Thinking back to the "good old day," one wonders how many Midlanders of today saw or even remember Harley Sadler and his traveling repertory company?

# Delegates OK Refinery-Level Petroleum Tax

AUSTIN, Tex. (AP) — Texas tax was 100-50, exactly the two-nuld make other states pay axes on Texas petroleum prod-cts under a amendment dopted by the Constitutional

Convention.

Other states make Texans pay their state taxes on such things as Detroit cars, Kentucky bourbon and Alaskan king crab, supporters of the amendment argued Tuesday.

The amendment authorizes a tax on petroleum products at the refinery level and makes this tax an exception to the requirement that the present tax of 5 cents per gallon of gasoline must be split three-fourths to the highway fund and one-fourth to public schools.

Texas could levy a refinery-level tax today, but under the present constitution the money would have to be used exclusively for highways and schools.

Texas raises more than \$300 million each year on its gasoline tax. This tax is levied at gasoline tax of Texas petroleum products. Approximately 76 per cent of all Texas petroleum products go out of state.

The 5-cent gasoline tax would remain dedicated to highways and schools, but the legislature conceivably could repeal that tax after voting for the refinery-level tax, which would raise more money.

That would leave it up to the legislature to decide how much money the highways and schools should get from taxes on petroleum.



Since 1958, Romania has de veloped resorts along the southernmost 45 miles of its coast with beds for 100,000 tourists in hotels and villas. They are mostly packed during summer.

The Romanian Riviera las year contributed an estimated \$100 million to the country's balance of payments.

About 750,000 foreign tourists stayed on the Black Sea coast half from socialist countries and half from the West, Iliescu

Mamaia is the northernmost of the resorts, next to the busy port of Constanta. At the time of the Communist takeover in 1948, Mamaia had one 400-bed hotel, a few private villas and a dowdy summer palace for Romania's royal family.

Now Mamaia, a modest Miami Beach on a strip of sand between the sea and Lake Sutghol, has 45 hotels with 35,000

Further south is the 25,000bed resort of Eforie built around a health center offering various forms of physical therapy and baths in the mud of Lake Tekirgol. Romanians claim this black goo, formed of ancient, decayed plants, is an effective treatment for rheumatism, skin disorders and other ailments.




