



Too, some rural subscribers understood when installing their phones that there would be no toll fees for talking into Friona; others understood differently; so the situation as been in state of confuson for the rural subscribers to this date, though the Friona subscribers and businessmen are only now being presented the problem which is confusing to them

- 1 teaspoon unflavored geletin
- 1 tablespoon cold water
- 3-4 cup strained carrots 1-4 cup water
- 1-4 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 2 hard cooked eggs
