## I Always Celebrated Armistice Day

When I was growing up in West Texas my fumily always celebrated Armistice Day. It was considered a end of World War I Europe, It was mude Europe. It was made a sanctioned Holiday in 1926.

My father, B.L. Autry served in the American Infantry in France durin World War I. You can be sure World War I. You can be sure he taught his children the meaning of the Eleventh Month, Eleventh Day and Eleventh Hour of 1918 !
"And there is two minutes of silence at 11 O'clock," he reminded us.
Then he recalled where he had been on that first Armistice Day, on a battlefield across the world from our pleasant stockfarm.
"That forest in France was shot to pieces," he said "Just stubs of trees and those trenches - filled with snow and mud and tired, cold soldiers. Barbed wire was Names Like Belleau Wood, Reservoir, Khe Sanh and no Veterans' Sacrifices
In 1918, on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day in the eleventh month, the world rejoiced and celebrated.

After four years of bitter war, an armistice was signed, and the "war to end all wars" was over. In subsequent years, Armistice Day, now Veterans Day, became a time to honor those who have served our country, preserv ing its freedoms and in many cases, making the supreme sacrifice to do so.
Names like Belleau Wood, Normandy, Iwo Jima, Chosin Reservoir, Khe Sanh aind now Baghdad immortal-

"Many times I was out driving wagons and hauling ammunition, with shells trying to pick us off. But that tay make a moveny was about probably int or some kin "The Ge Germany.

"We heard whispers about something strange going on Then it happened! Just at II a.m. word ran down the trenches to quit firing back.Then, all at once, everything got quiet from the other side - real quiet. It was he best quiet I had ever heard in my life!
"The officers told us the war was over - peace had come! And I knew I would be going home to Texas!"
As my Dad told his story I was certain there would never be another war. Why should there be?

Click It Or Ticket Enforcement Mobilization To Run Nov. 14-28 "Buckle Up In Your Truck" Educational Campaign Continues

Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas and the Indian NationsDuring the regional "Click It Or Ticket" enforcement mobilization Nov. 14-28, travelers in Texas and across the region will risk getting a ticket if they are ignoring state safety belt use laws, according to Terry Pence, traffic safety director of the Texas Department o Transportation.
"Observation surveys show safety belt use stands at only 83.2 percent in Texas. That means a lot of unbuckled motorists are putting themselves at high risk of injury and death in a crash that can happen anywhere anytime, impacting family and friends," he said.

This month National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and its partners are continuing the "Buckle Up in Your Truck" educational campaign to increase safety belt use in pickup trucks in Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas, and the Indian Nations, according to South Central Region NHTSA - Administrator Georgia S. Chakiris. "Immediately after the first awareness period in May 2004, pickup truck belt use increased more than 8 percentage points in the region. Advertising and
media messages were aimed toward males ages 21-39, a group with low belt use. Evaluation surveys showed that males in that age group showed the sharpest increas in awareness," she said. NHTSA records show that well over a million pickup drivers and passengers in the five state region are still not buckling up, resulting in more than 1,000 pickup occupants dying every year in traffic crashes. In Texas, safety belt use by drivers and passengers in pickup trucks is more than 5 percentage points lower than in other passenger vehicles.
"The safety belt use law in Texas and the other states in our region applies to pickup truck passengers as well a
drivers, but passengers continue to have even lower afety belt use than drivers," afety belt use than drivers," Ms. Chakiris said. "Wearing safety belts gives drivers and passengers the edge for survival in a crash," she said. "Pickup trucks are twice as likely to roll over as passenger cars. Safety belt use reduces the risk of dying in pickup rollover crashes by 70 to 80 percent, she said "If a man you love "If a man you love is riding unbuckled in a car, SUV, van, or truck, do something about it! Beg. Plead. Whatever it takes. Tell him you don't want to get along without want to get al
him," she said.
