

THE DREADED DEADLINE draws nearer, even as you sit here reading this little column. IT IS TAX TIME! You should be sitting at the dining table with your trusty calculator in hand and with all those forms, bank statements, ledgers and receipts spread out before you.

Of course, if you don't make the Monday midnight deadline, you could dredge up some of the old excuses that the kids usually use when they fail to turn in their homework on time, such as: the dog ate it; or the baby colored all over it with his crayons and I had to start over from scratch; or my mother (wife, girlfriend, etc.) used it to start a fire in the fireplace during that last cold snap of the season.

One fellow in California was a little more creative with his excuse for being late. His letter to the IRS read: "Gentlemen, as I was getting the tax forms out of the box, I was bitten by a black-widow spider and to life in prison in Kansas in No-I have been too sick since then to complete the return. I am not accusing your office of sending the spider with the forms, but let's face it; I didn't put it there."

Here's a tax tip: your cost of living index is usually established by the formula of your take home arraigned for murder pay and then add on ten per cent. Lumbrera Murder Trial Is Delayed

The trial of capital murder defendant Diana L. Lumbrera, originally scheduled to start last Monday, has been delayed until June 3, Parmer County District Attorney Johnny Actkinson said Friday.

The trial was pushed back after District Judge Jack Young of Muleshoe in March granted a continuance motion by Amarillo attorney Selden Hale.

Hale last week declined comment on his client's frame of mind. But he confirmed that the nearly two-month delay is needed for him to prepare for the trial.

"The judge said to be ready and I'm gonna try," he said. "I've tried a lot of these cases."

Ms. Lumbrera, 32, was sentenced vember for the May 1990 smothering death of her four-year-old son, Jose Antonio Lumbrera. She was transferred from Kansas to Farwell in late November and now is in Lubbock County Jail.

On January 21, she was connection with the February 13, 1978, suffocation death of her 21/2year-old son, Jose Lionel Garza,

Jr. A Lubbock grand jury lived in Bovina for more than five recommended a bond of \$1 years, and is not that well known, million.

The former Bovina resident also is unlikely, Actkinson said. has been indicted for murder by Counties for the following deaths:

*Joanna Garza Lumbrera, three months, who died November 30, should be tried at taxpayers' 1976, at Parmer County Community Hospital in Friona.

three, who died October 2, 1978, in the same hospital.

*Melinda Ann Garza Lumbrera, two, who died August 17, 1982, in her Bovina home.

Ms. Lumbrera also was indicted in October for murder in connection with the October 8, 1980, death of a cousin's child, sixweek-old Ericka Aleman. Ms. Lumbrera had carried the dead infant into Muleshoe Area Medical Center on that date, according to investigators.


The trial, which will be held in Farwell, could last as long as a month, Actkinson said. Jury selection could take up to two weeks, he added.

About a week before the trial is set to start, a determination will be made on which alleged murder to try Ms. Lumbrera, Actkinson said. Because Ms. Lumbrera has not





Little Theatre To Present Production



Macy's. retail innovations as the layaway Anniversary Nathan Straus introduced such plan, bargain sales and odd pricing, for example, \$4.95 instead of \$5. Macy's also provided restrooms customer emergency medical care. By 1902, Straus' Nathan advanced merchandising and concern for customers made Macy's the largest store in New York City.

This is not, however, Nathan Straus' most important legacy. According to "American Heritage," Straus worked relentlessly to alleviate misery among the poor.

In the winter of 1892-93, "he provided 1.5 million buckets of coal to the poor." The following year, he established shelters and supplied more than 2 million tickets for coal, food and lodging.

Ensuring a safe milk supply was also among Straus' many philan-

thropic achievements. When pasteurization of milk proved effective in reducing infant mortality, Straus immediately set up milk stations in poor areas to give away pasteurized milk. In 1891, 24 per cent of babies born in New York City died before age 1, but of the 20,111 children fed on pasteurized milk supplied by Nathan Straus over a four-year period, only six died.

At his own expense, Straus established 297 milk stations in 36 cities. In a period of 25 years, more than 14 million glasses and bottles of safe milk were dispensed. Although Straus had to fight milk producers and government bureaucrats, and was even arrested for "adulterating" milk, he persisted in his work.

It was not until 1914 that New York City finally adopted mandatory pasteurization of milk. It is estimated that the efforts of Nathan Straus "directly saved the lives of 445,800 children."

Straus, a capitalist and a humanitarian, proved that the terms are compatible. "American Heritage" said it best: "The next time you hear the laugh of a child or look into a little face shining with health, remember Nathan Straus, a saint who was, as it happens, a businessman."




