MEDDLING WITH THE CALENDAR.

A LOT of folks have been complaining about the calendar. It s all out of kilter, and doesn't suit 'em. Since reform is everywhere the leaves of the fan palm. these days, it has struck at one of the oldest institutions, congress has been asked to pass a law fixing up some of the work of Pope Gregory that has been running things in the calendar line for sev-

There are some who think it impossible to change the calendar, but we're not so certain about that. We've seen some of our oldest institutions decay and fade away during the past few years. Who knows but wht the proposed 13-month year may not shortly become

The proposed calendar will contain 13 months of 228 days each exactly four weeks, with two independent holidays—New Year and Correction day, the latter only to take care of Leap year. Neither of these holidays is included in any month.

Every month is to commence on Monday and end on Sunday. Sunday, under the new calendar, would be the last day of the week, instead of the first.

Legal holidays, and church days, like Easter and Good Friday, would always come on the same date of each year. Advantages of such a system are apparent. A promissory note would always come due of the same day of the week given.

Of course, one would be called on to pay an additional month's house rent, which might be serious these days of ascending rent



LENINE NOW RECEIVES HIGHEST RUSSIAN PAY

Red Army Mell Disciplined, Says Cor-respondent on Tour—All Males Up to 35 Years Must Fight.

AMSTERDAM, Feb. 23 .- A tour of soviet Russia has been made by a staff correspondent of the Handelsblad who is writing a series of articles describing conditions throughout the country and in the army as coming under his personal observation. He deals with the morale of the soviet armies, the compulsory military system, the ridicule of atrocities reported in the foreign press, divisions in the red army over bolshevism and the well-to-do as well as the poor in the soviet regime.

Russia has been completely mobilized," he says, "with all the able-bodied men of the country from the minimum fighting age up to 35 years, and with officers regardless of age. alternative and they are obliged to fight under the general administration of the commissionaries who are bolshevist to the backbone.
