The new Dictator Six offers the brilliant performance characteristics of Studebaker engineering and the roomy comfort of liberally dimensioned bodies mounted on a chassis of 115-inch wheelbase. The six body models are offered at prices ranging from \$995 to \$1195," said Mrs. Foley, local Studebaker-Skinner dealer through whom the announcement was made. "The truly fine car quality evident in the new six at these prices marks a new achievement in Studebaker's unique One-Plant manufacturing system.

"With its smart appearance, its exceptional riding and driving ease, and its brilliant, yet thrifty performance, the new Dictator Six is a notable addition to Studebaker's family of championship cars. In every respect it is worthy to assume the place of its predecessors, whose achievement in traveling 6000 miles in 4751 consecutive minutes has remained unchallenged as a standard of performance and stamina for stock cars priced below \$1300.

Double drop frame and the long 115-inch wheelbase have made it possible for Studebaker body engineers to design a car of exceptionally graceful lines. Its low swung appearance is emphasized by sweeping fenders hung low over the wheels, and the skillful use of body moldings and smart new color schemes.

In appearance the new Dictator Sixes are strongly suggestive of their companion cars, the new Dictator Eight, and The President Eight and Commander models which have won such popularity since their introduction at the automobile shows last winter. The new Dictators, however, are marked by a new arrangement of hood louvers in groups of three, set off by attractive pin striping. Like their companion cars the new models are distinguished by gracefully curved windshield pillars, deep narrow radiator, big hub caps, and many bright touches of long wearing, tarnish proof chromium plate.

"Every detail of the interior finish reflects the fine car quality made possible by the resources of Studebaker's own ten million dollar body plants. The low prices at which the cars are offered are belied by wide, deeply cushioned seats, shaped to afford the utmost riding ease, and by fine mohair upholstery. Rear seats in the sedans are flanked by heavy upholstered arm rests.

"As in other Studebaker cars, front seats and steering wheel are readily adjustable to the most comfortable driving position. Pedals are covered with heavy rubber pads. The steering wheel is the Husted steel core safety type with comfortable thin grip, and will not break or shatter under the most severe stresses.

"The divided seats in the club sedan fold forward and permit entrance through either door. An unusually convenient type of adjustment is found on these seats. By pressing a button at the base of the seats each can be moved forward or back through a range of several inches.

"Details emphasizing the complete equipment include cowl ventilator, automatic windshield cleaner, non-glare rear vision mirror, and coincidental lock to steering and ignition. Illuminated by a special flood light on the dash. Speedometer, oil pressure gauge, ammeter, engine thermometer and hydrostatic gasoline gauge are mounted in individual dull silver frames and group in an indirectly illuminated panel. Deep pockets, protected by a convenient flap, are located forward of the doors under the cowl.

"The new Dictator Six is a product of the engineering skill responsible for the success of a world champion President Eight and the Famous Commander. It reflects the same characteristics of power and stamina which have enabled Studebaker to win every official speed and endurance record for fully equipped stock cars.

"The Dictator Six engine is the quiet L-head type with fully machined combustion chambers and an advanced carburetion and manifold system which endows the motor with remarkable operating economy. Bore and stroke are 3-3/8 by 4 1/8 inches, giving a piston displacement of 221 cubic inches and a taxable rating of 27.3

horsepower. The motor actually develops 65 h. p.

"Unusually smooth operation at all speeds is secured through the combination of a heavy counterweighted crankshaft, statically and dynamically balanced and fitted with a Lancheater vibration dampener, and 10 1-4 inch connecting rods matched in sets for perfect balance.

"The crankshaft is driven by adjustable silent chain and mounted in four long bearings. Valves are chrome nickel steel for intake and silichrome steel for exhaust, operated by quiet mushroom type push rods. Valves are cooled by ample water passages in the cylinder block.

"Lubrication is full pressure feed to main, connecting rod and crankshaft bearings. Oil filter, crankcase ventilator, and thermostatic control of the cooling system, which promotes a quick warming of the motor, combine to reduce crankcase dilution to such an extent that oil need not be changed more often than at 2500-mile intervals after the first 1000 miles of operation.

"The carburetor is fitted with the semi-automatic choke used on The President Eight, The Commander Sixes and Eights, and The Dictator Eight. It prevents crankcase dilution by eliminating excess choking. A fuel pump supplies gasoline to the carburetor through a filter from a 14 gallon tank in the rear.

"Starting and ignition are Delco-Remy, with distributor on the right side of the motor driven by an auxiliary shaft. The ignition system is protected against moisture by rubber caps on distributor and spark plug cables. All wiring is enclosed in metal conduits.

"Four point motor suspension with rear motor supports cradled in rubber, adds to the rigidity of the sturdy chassis construction. The double drop frame is reinforced by compound flanges and is of heavy pressed steel with side members 5 1-2 inches deep and 2 inch flanges.

"An important feature contributing to the handling and riding ease of the new chassis is the force-chacking of the front springs. Proving Ground test revealed that this construction results in marked steering stability.

"Long semi-elliptic springs provide a 90 inch spring base, with 36 inch springs in front and 54 inch springs in the rear. Hydraulic shock absorbers are standard equipment.

"Nineteen inch wood wheels with heavy spokes are fitted with 5.50 non skid balloon tires on all models except the Regal sedan, which has six wire wheels.

"The complete range of body types includes a smart, comfortable club sedan for five passengers priced at \$1035, a five passenger passenger touring listing at \$1095, and a distinctive Regal sedan with two
