Lately you may have found your telephone open tor's "Number, please?" delayed a few seconds. I is because the telephone system here is extra busy, usually, if you will wait.
We are doing all we can to bring service back to prewar standards, but to help tide over this period of telephone shortages we have had to stretch the families.

This crowds the switchboard at times with more calls than can be handled quickly, especially in midmorning and early evening. Only so many operator quite heavy, some telephones cannot be answered as quickly.
However, more people who would otherwise still be waiting now have service. Others will have tee phones as soon as we can get switchboards in and
