MKT Asks to Abandon Freight Through Hico

Washington (Spl).-The Missouri-Kansas - Texas Railroad asked the Interstate Commerce Commission Monday for authority to abandon 220 miles of branch line trackage between Bellmead (Waco) and Samford.

The ruilroad said the branch has been operating at a deficit and is in such condition that heavy expenditures would be required for its rehabilitation. It said an alternative route

would be more economical.

Charles L Howard, general agent for the MKT in Waco, said he had received no word of the proposed abandonment. Howard said the track which operates only as a freight line serves Aquilla, Whitney, DeLeon, Hico, Dublin, Cisco, Albany and Stamford. He said one train leaves Waco every other day and one leaves from the other end of the line on the alternate days.

The MKT had leased the line from Texas Central Rellroad Co. since April 20, 1914. Texas Central filed a companion application to abandon the Bellmead - Stamford branch line.

MKT officials said they would prefer to lease a line over an alernative route of the Fort Worh and Denver Reilway Co.
