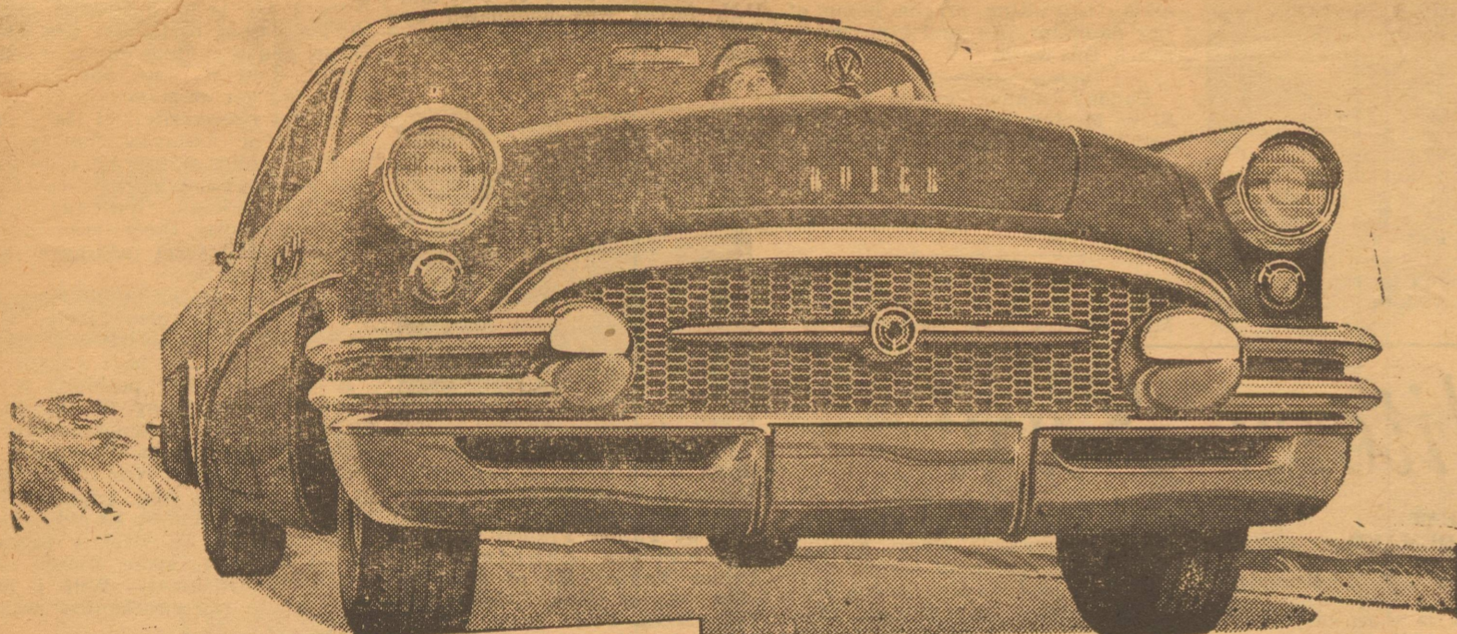

## Star Recipes

There is one sure way of pleasing Dad at mealtime next Sunday: Serve him a man's dinner, long on beef and short on budget!

Save the glamour of feminine dishes for another day; just set a hearty, thick pot-roast before His Majesty and watch the crinkles of appreciation take over his face.

To bring out the best in any pot-roast, season and brown the meat slowly in hot fat, preferably in a heavy skillet or Dutch oven; add 1/2 cup liquid (this can be water, soup stock, tomato juice or any special sauce); the cover tightly and cook gently and slowly until tender, about two to three hours, adding more liquid as necessary.

The Barbecued Pot-Roast recipe which follows is a masterpiece of art, worthy of any bread winner on his special day. (He will even appreciate it sliced, heated in sauce and served on toasted buns on Monday.) To serve a family of four or five:

- 3 pounds beef pot-roast (blade or arm cut)
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 3 tablespoons fat
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 8-ounce can tomato sauce
- 3 medium onions
- 2 cloves garlic
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard
- 1/4 cup lemon juice
- 1/4 cup catsup
- 1/4 cup vinegar
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce

Rub meat with salt and pepper; brown in hot fat. Add water, tomato sauce, minced or thinly sliced onions and minced garlic. Cover and cook over low heat 1 1/2 hour. Combine remaining ingredients and pour over meat; cover and continue cooking about 1 hour, or until ten-

der. Remove meat to hot platter. Skim most of fat from gravy, dilute with water to suit taste, then thicken with 2 tablespoons flour mixed to smooth paste with a little water.

Serve with your family's favorite vegetables and potatoes fixed as you like them best, and give Pop the best break he ever had on Father's or any other day!

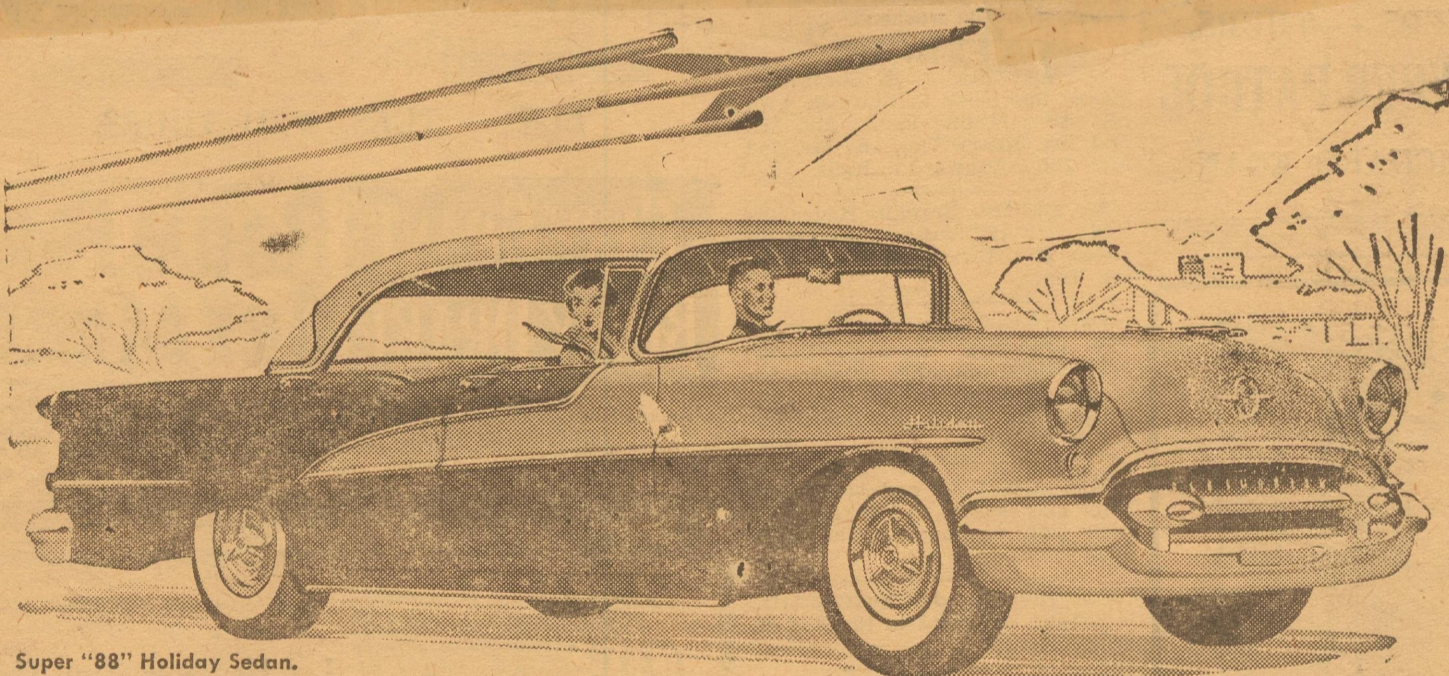

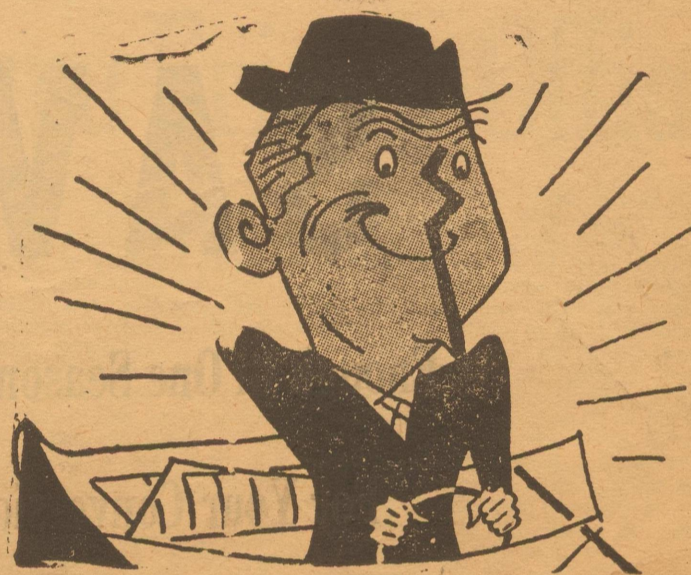

LONG-TIME LANDOWNER OF FRIONA PASSES AWAY

George Ernest McCrede, a long-time landowner of Friona, passed away at his home in Longview, Texas, Wednesday, June 1. He was born at Longview in 1904, and was buried in the Alpine cemetery of Longview, June 3. Mr. McCrede is survived by his widow and three children.

Mr. McCrede drilled the first successful irrigation well in Parmer County. The well site is on the half-section north of Friona now operated by Curtis Murphree. Mr. McCrede advanced present-day irrigation by ten years, and his well helped produce abundant crops. While under the possession of Mr. McCrede, the land was successfully farmed by Joe W. Beaty, now a resident of the city of Friona.

At the time of his death, Mr. McCrede owned extensive land and oil in East Texas around Kilgore, and in Arkansas.

In his present-day hometown of Longview, he was respected by many friends. His home on East Marshall Drive was the scene of frequent visits by residents of the city.

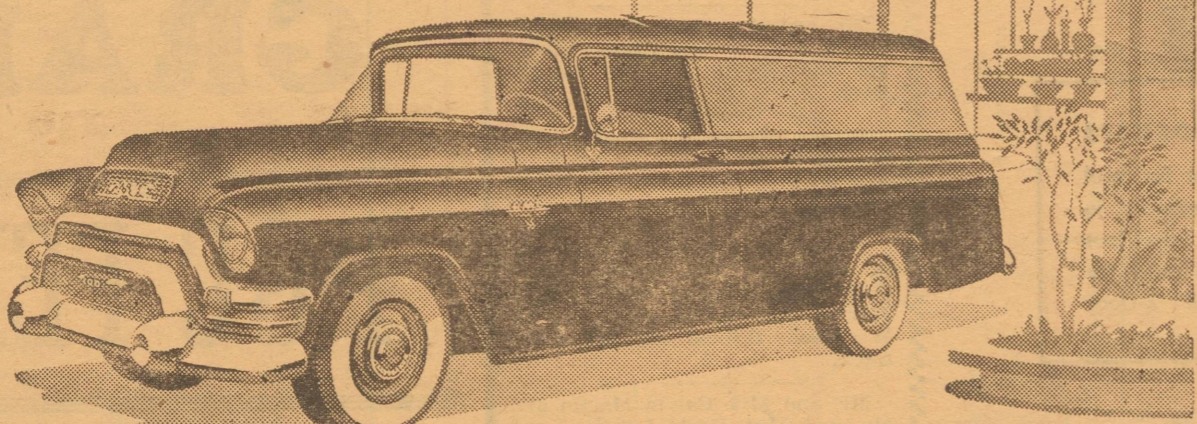
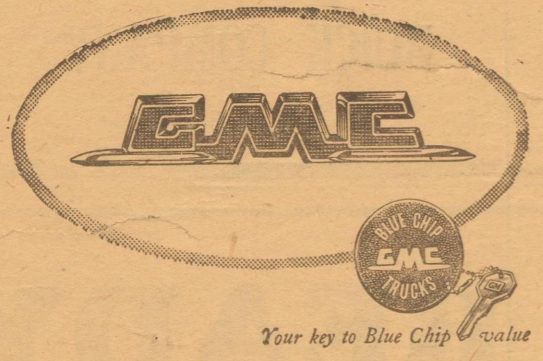

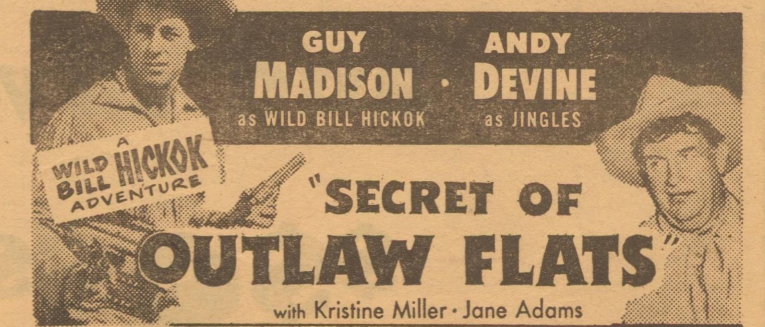
