Winter Weather Predictions from NWB-San Angelo

A warming trend has been observed in the equatorial waters of the Pacific Ocean since last Spring. This warming is associated with the development of El Nino. The Climate Prediction Center forecasts El Nino conditions to likely continue through this winter and into the Early Spring of next year. How might this have an effect on the weather in Texas?

The warmer waters of the equatorial Pacific can have an effect on global circulation patterns, which in turn affects the strength of storm systems, the jet stream, and the track of storm systems across the United States during the Winter months. During El Nino conditions the jet stream and storm tracks tend to be displaced farther south across the United States. This can bring above normal precipitation to Texas. This offers a hope of receiving some much needed rainfall; given the drought conditions which our area has experienced during the past year.

The 90-day forecast for temperatures and precipitation for Dec. 2006 through Feb. 2006 shows an outlook

issued by the Climate Precipitation Center and which takes into account the anticipated effects of El Nino.

For Western Central TEXAS, the 90 day outlook calls for equal chances of having above, near, or below normal temperatures for nearly all of Texas. It should be noted, however, that intrusions of very cold air can still occur at times during the winter, and this is not accounted for in these long range outlooks. The 90-day outlook for precipitation indicates that precipitation will most likely be above normal across our region.

In West-Central Texas, normal temperatures in December drop from the lower 60s into the 50s and then remain in the 50's into February, before rising back into the lower and mid 60s. Normal low temperatures drop through the 30s in December, and then remain close to 30 through January before rising up through the 30s in February. The winter season on average brings the lowest precipitation amounts to West-Central Texas.

Emergency Farm Loans Applications Being Accepted

"Applications for emergency farm loans caused by drought, excessive heat and high temperatures on January 1, 2006 and continuing are being accepted at the Farm Service Agency (F.S.A.) office located in Anson, Richard G. Young said today.

"Callahan is one of 17 contiguous counties in Texas recently named by the Secretary of Agriculture eligible for loans to cover part of actual production losses resulting from drought, excessive heat and high temperatures on January 1, 2006 and continuing."

Richard G. Young said, "Farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 100\$ of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue the agricultural business, which

ever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest is 3.75 percent."

"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for a F.S.A. emergency loan," Richard G. Young said. Farmers participating in the Federal Crop Insurance program will have to figure in proceeds from these programs in determining their loss.

"Applications for loans under the emergency designations will be accepted until August 14, 2007, but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing and possibly over into the new farming season," Richard G.

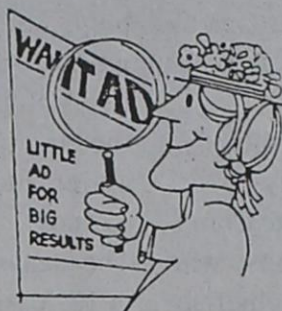

Governor grants Christmas season pardons

AUSTIN - Gov. Rick Perry on Dec. 20 pardoned Billy Wayne Miller of Dallas after DNA testing proved his innocence and the Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles recommended his case for clemency.

Miller, who was released from the prison system seven months ago after having served 22 years, was convicted of aggravated sexual assault in Dallas County in 1984 and received a life sentence. Post-conviction DNA testing showed that Miller was innocent. The district attorney, district judge, sheriff and police chief all supported the pardon.

Perry also pardoned 14 other current or former Texas prison inmates - 11 from Dallas County, counting Miller - following recommendations by the Board of Pardons and Paroles. Most were in their teens or early 20s more than a decade ago when convicted of minor offenses.

AG files suit against polluters

Texas Attorney General Greg Abbott on Dec. 20 sued four Houston-area chemical plants owned by Lyondell Chemical Co. and subsidiaries.

Court papers filed in Travis County say the plants repeatedly failed to prevent harmful air emissions and are in violation of Texas environmental laws.

Negotiations to settle with the four chemical plants reached an impasse earlier this year. In its lawsuit, the state is seeking civil penalties ranging from \$50 to \$25,000 per day, per violation.

Future comptroller hires deputy

Newly elected State Comptroller Susan Combs, who will be the state's chief accountant, named Martin A. Hubert deputy comptroller. In joining the Combs administration, Hubert, 43, follows Billy Hamilton, who resigned recently after serving as deputy under departing Comptroller Carole Keeton Strayhorn.

Hubert is currently serving as a member of the the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

Combs and Hubert will be sworn into office on Jan. 1.

Gaming group to make proposal

The lobbying group Texas Gaming Association announced a plan to use casino revenue to pay college tuition

for high school graduates. Details of the plan have not been finalized by the group, but a tuition-paying plan would be tied to the Legislature's acceptance of the group's proposal enabling the construction of casinos.

The idea is to embed casinos in 12 "casino destination resorts," three of which would be located on Indian reservations within the state.

For the plan to come to fruition, the Texas Legislature would have to pass legislation requiring an amendment to the state constitution, and Texas voters would make the final decision at the ballot box.

Officials' training deadline to hit

Each elected or appointed public official who is a member of a governmental body must have completed a course of training in the Texas Open Meetings Act and the Texas Public Informa-

tion Act before Jan. 1.

Passed in 2005, the law also requires public information coordinators to take the training.

Anyone who wishes to do so may view the training videos online via the Web site www.oag.state.tx.us.

Restroom opening effort begins

A 10-year-old Austin girl has begun an effort to convince lawmakers to consider

legislation requiring businesses to make restrooms available to the public.

She wants businesses to be more accommodating to people who suffer from digestive ailments and other conditions.

New cigarette tax to take effect

The state sales tax on cigarettes will increase a dollar on Jan. 1 to \$1.41 for a 20-pack.

Inaugural scheduled for top execs

The second inauguration of Gov. Rick Perry and Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst will be on Jan. 16.

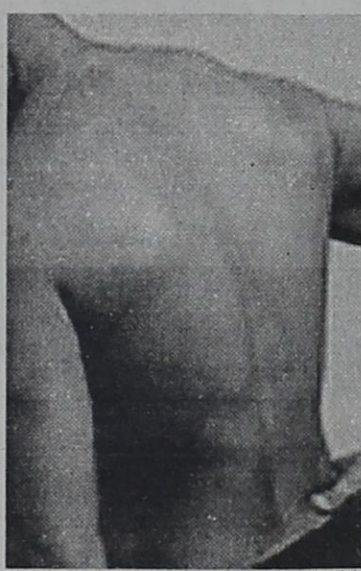

AREA MEDICAL DIRECTORY

Where To Store Groceries?

You just made a trip to the supermarket, and now you have to unpack your groceries and put them away. You probably have your standard spots for storing food, but are they the right places to preserve and maximize freshness? You may be surprised to find that where you place your food can compromise its taste and promote spoilage.

Here's a list of the right places to store food both in and out of the refrigerator.

FLOUR: fridge or counter

That's right, flour can be stored in an airtight container in the refrigerator or right on the countertop. If you don't use your flour frequently, meaning it takes longer than a year for you to use up a package, store it in the fridge. Wheat flour should always be stored in the refrigerator because it contains oils that can make it spoil faster.

COFFEE: cabinet

Placing coffee in the freezer or refrigerator exposes it to fluctuating temperatures, which in turn generate condensation on the inside of the can. This actually causes the coffee to brew a tiny bit each time the condensation is present, and that diminishes flavor. Store it in an airtight container in the cabinet instead.

BREAD: counter or cabinet

Bagged bread can stay fresh for up to four days at room temperature no matter what the variety, if sealed in its original wrapping. Bread can also be frozen for up to three months. The refrigerator dries out bread, making it go stale faster.

OLIVE OIL: fridge or cabinet

Olive oil needs to be kept out of light to maintain taste and freshness. Either a cabinet or the refrigerator is a viable place.

POTATOES, ONIONS, GARLIC: cabinet

While your first inclination may be to store items such as these

menu-helpers in the fridge, they actually keep better in a cool, dark place — imitating the soil from which they were plucked. Keep them in a cool cabinet away from light, and be sure to store them separately from one another or scent and moisture problems can be an issue.

IN THE REFRIGERATOR

Now that you've learned what needs to go in the refrigerator, here's a basic run-down of how the fridge should be organized.

The crispers: Store leafy vegetables, broccoli and other veggies with a good deal of surface area in one crisper so they maintain moisture. Use the other crisper for fruit, like apples, which stay fresher in the fridge than when stored at room temperature.

The door: Condiments often contain preservatives that prevent them from spoiling as quickly as other foods. Since the door is opened fre-

quently, exposing foods in this location to much-warmer temperatures than within the refrigerator, don't put any foods here prone to fast spoiling.

Top shelves: Place foods and snacks that you enjoy the most here, because they're easy-to-see and easy-to-grab. Plus this storage locale keeps them at the right temperature for snacking. Also put butter here, a much safer place than on the door.

Bottom shelf: Store all meats on the bottom. The

bottom shelf is the coldest part of the refrigerator, so it makes sense. Plus, this prevents any bacteria-containing juices from dripping down on other foods. Also store eggs on the bottom — in their original carton. Keep the carton closed to avoid odor infiltration. Leftovers and milk should be placed on the bottom shelf as well, where they can be kept freshest.

On top of the refrigerator: Don't store any food up here. It's very warm in this location, which can spoil food and even wine.

Recipe Corner

The Ultimate Scalloped Potatoes

Serves 4
3 large Russet Potatoes, peeled and cut into 1/2-inch cubes
4 tablespoons butter, melted
1 cup half-and-half, or as needed
Salt
Freshly ground white pepper
Finely chopped fresh chives and/or parsley for garnish
Preheat oven to 350 F.
In a saucepan, combine the potatoes with cold water to cover and a large pinch of salt. Bring to a boil over high heat, reduce the heat to medium, and simmer until the potatoes are tender when pierced with a knife, about 5 minutes. Drain the potatoes and transfer to a baking dish. Pour the butter and then the 1 cup half-and-half evenly over the potatoes and season with salt and pepper. Add a little more half-and-half if needed to cover the potatoes

completely. Place the potatoes in the oven and bake until most of the liquid has been absorbed, about 30 minutes. Remove from the oven, sprinkle with the chives and/or parsley, and serve.

The 'Blahs' Come Next...

At the initial thought of "blahs" that inevitably follow holidays, I feel the heated breath of the little drummer boy bearing down on me. On top of that, a bunch of big drummer thugs are with him, all determined to drum me out of the corps. Still, I must do my duty, even if it means being strongly linked to "scroogeness" and "grinchiness." Armed with statistical data supported by three out of four New York doctors, it is mine to warn you: The days AFTER Christmas require just as much caution as dodging parking lot looters a few days earlier....

In general, we relax too soon once the big day is over, failing to remember a primary physics law: Whatever goes up must come down. He's been the object of ridicule by neighbors up and down the street all year long....

Let's admit it. We've all made similar mistakes. Careful much of the way, we

close poorly, guilty of crowding too much into already packed-out schedules.

Such is the lot of a 30-something woman who supervised the moving of her family to a new town and gave birth to her second child

a couple of weeks later. Through it all, she's also ridden herd on a four-year-old daughter with the "energy of an electric Chihuahua." A few days ago, the child tired out at day's end, leaving color markers strewn about, caps asunder. Mom, equally frazzled, admonished, "You'd better put the caps back on those markers or their batteries will go down!"

May your batteries stay up during this holiday season. Handle "take-downs" safely, remembering where most accidents occur. And in the happy new year, if a child or grandchild drags out a coloring book, don't suggest coloring with a flashlight....

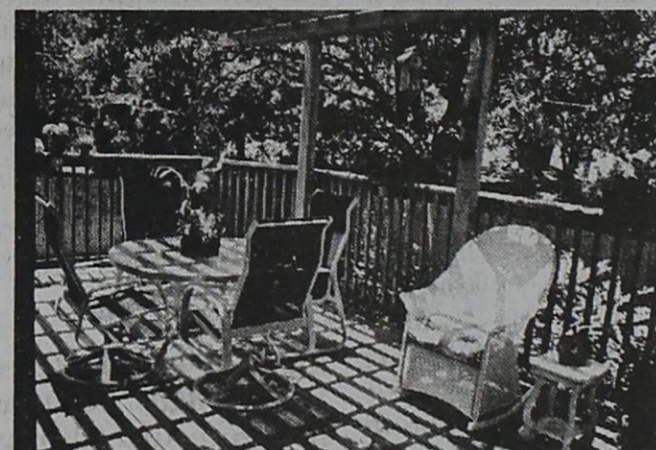

The maximum amount of rain reported during this period was 24.15 inches in Brown County, which was about 2.49 inches below normal. The minimum amount reported during this period was about 2.49 inches below normal. ter supply reservoirs have experienced significant declines. Lake Stamford has dropped to about 66 percent of conservation capacity, which is a 34 percent decline compared to this time last year. Lake Brownwood has fallen to 72 percent of capacity, which is about a 21 percent decrease compared to this time last year. At the end of November, 2006, E.V. Spence Reservoir was about 13 percent of

capacity and O.C. Fisher Reservoir was about 7 percent of capacity.

Looking ahead, the winter months are historically dry for west central Texas. Even with normal rainfall during the winter months, the hydrologic drought conditions are expected to persist through the winter. However normal winter rainfall may generate short term relief to the agricultural drought.
