

It was a province of Mexico from that time to 1846, when Kearney made his conquest, and it has been United States territory ever since.

> New Mexico's history since its annexation more than half a century ago has had many picturesque episodes. The traders, with their headquarters in St Louis, established from the Missouri oldest of the trails west of the Mississippi, and Americanized that town and the greater part of the province long before Kearney's army, marching over the Santa Fe trail, entered the territory. A territorial government for New Mexico was one feature in Clay's compromise of 1850, and thought attempts were made then and often afterward to let New Mexico into the circle of the States, all of them failed, but the chances are that the admission bill before the present Congress will pass.
