Through three season, his Raider teams averaged 30 points per game and 400 total yards offense.
He became the first Southwest Conference coach since Dutch Meyer in 1934-36 who posted victories over Texas .

## Highway 60 Phase

 Progress DiscussedProgress on the construction of two additional lanes on U.S. Highway 60 from Friona to the Deaf Smith County line is about on schedule, according to Rhea Bradley, district Highway Engineer.
Bradley said it is hoped to have traffic on the new lanes the latter part of this summer. Then, the crews will move to the old lanes, tear it up, and begin reconstructing that portion of the highway.
The storm sewers and culvert work have been completed on the ighway, and work on the actual roadway will now proceed. Bradley said that plans for the second stage of the project, from
Friona to Bovina, have been completed, and submitted to the state office for approval. The highway officials plan to award bids on this portion of the highway in December of this year. "There are several utility adjustments still lacking on the Friona-Bovina segment, but all ight of way is purch Dit," Bradley said.

Pope of Lubbock said the funds were secure awarding the third stage, Bovina to the state line, pending a new state budget and availability of funds.
"We are hopeful of completing the entire project as quickly as
