With Six Words, Nixon Launched

WASHINGTON (AP) - "I want it out. Get going."

With those six words, Richard M. Nixon relayed to his aides his decision to publicly release edited transcripts of dozens of his private Watergate conversations.

He was rolling the dice in one of the biggest gambles of his presidency and he was launching what could become one of the biggest public relations campaigns in American political history.

Unlike most gamblers, Nixon may have to wait months to learn whether he won or lost. But his order, recalled Tuesday by an aide, set in motion an almost frantic effort to, as Nixon would later tell the nation, "provide all the additional evidence needed to get Watergate behind us."

According to sources inside and outside the White House. Nixon's six words:

-Caused dozens of government employes from presidential aides to journeyman printers to work non-stop for almost two days on the mechanics of producing for public consumption the 1,308 pages of edited transcripts:

-Sent two middle-level White House aides hurrying through the capital's deserted streets after midnight to a soot-stained red-brick, government building carrying the then-secret tran-

scripts: -Brought a long-time Nixon associate, Herb Klein, back to temporary duty at the White House as an unofficial media consultant:

-Prompted the President's men to devise a carefully choreographed set of moves designed to emphasize the massive nature of Nixon's dis-

Nixon aides say he decided during the weekend to respond to a House Judiciary Com-

mittee subpoena by supplying to the panel's impeachment inquiry, and then making public, edited transcripts of some of his Watergate conversations.

That resulted in his Monday night address to the nation, the Tuesday morning delivery of the transcripts to Capitol Hill and the subsequent release of a blue-bound book almost as thick as the Manhattan telephone book.

At 2:45 a.m. Monday, typewritten copies of the transcripts were handed to a pair of White House aides with orders to deliver them to the Government Printing Office's main plantthe printing office's deadline if it was to reproduce the transcripts for distribution to the news media Tuesday afternoon.

Herb Klein, who left as White House communications director last year for a job as a television executive, was given a temporary office and spent hours offering suggestions to presidential aides and telephoning friends in the media across the country.

Other presidential aides decided upon props for Nixon's television appearance—twin stacks of notebooks containing the transcripts, which were displayed at the President's side

The television audience saw an impressive bulk of 50 threering binders emblazoned with the presidential seal, each with an average of about 25 typewritten transcript pages.

But when the material was prepared for distribution to the news media, it was a single 8by-10-inch book, 21/2 inches thick.

Each of the 38 members of the Judiciary Committee received a brown manila folder, about four inches thick. These contained copies of the edited transcripts- and were delivered in a way intended to emphasize again the volume.

How may a voter using a voting machine write in the name of persons for whom the voter wishes to vote instead of the names on the ballot?-RHW.

County Clerk Rosenelle Cherry explained that writeins in the primary election may be done only for precinct chairmen and county party chairmen, not for candidates for other offices.

At the top of the voting machine are some slots which are numbered the same as the offices on the ballot. Behind those slots are rolls of paper.

When the voter opens one of the slots, the machine automatically locks out the corresponding numbered ballot position. Then the voter writes in that slot the name of the person he wishes to vote for.

How much will the May primary elections cost the county? Since the city and school elections were held only a month ago, wouldn't it save taxpayers money if all these were held at one time?-CD.

The primaries will cost the county nothing, County Clerk Rosenelle Cherry said. The costs have historically been borne by the parties, but now the state pays them.

The county does provide the voting machines free of cost to the parties and county crews move them. This could be construed as a county cost, Mrs. Cherry said, but no estimate is made of it.

A charge once was made for the use of the machines by any government entity other than the county, but that is no longer done.

County crews are used to move and set up the machines because machines are easily damaged and these crews are used to handling them, Mrs. Cherry said.

"I work with ordinary people, and they would not understand the regulation you have here." said Venita Van Caspel, a Houston life insurance agent.

She said the board should require all companies to revise each policyholder's premiums whenever new mortality-or life expectancy tables-are is-

Many premiums are based on 1941 mortality tables that came out before the widespread use of antibiotics, she said. 



MILWAUKEE (AP) - The Boston Celtics' pressure defense was all but impregnable for almost 52 minutes Tuesday night, but when a crack finally appeared Cornell Warner was ready.

Warner drove the lane for a pair of dunk shots, adding a free throw after the first one, in the last 34 seconds of overtime. His second basket gave the Milwaukee Bucks a 103-96 lead en route to a 105-96 victory, squaring their National Basketball Association championship playoff series at 1-1.

The Celtics battled from a 16point deficit early in the third quarter to tie at 90-90 on two free throws by John Havlicek with 58 seconds left in regulation, the final points until the five minute extra period.

The Celtics had two more chances to win in regulation and thus take a 2-0 lead in the best of seven series back to Boston. However, Milwaukee's 7-foot-2 Kareem Abdul-Jabbar blocked a shot by Dave Cowens with 10 seconds left, and a jump shot by Havlicek rolled off the rim as regulation time expired.
