| A light sampling of opinion on the daylight savings time change coming up Sunday, April 30, at midnight, found Hico businesses going along with the new time, but the poll also revealed a lack of understanding on the part of some people. <br> The time change, effective na-tion-wide on the above date. will not greatly affect any of the merchants and individuals contacted. Most were happy about the extra hour of daylight at the end of the day.
