In a fit of despondency, Charles Blackwood, a bartender about fifty years of age, committed suicide in his room at the Metropolitan rooms house about 5 o'clock Sunday afternoon by drinking three ounces of carbolic acid. He died in about ten minutes, being found dead in the hall by one of the other roomers. His mouth and throat were burned considerably, but he was not burned externally by the acid.

RURAL CREDIT MEASURE. The Federal farm loan act, now before the president, attempts so much as is possible to the country that it is difficult to apprise it. Unless it is read with a fair understanding of rural conditions as applied elsewhere, it is virtually impossible to see how advantage can be taken of some of the provisions.

The language of the bill is simple. The terms "first mortgage" and "farm loan bonds" are defined carefully, as these instruments form the basis of rural credits. A Federal farm loan board and bureau are established. The country is to be divided into 12 districts, each of which shall have a Federal land bank.

The bill may be criticized for the manner in which it provides for the appointment of Federal farm loan board. This is to consist of five members, including the secretary of the treasury, chairman ex-officio. The qualifications of the other four, to be appointed by the president, are that "not more than two shall be appointed from one political party, and all shall be citizens."
