Suburb to Be Formed Into Village... ELECTION FEBRUARY 10... Two Miles Square Included in Proposed Boundary of New Municipality

Forty-two voters of the Polytchnic Heights addition to the city of Fort Worth have petitioned County Judge Robert H. Milam to call an election by the qualified voters in a certain district described to determine whether or not the village of Polytchnic shall be incorporated...

Limits Proposed... Beginning at the northwest corner of the J. Vanripper survey, thence east along the north line of said survey and along the north line of the J. Armand survey to the south line of the Texas and Pacific right of way; thence north along the said right of way to a point north of the northeast corner of block 29, Polytchnic addition; thence south to and along blocks 20, 21, 48, 49 and 76 of said addition; to the southeast corner of block 76; thence west along the south line of block 76 to the southeast corner of block 75 of said addition; thence south along the line of blocks 77, 102, 103 and 127 to the south line of N avenue; thence west along N avenue to the west line of the J. W. Sublett survey; to the southeast corner of the J. Hinger survey; thence east to the Fort Worth and Howman Springs road; thence north to the west line of the J. Hinger survey; north to the place of beginning.

Prominent Signers... The forty-two signers to the petition are prominent people and tax payers of the Polytchnic Heights suburb, and the proposed village incorporation of the territory described is for improvement and protection purposes. It is proposed to have a regular government, to elect officers and to levy taxes for town improvements and protection.

Little Known Industry Only 200 Miles West

THE BEDS ARE IMMENSE... Pumps Bring Up Brine—Six Carloads Shipped Daily by One Firm... COLORADO, Texas, Jan. 20.—"But if the salt have lost its savour, where- with shall it be seasoned?" is scriptural, and it is also a phrase that has more than an ordinary application to the early pioneer on the west Texas plains who started out with a supply of the precious seasoning, only to find after several months had elapsed from the time he left the settlements, his salt had become stale, and practically worthless.

Earth Full of Salt

Had the early west Texas pioneer known it, a very wealth of the useful mineral for which he so much longed lay beneath his feet as he walked over the grassy plains. It is true that the early traveler had no means of getting at it, but it was there, nevertheless, in a quantity even yet still uncalculated because of its immensity.

Scarcely less ignorant than the early traveler regarding the wealth of salt in the western part of this state is the east Texas, who does not know that a large per cent of the supply, not only for Texas, but other states of the southwest, comes from Mitchell county, some 200 miles west of Fort Worth.

Miniature Ocean 900 Feet Deep

The vein of rock salt from which the supply is secured lies from 800 to 900 feet below the surface and, as has been stated, is probably 125 feet thick. Artesian water, percolating through the rocks, has reached the rock salt and become impregnated until it has turned to brine. The result is a miniature ocean several hundred feet beneath the surface of Mitchell county, and into the ocean the salt makers have run the pump pipes to secure their supply.

Drying the Salt. There are two processes of evaporation; one solar, in which Mitchell county probably leads the state...

Enormous Vats. One of the salt factories near Colorado has evaporating vats with a total exposed surface of nearly 255,000 square feet...

The brine is pumped into the vats, where it spreads itself over the entire surface, until the required depth has been reached...

When enough salt has gathered on the bottom of the vats, workmen scrape it in piles at the sides, and when these piles are large enough, the salt is shoveled into wagons and taken to the factory...

Sun and Wind Are Laborers. For this grade of salt the cost of production is minimum... The brine, when it comes from the wells, is much cooler than the atmosphere...

NEW SCHOOL BELOW NEEDS

Part of Old Buildings to Remain in Eighth Ward

Although the new De Zalava school will seat 500 pupils when completed, within two weeks there will not be enough room for the pupils in the building at the beginning of the next school year, according to Professor Magee. On that account two of the buildings in use at present will be left on the grounds for use then. The new building will be crowded immediately upon opening. The remainder of the old buildings will be moved to other parts of the city wherever needed the most. Two or three will probably go to the Sixth ward which is in need of more room.

The pupils will probably move into their new quarters two weeks from Monday. The new building is almost complete and everything has been done except to put on the finishing touches. Work is now going on in finishing the ceilings, painting the different parts and installing the heating system. The heating plant will be finished by next Wednesday and the blackboards about the same time.

The desks for the school have been received and there will be no delay on that account as there was at the Van Zandt school. There are 250 new desks and for the remainder old desks will be used. The new ones will be put in during the coming week and then if everything is in readiness a large force of men will be put at work a week from Friday and Saturday and the old desks taken out and put in within the two days. The pupils will probably be dismissed early that day in order that the work may be done.

The new building will have twelve rooms and will accommodate 575 pupils, which is about the attendance at the school at present.

Public Opening A public opening of the school will be held in February, probably on the 16th. The public will be invited to attend and a special program will be arranged. There will be about ten addresses and Mayor Powell, Alderman Zorn, Judge W. D. Hess, J. C. Terrell and others will be invited to address the meeting.

VETERANS GIVEN CANNON CROSSES

Exercises in Memory of Lee and Jackson

William Barr, Dr. A. P. Brown, J. A. Brooks, J. T. Castleberry, W. B. Hurley, A. P. Jones, W. E. Jones, B. F. Richardson, J. M. Skillman and R. H. Wood, all Confederate veterans, received crosses of honor made from Confederate cannon Friday night, presentation being made by the Daughters of the Confederacy. The crosses were presented at a meeting held at the court house in honor of the birthday of Robert E. Lee and to pay fit tribute to the memory of "Stonewall" Jackson, whose natal day is Jan. 21.

The meeting was a large one, the hall in which R. E. Lee and his sons weekly meetings being filled to its utmost seating and standing capacity. The exercises were full of interest to all present.

The president of the Daughters, Mrs. F. L. Jourdan, called the meeting to order and the exercises were begun by the large audience standing and repeating the Lord's prayer, the vice president, Mrs. W. C. Young, leading.

Commander E. W. Taylor of R. E. Lee camp explained the occasion of the gathering and in his remarks, which were brief, paid a glowing tribute to Robert E. Lee as a soldier, statesman and a Christian, but declared he could not avoid paying a high tribute to him as a soldier. Captain Padlock's remarks were extemporaneous, but were full of fervor and were listened to in breathless silence by his audience.

Following Captain Padlock, Judge C. C. Cummings spoke on Thomas Jonathan (Stonewall) Jackson. His address was full of reminiscences of the great war between the states and biographical facts of both Lee and Jackson.

These two addresses concluded the memorial features of the evening and the following musical program was rendered: "Lee and Jackson's Requiem"..... Mrs. Will Leake Reading—"Smith and His Grindstones"..... Mrs. L. K. Stanberry Vocal solo—"Dixie"..... Mrs. Loyd Pollock

Crosses Presented The presentation of crosses to members of R. E. Lee camp, to whom they had been awarded by the Daughters of the Confederacy, was next on the program and the ten veterans of the civil war named above lined up in front of the platform and received the honorable decorations, the crosses being pinned on their breasts by Mrs. L. V. Clough and Mrs. Virginia Scoble.

The occasion was one of the most pleasant affairs in the history of the organization, the exercises being concluded by an announcement that crosses would again be distributed on April 26.

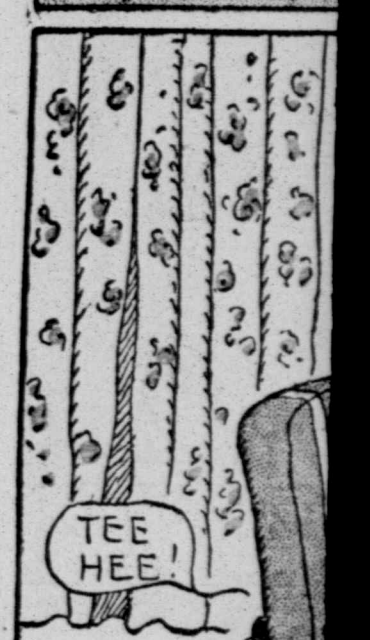
