# It's The Same Proposition! 

## If YOU APPROVED THE WHITE RIVER WATER-DISTRICT LAST OCTOBER YOU WILL VOTE FOR THE BOND ISSUE SATURDAY, AUG. 17

## THE SAME WATER RATE!

Before the confirmation election last October 27 setting up the Whit River Water District, the taxpayers of Crosbyton, Ralls, Post and Spur were informed in a printed brochure that water from the proposed reservoir would cost the cities 30 c per $1,000 \mathrm{~g}$ gllons. Added to thi that would be charged the cities if the bond issue is approved August 17. There has been no change in this figure since the first estimates were made.

## TAX RATE THE SAME!

You were told that the average home owner in the four cities would pay a tax of approximately $\$ 1.25$ per year, less than $\$ 1.00$ per month. This figure remains about the same. If 30 c per 1,000 gallons is charged for water, the tax rate will be 12 cents on the $\$ 100$ valuation. Valuation will be about 80 per cent of actual value. For instance, if you have $\$ 10,000$ home $1 t$ wil rate of 12 cents, your annual tax would completely in four or five years.

## HERE'S WHAT HAPPEMS

You are probably wondering how the above is possible, since the bond issue is $\$ 4,000,000$, rather than the first estimate of $\$ 2,500,000$. The answer is simple-your directors have found a source of revenue whic will take care of the increase in cost of the project. Oil companies oprating in Garza and Kent Counties have been contacted, and they end make them produce more, a common practice in oil fields where water is available. With these oil companies contracting for the surplus water in the lake, it puts the proposition right back where it was las October as far as the four cities are concerned-it will cost the cities o more than we first anticipated.

## AN IRONCLAD GUARANTEE!

oters have an ironclad guarantee that the project won't cost them any more than this, too. Their guarantee is that the bond companies have said flatly that they cannot buy more than $\$ 2,500,000$ of the bonds. If something should happen and the contracts with the oil companies are not signed, then the dam cannot be built even though the bonds have been approved, simply because the bonds cannot be sold.
This is about as good a guarantee as a voter could have in seeing that his interests are protected.
