Wintering Sheep on Grass.

A Jefferson county, Ohio, corresfull experience in wintering sheep

"In the fall of 1901 we lost almost all of our feed, except corn, by fire. Having quite an amount of long grass we concluded to try wintering some sheep upon this. We placed thirty-two ewes, two email weithers and a ram in one flock and allowed them to remain upon the grass alone until cold weather, or about the time we usually begin feeding hay. Then we ted corn one peck per day antii abous Feb. 1, when we suostituted one-half peck of oats for in equal amount of corn. 
