The lamp should be tall enough to spread light evenly over the work area and properly shaded to conceal the light source from the eyes. A diffusing bowl is recommended to soften the light and prevent glare. If the lamp has no diffusing bowl, use a 150 -watt white indirect bulb. Better light means better grades.

NEEDED: PUBLIC RELATIONS in agriculture
Agriculture's greatest need today is understanding
This means understanding among those directly en faged in
farming and ranching; understand ing by those who provide service and materials to the farms and ranches; understnadngi is those who transport, process and distri bute the plant and animal products coming from farm ${ }^{3}$ and
ranchs; and above all, understanding among the great majority of our people who live in towns and cities and who are the principal consumers of the products of our agricultural industries.
Those of us engaged in agrito take for granted have tended gneerally and naturally understand their basic dependence on agricul ture for food, feed and fiber. In recent years we have been rudely awakened, in cotton, for instance
by the advent of synthetics. American agriculture is thus ing forced to become public relations conscious. We now must seek consumer acceptance not only of our products, but of our
services, of uor policies and of our true place in the total econ-
omy of the Nation and the world. tack on public relations for at tack on
riculture:

1. Correction of the Misconceptions the average urbanite has
about us; especially let htem underabout us; especially let htem under-
stand their foods, fedes and fibers are not expensive, and producers, not and will not be "rolling in wealth" at the expense of food
