Meeting with the city governing body was Rolla Johnson of Tyler, general manager of the company, and Tom Venable of Hamilton, district manager.

Part of the increase is minor, but still other phases of the increase could be considered of major proportion. The increase ranges from fifty cents for a 4-party set to \$2.25 for business phones. No increase was asked for on extensions, residential or business.

In making the request, Mr. Johnson also cited the fact that
