

1/2 to 3/2 cup sugar dispending 1/2 cup brown sugar

on sweetness of apples 1 cup Gold Medal

tsp. cinnamon (or nutneg) "Kitchen-tested" Flour 1 tsp. cinnamon (or nutmeg) "Kitcher 2 tbsp. Gold Medal "Kelchen-lested" Flour

Line a deep pie pan with plain pastry, and chill while preparing appies.

Pare and core apples, and slice thinly.

Mix together sugar, cinnamon (or nutmeg), and the 2 tbsp. flour. Mix with the apples—and place in pastry-lined pan. (If the apples are not very juicy, sprinkle with a bit of water.) Dot with the 2 tbsp. butter.

Cream together the 12 cup softened

butter and the brown sugar. Sift the

work it into the creamed butter and brown sugar (using a pastry blender or a spoon) to make a crumb mixture.
5. Sprinkle the crumb mixture over the top of the apples.

6. Bake. Serve with plain or whipped cream, if desired.

TIME—Bake 35 to 45 minutes.
