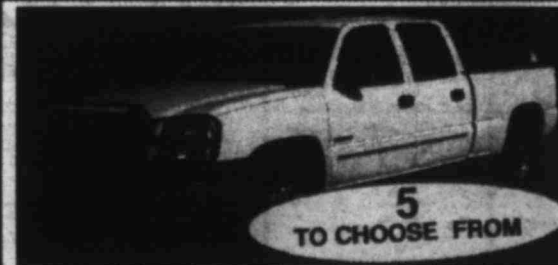
