Another modern printing machine—a Miller press feeder— has been added to the job printing department of the Cisco Morning News. A machine that feeds to an absolute register all kinds of paper, cardboard, envelopes, will in addition to eliminating the tedious work of hand feeding, turn out a better class

While the invention is new, it has been given a thorough trial in printing offices all over the country, and has been found an efficient printing tool where

with the human press feeder. A pile of paper is fed into the machine. The machine feeds a sheet at a time into the pues, delivers it back in a pile, so that every sheet is printed exactly alike. The machine is especially adapted to two or more color.

The Cisco Spirit

We commend to other communities the spirit of the progressive town of Cisco! It is the spirit which insists that a thing can be done if it must be done.

. Cisco found itself facing a situation in its schools which is not uncommon in Texas communities just now. More money was needed in order to keep them open and at a standard which would insure the education of the children of the town. Teachers had to be paid adequately if they were to be retained. The taxes were not sufficient to meet the situation. What was there to be done

Well, the people of Cisco knew that something HAD to be done. The situation could not be permitted to "just los result of that would be. They knew that even spent by children under overworked or incompetent teach ers are frequently more harmful to them than if they remained away from school altogether. There is no more mistaken idea than that a very poor school is better than no omething MUST be done. And so they set out to do

They held a mass meeting to discuss the situation. It was clear that there must be more money for the schools and it was equally clear that the people of Cisco must pro employed. The upshot of it all was that they cut all the red-tape and simply raised the money right there at the meeting. There were about four hundred persons present and they voluntarily pledged and contributed fifteen thous and dollars. Seven thousand of it was paid in cash. The other eight thousand was pledged. That made an average of about \$37.50 per capita. Some gave more, some less. But the money was raised.

Now, this is not the proper way to raise money to support the schools, of course. It is not equitable, and it is not "according to law." But if there is no other way to be found, what ought the people of Cisco have done? Let the situation "just jog along?" The people of Cisco thought otherwise, in any event. They felt that the education of their children should not be sacrificed to red-tape. It may be that some gave more than their share and others gave less than they ought to have given-that the "tax" was not levied equitably. Be all that as it may, after the meeting hey were able to send out the message to the world "Cisco schools will not close!"

Yes, we commend to other communities the spirit of th progressive town of Cisco. When it reached an obstacle it climbed over it. It neither stopped nor went back.






