"With the middle portion of the five-foot root zone soil profile as dry as it is, producers really need to
maximize the use of rainfall this maximize the use of rainfall this
year," says Ken Carver, Water District Assistant Manager
Furrow dikes are a cost-effectiv means of doing just that."
Furrow dikes are small earthen dams mechanically constucted in event, the small basins between the earthen dams collect rainfall and hold it in place until it can soak into the soil. Annual precipitation totals range from 18 to 20 inches across the
Texas High Plains. Most of this Texas High Plains. Most of this
precipitation occurs just prior to and during the summer growing

Most of the average annual rainfall is provided by showers with precipitation totals of less than an absorb. However, the remaining precipitation is the result of short, powerful thunderstorms. In this case, the downpour is greater than
