The day that speech was made over a famous American historic in Washington who remarked, with the intentional exaggeration of his role, "I'm going to be a great man."

### FORMER BREWER MAYOR OF BUFFALO GETS BUSY; MANY CHANGES ORDERED

BUFFALO, N. Y., Jan. 6.—Frank X. Schwab, former brewer, elected mayor of Buffalo on a beer and wine platform, is carrying out prohibition pledges hanging over his head. He is causing "dry" advocates to wonder how he will proceed with respect to the violation question of prohibition. Mayor Schwab has announced that all "dry" laws will be enforced and has asked the corporation counsel to draft an ordinance which will enable him to reduce the number of licensed soft drink places from six thousand to one thousand.

In the first week of his administration Mayor Schwab refused the prohibition enforcement and the squads of the police department, installed a police chief of his own choice whose first move was a general shake-up of subordinates; scrapped the police reserves, an unpaid civilian organization formed during the war, and called together an advisory committee of one person from each of the city wards.

### FIRE DESTROYS ONE OF THE OLDEST BUILDINGS IN TOWN OF PALESTINE

PALESTINE, Jan. 6.—Fire yesterday destroyed one of the oldest buildings in Palestine, a frame building built in 1871 or 1872, and on-time favorite hanging out place of the late Judge John H. Rosen, nationally known Texas statesman. It first stood at the corner of Spring and Commerce streets, but later was moved to the head of North Jackson street and was occupied variously as the postoffice, bookstore, jewelry store and grocery. The second floor in early days was used for law offices and was the common meeting place of many men who made history in this section.

### COMPERS PLANS TOUR OF LARGER CITIES TO FIGHT ANTI-LABOR LEGISLATION

NEW YORK, Jan. 6.—Employees in New York state were warned in a statement yesterday by Samuel Compers, president of the American Federation of Labor, that organized labor would oppose vigorously any attempt to enact legislation establishing an industrial relations court.

Mr. Compers announced that he would tour the principal cities of the country and rally the forces of labor to fight proposed legislation of that character.

### LIVE AT HOME PLAN POPULAR ONE WITH CHILDRESS FARMER

YEAR OF PROSPERITY GROWS EFFORTS MADE IN THAT DIRECTION.

EFFORTS ARE CONTINUED WITH ADDED INTEREST

Meeting Will Be Held Tuesday To Promote Poultry Industry in County.

CHILDRESS, TEXAS, Jan. 6.—By encouraging a live-at-home campaign among Childress county farmers in 1921, a year of prosperity has been experienced which has taught a strong lesson: diversified farming is taking a new hold for 1922. The chamber of commerce, assisted by the Rotary club and other organizations, is fostering a great deal of interest among the farmers of the county toward securing more meat hogs, dairy cows and good poultry on the farms.

A meeting has been called for Tuesday, January 10, of all who are interested in poultry, and a date is to be set for a county poultry show, to be financed by the chamber of commerce. This will probably follow the date of the poultry demonstration car which is to be sent out by the Port Worth and Denver Railway company, and is expected to be a strong factor in creating a greater interest in the poultry industry in Childress county.

### BEGIN STANDARDIZATION OF ANTI-TOXIN SERUMS ON AN EXTENSIVE SCALE

NEW YORK, Jan. 6.—Unification of international standards of anti-toxin sera has been begun on a large scale by the league of nations health committee, according to detailed plans received here. The United States, the league of nations bureau announced, has agreed to cooperate in this work through the United States public health service at Washington and through the presence at the conference of Dr. Rupert Blue, assistant surgeon general, stationed at Paris, German

scientists will also take part as well as Japan and representatives of all the larger European medical services.

"Up to now," the bureau said, "there has been as much confusion in the various national standards of measuring the strength of anti-serums for diseases such as diphtheria, tetanus, diphtheria, syphilis, meningococcus and pneumococcus as there has been in the different currency systems in the world."

"In order to obviate these difficulties, the health committee of the league of nations began a series of studies last October which resulted in an international conference at London in December when some of the foremost scientists of the world came together to prepare plans for the first joint experimental inquiry of the sort ever attempted. A program was adopted whereby the standards of measuring the strength of the anti-toxin sera employed; secondly, as international trade in sera is increasing, it represents not only an inconvenience but a positive danger to have their strengths listed at varying standards."

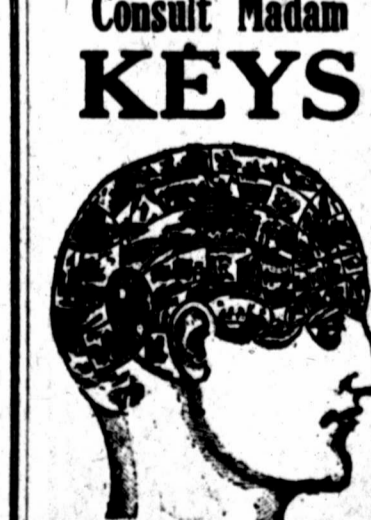

### WILLIAMS NORMALLY ENTERS RACE FOR CONGRESS



Guinn Williams of Decatur has made formal announcement of his candidacy for the democratic nomination for congress in the 13th congressional district. The Wichita County Messenger in announcing his candidacy gives the following sketch of Mr. Williams:

"Guinn Williams was born in Mississippi, April 22, 1871. When he was a baby his father and mother moved to Texas, locating in Montague county, near where the town of Nocona now stands. In 1876 his parents moved to Wise county, locating on a farm two miles south of Decatur. On this farm Guinn grew to manhood. In 1898 he was elected county clerk of Wise county, serving two terms. ### NEWBERRY FIGHT IS ON IN THE SENATE AND DEBATE WARM

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—Definite announcement that Senator Truman H. Newberry, of Michigan, would address the senate Monday, to answer charges that he should be ousted, was made late today by Chairman Spencer of the elections committee.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—Final consideration of the Newberry senatorial contest was begun in the senate today under the unanimous consent agreement previously entered. Senator Caraway, democrat, of Arkansas, who opened the attack on Mr. Newberry, was scheduled to discuss the controversy at length.

Senator Caraway became engaged at the outset in a sharp verbal exchange with Chairman Spencer of the committee which reported that Senator Newberry was entitled to his seat.

Senator Spencer said he had stated that, because of the condition of his health Senator Newberry should not subject himself to the ordeal of questioning of senators on the floor.

Senator Spencer, speaking with great feeling, declared that Senator Caraway showed "bitter and vindictive hatred for Senator Newberry."

"I know, however, there are democrats here who will vote against Senator Newberry on the highest motives and without malice," he added.

Mr. Caraway challenged the statement made by Senator Moses, republican, New Hampshire, that the administration had "swollen" the census returns of known republican states to the end that during the war, the republican states sent more men overseas than were sent from democratic states.

### WANT REVISION OF SHIPPING RATES ON FUEL OIL AND GAS

TULSA, OKLA., Jan. 6.—The traffic managers of most of the large independent refining firms and members of the Western Petroleum Refiners' association, in session here today, unanimously voted to petition the I. C. C. for a revision of fuel oil and gas oil shipping rates from the mid-continent field, according to Clifford Thorne, commerce counsel for the association.

A committee previously appointed by the association is preparing its evidence for an additional application to the interstate commerce commission for a general reduction in refined oil rates on all other petroleum products.

The date for hearing of the petition has been set for February 11 at Washington, D. C.

### BELOW ZERO WEATHER FOR THE NORTHWEST

MASON CITY, IOWA, Jan. 6.—The government thermometers here showed a minimum temperature of 26 degrees below zero last night, the lowest in several years.

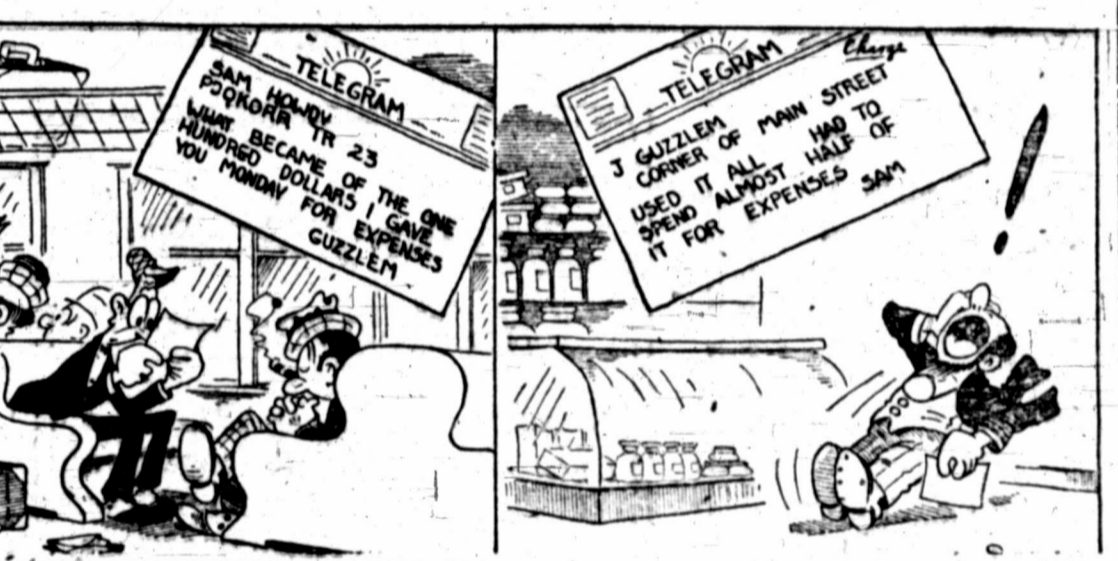

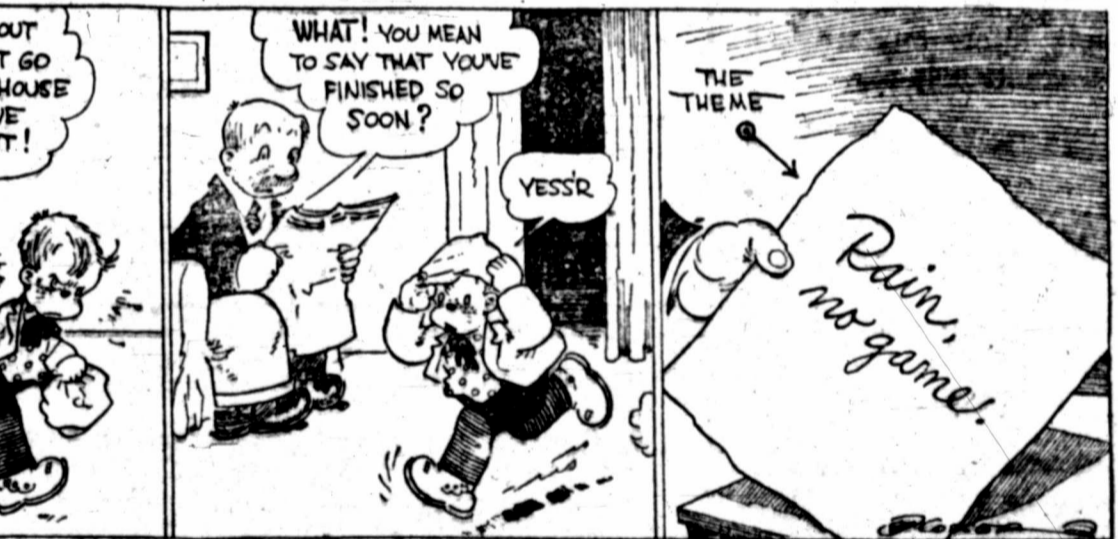
