OSCAR LANGE-A REFORM SOCIALIST?

Throughout the years of international communism's thusfar successful war against freedom, communist conspirators have frequently posed as reform socialists or as non-communist left wing liberals. One of the most astounding examples of this communist tactic was the case of Oscar Lange. Among other U.S. connec-

spirators are exposed. Oscar Lange's left-wing supporters frequently used his books and articles as authoritative sources for proof of their theories. While he was in the United States the NEA (National Education Association) selected Lange and another alien-born, pro-Soviet professor as co-authors of a bookiet on "The American Way of Business." This booklet explained to Tulsa 2, Oklahoma.

high school teachers how American business enterprises are operated, so that the teachers could properly advise their students on this subject. Of course, the goal of the communists is to smash completely the American free enterprise system and establish socialism in our nation. From a socialist

state they consider it an easy step to communist dictatorship. What a perfect setup it is to have one of their trusted agents instruct American teachers on "The American Way of Business." Furthermore, this is only one example.

In 1945, the year after the NEA published this booklet, Oscar Lange renounced his American citizenship to become a citizen and official of Soviet Poland. He became the United Nations representative of the Polish puppet government.

In spite of all this, Oscar Lange is still considered an authority on economic matters and his booklet. "On the Economic Theory of Socialism" was required reading at Harvard University's economics department as late as the Spring term of the 1959-60 school year. Is it any wonder that America continues to lose the so-called Cold War against the international communist conspiracy?


