When the new catalogs came out each year, many varied uses were
found for the old ones. Tiny toddlers sat on them to give needed,

girls couldn't wait to cut out paper doils from the fashion section, and little boys loved to snicker at the ladies' undergarments. Before the advent of the "slick" colored pages, an old catalog could be
