






## LET'S TALK LIVESTOCK

Cattle sold at mostly steady prices at Fort Worth Monday. Trade was rather slow on fed beef cattle as large offerings were reported around the major marketing circle Monday. Calves drew fully steady prices. Stocker trade was active, and firm prices were paid for replacement stock. Fat yearlings topped at \$23.

4-H and FFA boys and girls from Dickens and Kent Counties had stock on the market and provided top prices for cattle at \$23 per hundred and top prices for the woolled lamb market at \$23.

Butcher hogs sold steady to 25 cents higher and topped at \$21.75. Sows drew unchanged prices and pigs were steady.

Slaughter classes of sheep and lambs cleared at steady to 50 cents higher prices. Stockers and feeders

sound at steady prices. Other Spring lambs topped at \$24.50 and old crop woolled club lambs topped at \$23. Shorn old crop fat lambs topped at \$20.50.

Good and choice fed steers and yearlings ranged from \$20 to \$23, and common, plain and medium butcher sorts sold for \$13 to \$19, with some canner yearlings below that range. Numerous truckloads of fed steers and yearlings were in the \$20 to \$22 slot.

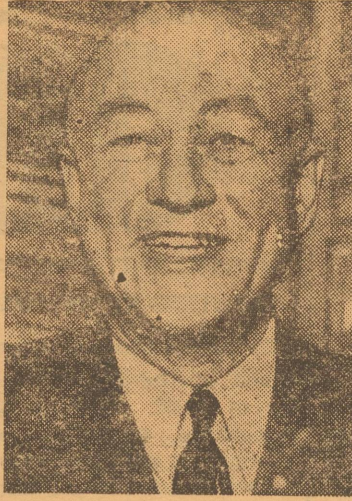
Fat cows cleared at \$12.50 to \$15 a few heiferish kinds higher. Canners and cutters moved at \$9 to \$12.50. Bulls were reported from \$12 to \$18.

Good and choice slaughter calves sold from \$20 to \$23, and plain and medium butcher sorts sold for \$13 to \$19. Cull sorts cashed at \$10 to \$13.

Good and choice stocker calves cleared at \$20 to \$23.50 and similar yearlings cashed at \$22.50 down. Plain and medium stockers sold for \$15 to \$18.50. Replacement cows cleared at \$12 to \$20.

Good and choice butcher hogs averaging 185 to 260 pounds drew \$21.50 to \$21.75, most top hogs at the \$21.75 price. Lighter and heavier weights sold from \$18 to \$21.50. Sows drew \$16.50 to \$19. Figs bulked at \$14 to \$17. Cabbage fed hogs sold mainly around \$19 to \$20.

Good and choice slaughter Spring lambs cashed at \$22 to \$24.50, and medium to good sorts sold from \$17 to \$22. Good and shorn fat lambs sold from \$19 to \$20.50, with some woolled club lambs up to \$23. Shorn yearlings and two's sold for \$16 to \$18. Slaughter ewes drew \$8 to \$11. Old wethers drew \$10 to \$12. Stocker and feeder lambs cashed at \$16 to \$18, choice kinds quotable higher.

### FROZEN CHEESE DREAM

- 2 cups cottage cheese
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 cups sour cream

Press cottage cheese through sieve. Add lemon juice and sugar; beat until smooth and blended. Stir in sour cream and mix well. Pour into refrigerator tray. When mixture is frozen around edge, turn into chilled bowl and beat with rotary beater until smooth but not melted. Return to tray and freeze until firm. Cut into 6 pie-shaped wedges. Serve with fruit.

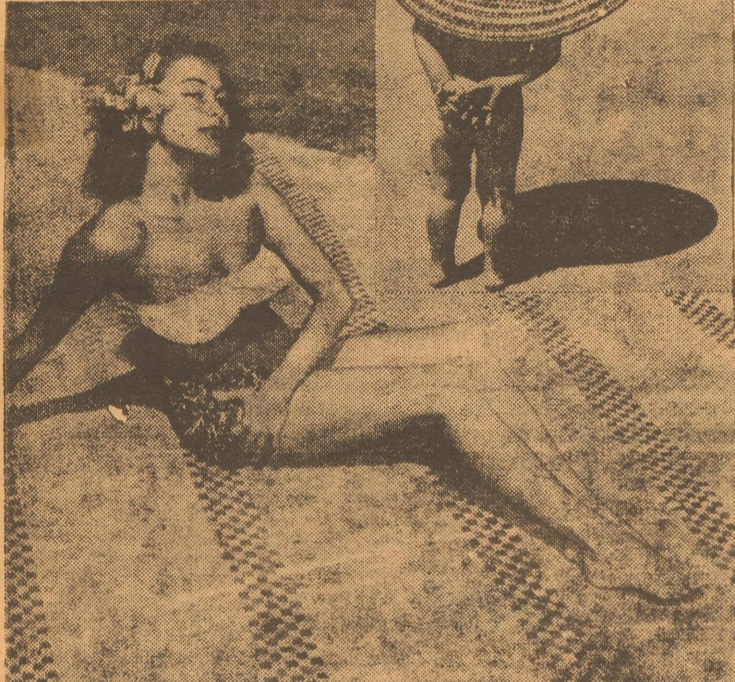

strip that has been in controversy, the states can immediately proceed with full development. The fight on this issue has been long and tough, and it is a source of great satisfaction to know that we have passed the measure through the House and that it will not be vetoed. The debate on the bill was never heated and there were no noticeable displays of temper. The whole subject was faced on a logical and reasonable basis and the bill simply passed because the proponents of the bill have the facts and the law on their side. Some humorous events occurred during the debate. One of the opponents of the bill, who is a very nice fellow, commented that the original three mile strip in the marginal sea was fixed on the theory that it was a defense matter concerning the defense of the country that the width of the strip was determined by the fact that it was the distance that a cannon could fire at that time. This Member wondered how it was that cannons would only shoot three miles off the eastern states while apparently Texas had cannons that would shoot 10 1-2 miles. I later told him that it was a matter of common knowledge that the size of Texas requires a cannon that would shoot three times farther than those in the smaller states. Obviously another situation where necessity is the mother of invention.

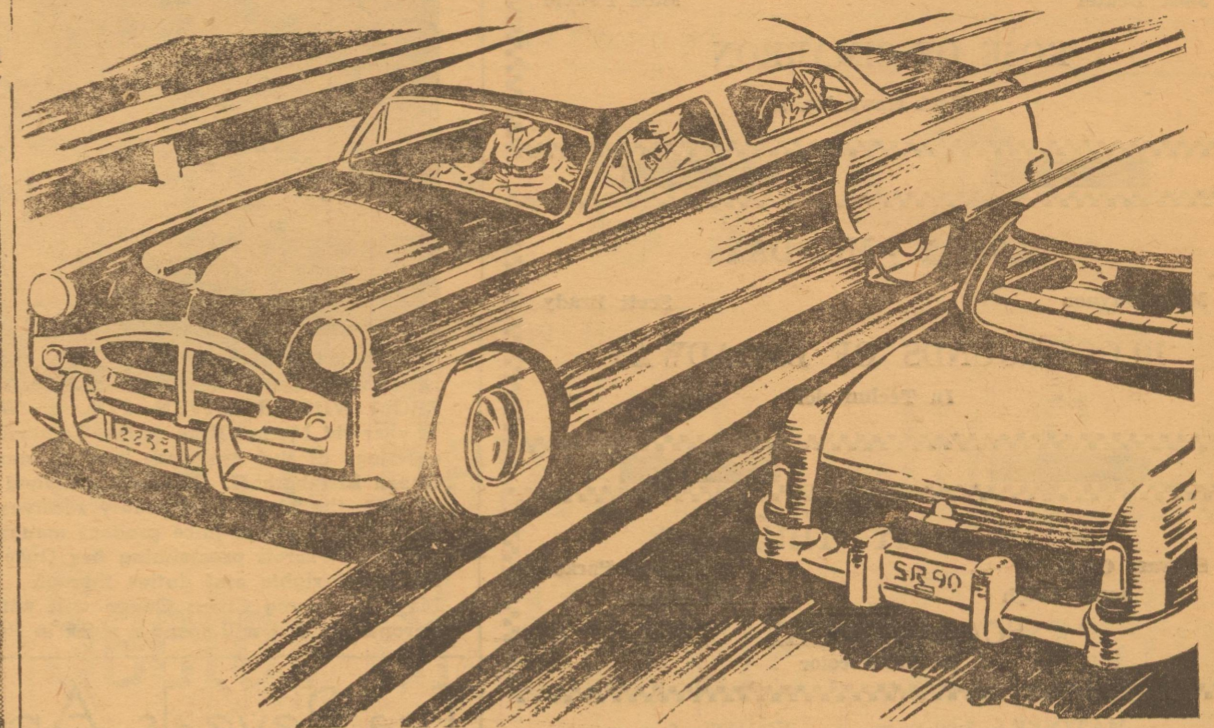
