#### Giscard d'Estaing Sworn In As 20th French President

PARIS (AP) - Valery Giscard d'Estaing was inaugurated today as the 20th president of France, ending 16 years of unbroken Gaullist rule and ushering in what he called "a new era in French politics.'

A 21-gun salute boomed over the capital as the new president took office in a brief ceremony in the Elysee palace. Giscard d'Estaing formally began his seven-year term when novelist Andre Chamson, acting chancellor of the Legion of Honor, handed him the insignia of grand master of the order.

## **Balanced Budget Called Best Inflation Weapon**
