FEAR THE DENSIST?

A glass of orange juice a day keeps the dentist away when accompanied by an hour or two of sunshine, Dr. Percy Howe, noted dental authority, told an audience at Harvard Medical School at Boston.

Even more important than the toothbrush is the need for fruit, fresh green vegetables and a daily sun bath, said Dr. Howe.

"Primitive people all have perfect teeth," he continued. "They never use a toothbrush, and yet they never suffer from decay." Eskimos were said to owe their good teeth to the large amount of oil they consume, and natives of India to the strong glare of the sun.

Pyorrhea, known as "the dread mouth disease," according to Dr. Howe, is caused by abnormal nutrition. Monkeys used for experiments became sufferers from dental decay, pyorrhea, hardening of the arulcers and stiff joints when they were put on a deficient diet. As soon as they were given plenty of raw greens and orange juice they became tormal.

The same reaction to incordiets is said to be true human beings are coned. Poor eyesight and cataracts also are produced by feeding the animals an excess of one type of food, and in one

case blindness was produced.

Dr. Howe used in illustrations the case of an immigrant girl who never used a toothbrush, and a little boy picked up in the congested part of a large city. The girl was in perfect physical condition.
