Exxon Corp. has amended to a Pennsylvanian detrital wildcat for completion attempt from an oil zone, No. 1-1 South Howe Oil Unit (formerly No. 1-1 South Howe Gas Unit), Pecos County wildcat, 17 miles southwest of

It originally was slated as an 18,650-foot searcher for Devonian gas and Ellenburger gas. It was drilled to 19,133 feet and has been plugged back to 13,035 feet.

Austin One Of Most Paralyzed **Areas Of State**

A crippling sheet of ice and snow covered almost all of Texas today from San Benito, near the tip of the semitropical Lower Rio Grande Valley, into the northern Panhandle and as far east as Nacogdoches and Lufkin.

One of the most paralyzed areas was the capital city of Austin with an unbroken sheet of ice and sleet over all the streets.

Cars stalled everywhere at Austin and schools in the city and surrounding areas were closed. City buses could not even get out of their parking lot.

Ice covered trees in the San Benito area with temperatures just at the freezing level. It was the first freezing rain in the Valley in two years, the National Weather Service said. Some snow

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP) -Gov. Edwin Edwards says Louisiana might get into the oil and gas drilling business-and keep all that it produces for it-

He told reporters Tuesday the state Mineral Board, with his consent, has canceled a planned sale Feb. 14 of mineral leases on 10,500 acres of submerged land in the Gulf of

Right now, Edwards said, the moratorium is only temporary-but it might become permanent if experts determine it's economically feasible for the state to go into the oil and gas business itself.

The federal government several months ago turned about 50,000 acres of submerged land in the mineral-rich Gulf over to the state for leasing.

Estimates of the land's value have ranged as high as \$200 million although experts say there's no way now to tell how much it's really worth.

"It's a fact it's an oil-rich area, though," state Mineral Board chairman Andrew Martin told reporters.

Edwards said the goal of the state's new course of action is to make sure there's enough natural gas to heat homes and

The state has been haggling with interstate pipeline companies for years over the sale of Louisiana-produced natural gas. State officials contend the firms have committed too much of the fuel to out-of-state

"It would be good to announce we had captured "x" millions of dollars in lease sales," Edwards told newsmen, "but it would only make us

"We feel it would be better to try to keep the gas in Loui-

will study the possibility of a state-owned gas pipeline system and will determine the feasibility of the state doing the drilling work.

"We will consider the possibility of the state financing the drilling, as the owner of the gas," the governor said.

Edwards said the decision not to sell the oil and gas leases will have no effect on the state's budget, since no income had been anticipated.

72 May Have Been Texas' Safest Year In Decade

WACO, Tex. (AP) - Last year may prove to be the safest Texas motorists have experienced in 10 years, the director of the Department of Public Safety says.

Col. Wilson Speir told a Baylor University banquet here Tuesday night, however, that those killed on the state's highways last year can take little

comfort in the knowledge. Speir said when records on traffic deaths are completed March 15 they will likely show that 3,660 persons were killed last year compared with 3,594 in 1971. But, he said, Texans drove eight per cent more miles last year thus making deaths fewer per 100,000 miles

He said Texans drove 77 billion miles last year, ending the year with 4:9 persons killed per 100,000 miles driven.

Next Month Will Tell If London Flu Bug To Hit Texas

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (AP) A top state health official pre-dicts the next 30 days will indicate whether Texas is to be confronted with major outbreaks of London flu.

"If we are going to see an upswing, then we'll see it in the next 30 days," says Dr. M. S. Dickerson, who disclosed four cases of the new strain have been isolated in the state.

The first case in the new strain of Type A England flu, commonly called London flu, was isolated in San Marcos, said Dickerson, who is chief of the State Health Department's communicable disease division. Dickerson said two more cases were confirmed among students at the University of Texas at Austin and a fourth case has been seriologically confirmed in a patient from

Police Still Not Sure How Many Snipers On Building

NEW ORLEANS (AP) - Police have identified the sniper they killed on a hotel rooftop as a young Kansas black whose minister says he "hated white

Supt. Clarence Giarrusso told a news conference Tuesday that the sniper was Mark J. Essex, 23, of Emporia and added: "There's some evidence of a conspiracy by other people, but I cannot positively tell you

Six persons were shot to death and 17 injured in the sniping incident. Giarrusso also said

- Ballistics prove a .44 magnum carbine found next to Essex' body was the same weapon that killed a young police cadet and wounded a policeman in New Orleans on New Year's

Asked whether his reference to conspiracy meant he had evidence Essex belonged to a militant organization, Giarrusso

"I'm not certain about that yet ... (but) conspiracy in the sense that it may have been two, three or four people; a small number - you know, it doesn't take many to form a conspiracy - who were intent to kill people. And that's the sum and essence of it."

He said the carbine was the same weapon that cut down cadet Alfred Harrell, 19, as he stepped in front of police headquarters 10 days ago and wounded Patrolman Edwin C. Hosli Sr., 18 minutes later a

At the time of the New Year's Eve shootings, Giarrusso said, "We had some information - reason to believe people were going to hurt someone when Harrell and Hosli were taken to Charity Hospi-

On the basis of that information, during the sniping he deployed extra officers at the hospital, where following a brief disturbance a man with a shotgun was arrested.

In Essex' hometown of Emporia, the Rev. W. A. Chambers, his family's minister, said voung Essex had developed a militant dislike for whites when he came home from the Navy. In Washington, the Navy said

Giarrusso gave these reasons to think Essex wasn't alone:

- After his death, a helicopter which participated in a police siege on the hotel was fired upon. "You'd have to assume the police hit the plane (if Essex was alone). This is possible, but highly improbable

After Essex died, several policemen saw another person on the roof, "There were very, very many shots taken at this person while this person, or this ghost allegedly moved. I can't believe that the police-

- Policemen heard foul language and shouting and talking on the rooftop after Essex was killed.

Giarrusso cited these reasons for believing Essex acted alone. "There has been but one person found.

Police said Essex was wearing military fatigue pants with baggy pockets to carry shells. Bemish, a guest at the hotel, declared: "The man who shot me had on a light tan jacket

Artificial Heart Seen Possible In 15 Years

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - Dr. Denton Cooley has predicted that an artificial heart, self-powered and self-contained, within the human body is a possibility within 15

Cooley, surgeon-in-chief at the Texas Heart Institute in Houston, said in an interview such an artificial heartis a difficult, but not insoluble, challenge.

"We expect the heart to be completely self-contained and look to nuclear energy to keep it powered," he

Despite a heavy schedule of open-heart surgery operations, Cooley said he is supervising experiments on types of fabrics needed to cover the metal mesh of the artificial heart and on sources of nuclear energy to pow-

Patients accept battery-powered pacemakers right now," he said. "Soon they will be given nuclear powered pacemakers to avoid the troublesome replacement of batteries. I think patients will accept a nuclear-powered

Cooley said the original heart transplant taught him a great deal about the ways to solve "the insoluble."

The patient, given the heart April 2, 1969, lived three days before succumbing to pneumonia.

"If that gentleman could live three days with that heart," Cooley said, "why isn't it possible to think someone can live three weeks, three months, even three years with a better self-powered artificial heart?"
