





We just can't go along in supporting any candidate for the state legislature who pleads for the position on the basis of "needing the job." And we have candidates who have attempted to appeal to us personally and to the public in general through the newspapers and in private conversations, stating this among their reasons (not qualifications, mind you) for seeking the nod at election time.

State legislative posts in Texas net little pay, less than \$1,000 per year, we understand. That leaves only three evident excuses for a man wanting the job:

1. The candidate hopes to gain prestige which may help him in his political ambitions or later in private practice. (An expensive price for prestige, and certainly prohibitive to the honest office holder who must earn his living by this means).

Reason 2: The candidate may hope to supplement his meager salary by accepting re-
