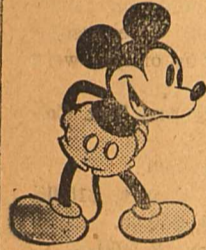

**NOTICE OF ELECTION OF SUPERVISORS TO BE HELD FOR THE DUCK CREEK SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT.**

TO ALL PERSONS HOLDING LEGAL OR EQUITABLE TITLE TO LAND within the Duck Creek Soil Conservation District, who are otherwise qualified voters under the general election laws of the State, and who reside within the Duck Creek Soil Conservation District:

Notice is hereby given that on the 29th day of June, 1940 between the hours of 7 a. m. and 7 p. m. an election will be held for the election of three supervisors of the Duck Creek Soil Conservation District in the State of Texas.

All persons who hold legal or equitable title to lands lying within the boundaries of the said district, who live within the district, and are otherwise qualified voters, under the general election laws of the State, are eligible to vote; only such persons are eligible to vote.

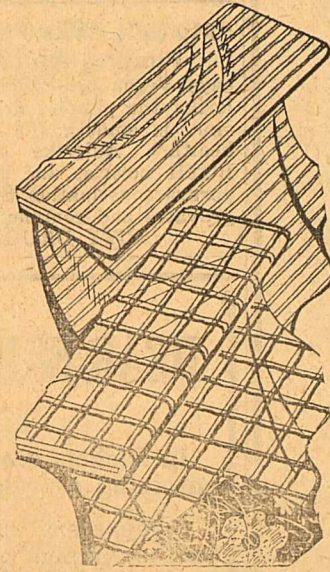
