



An analys of the results of the "More Cotton on Fewer Acrees" contest for 1924, sponsored by the Dallas Morning News in co-operation with the extension service of Texas A. & M. College has been made by the Department of Agricultural Administration under direction of Dr. F. A. Buechel which throws interesting sidelight on the cost of producing cotton by "high" men in last year's cotton contest.

The crop records of thirtyeight "high" men in the cotton contest were examined and reduced to a common basis by the agricultural economists at Texas A. & M. College, the work falling largely upon the shoulders of C. M. Purves.

The question often is asked: "Just what does it cost to produce a pound of cotton in Texas?" There have been many guesses and some expert opinions based upon careful analysis and it usually follows that highest yields per acre can be produced at the smallest production cost. This is borne out by some of the results of the "More Cotton on Fewer Acres" contest as established by the analysis just completed by Dr. Buechel and Mr. Purves.

The lowest cost of raising cotton in the 1924 State-wide cotton contest, as recorded in the crop records jus analyzed at Texas A. & M. College, was 9.75c a pound by J. H. Littleton of Vernon, Wilbarger County, West Texas. Mr. Littleton did not use commercial fertilizer. The cost for John W. McFarlane's five acres of cotton which won him the \$1,000 State-wide prize is given in the table as 12.21c a lb. There were several entrants whose cotton cost between 10c and 12c a pound and the average per pound cost for the thirty-eight "high" men is given as 12 1-2c a pound. This is about one-half of what the average cost of raising cotton in Texas was last year, in the opinion of economists.

Official Standing of Cotton Contest Entries

Entries in the Cotton Contest reached a total of 3,547 Saturday at noon, an increase of 102 over last week's total of 3,445. Gregg County is still leading with 240 entries. Other high counties are Rusk, J183; Harrison, 133; Smith, opkins, 112; Cherokee, ar, 75; Anderson, 68; ches, 66; Bowie, 66, Navarro, 59; Titus, 56; Comanche, 54.



The violin part of this unusual combination is the most interesting of all, because it plays the trills, turns, vibrato and positions with greater accuracy and with fully as much expression as many a good violin player. Each one of the four strings is bowed by a revolving tube, which is about the size of an ordinary checker. Each one of these is made up of some 30 or 40 thin celluloid discs which take the place of the horse hairs in the ordinary bow. Every time the music roll automatically rewinds, these discs are revolved against two pieces of rosin and so are rosined and ready to play the next few pieces.
