



Instruments which measure the penetration of various rock formations by radioactive materials will help scientists determine the compisition of the formation. Radiation measurements also may make it possible for oil searchers to determine whether a porous formation contains oil or water, either fresh or salt. Exploration and measurement with radiation counters may indicate the ifficiency of other methods now used to locate oil
