



She cited the example of the almost 1,000 young Americans who went to Cuba last year to assist with the sugarcane harvest, many had been involved in infamous acts of violence in the U.S., such as bombings, student uprisings, and terrorism across the nation. These young people have been taught, and taught well, the art of espion-


