Lt. Commander Warren Hoagland, a veteran of 20 years Naval service, was killed 'ast Fri_ day night near Hico when his jet plane crashed eight miles south of Hico.

Site of the crash was on the Bill Boyd Ranch, only a few hundred yards from the site of a private plane crash on May 1, 1958 that took the lives of three occupants. The Nevy jet plowed into the

ground on the bank of a stock pond, carving a crater 39 feet wide and about 12 feet deep. The craft exploded and burned upon impact.

First on the scene after the crash was Virgil Parker, who resides about a mile and a half south of the crash site. He saw the flames shooting high into the air. and, accompanied by Ernest Mc ... Coy, who lives about half a mile down the road from the scene, they discovered the wreckage. Mc ... Cov had discovered the wreckage of the light plane which crashed four years ago.

Sheriff Wood Young was retified, and he in turn notified Air Force officials at James Connally AFB, Waco. A team of investiga... tors from that base arrived cn the scene about 1 a.m. Saturday morning and made preliminary in. vestigations.

A Navy investigation team from Grand Prairie NAS arrived in Hico later Saturday and took charge of salvage operations.
