ed for blinders, for his eyes are soset in his head that he can see behind him without tarning his head. and of course the blinders deprive him of seeing the very things he should see for his own safety as well as his driver's. A horse's eye is a beautiful object, and it is a shame to cover it.

Whenever I see a man driving a horse without blinders I always feel like stopping him and shaking hands with him. A horse's head is the best part of him and should have on it as little harness as pos-


