



Southwest Wins Another Court Round

WASHINGTON (AP) Southwest Airlines, a commuter carrier operating four jets only in Texas, kept the federal courts in its corner Monday and won another round in its battle to remain at Dallas Love Field.

The U.S. Supreme Court for the second time refused to consider a U.S. Circuit Court's order permitting Southwest to remain at Love Field rather than being forced to move to the Dallas-Fort Worth Regional Airport. The Supreme Court first declined to revew the lower court decision Dec. 16.

The court's refusal to hear the case again leaves the cities of Dallas and Fort Worth with almost no options in their efforts to make Southwest move to D-FW.

Southwest contends it is more convenient for the majority of its customers to use Love Field, located in the middle of Dallas. The airline also was not a party to an agreement by other airlines. The federal courts have repeatedly agreed with Southwest, saying the airline cannot be forced to relocate as long as Love Field exists as an airport.

In ordering that the lower court decision should be reviewed, the cities said the Supreme Court has ruled in previous cases that "federal courts should not decide questions of relationships between a state and its cities."

Bills Propose Bilingual Work In Kindergarten Austin Bureau

AUSTIN - Bilingual education programs would be extended to kindergarten children enrolled in public schools under proposed legislation building on the current law mandating such programs in the first through sixth grades.

Co-authors of the bill are Sens. Jack Ogg of Houston, Chet Brooks of Houston, Raul Longoria of Edinburg and Tati Santiesteban of El Paso. Ogg and Brooks sponsored the original bilingual program bill #N-3010 Bread Pan two years ago.







Still Higher Than Charters
The 30 scheduled airlines of

the International Air Transport Association announced Monday the plan they hope will boost sagging transatlantic travel and help them compete with charter flights operated by the nonscheduled airlines. But the the International Air Tra lowest summer rate proposed is still 35 per cent more than the fare Pan American World Airways charges on its charter flights for groups.

These are the key provisions of the proposal: —The so-called APEX ticket for people of all ages who book and pay 60 days before departure and stay abroad from 22 to 45 days. A round-trip between New York and London will cost \$295 in winter, \$309 in spring and autumn and \$395 in the summer.

Regular Fare Increase -The regular 22-45 day ex-cursion fare between New York and London will rise to \$363 in winter, \$393 in spring and autumn and \$493 in summer. This ticket does not require payment 60 days in advance.

-The round-trip class fare between New York and London without the 22 - 45 day restriction will rise to \$584 winter, \$626 in spring and fall and \$764 in summer.

Youth Fares -The proposed round-trip outh fare between New York and London would be \$387 in winter, \$411 in spring and fall and \$458 during the summer. It also has no time restrictions and would appeal to students wanting to spend a summer, semester or school year in Eu-

Travel on the scheduled airliners' North Atlantic routes dropped more than six per cent in 1974, and the prospect for 1975 is gloomier because of the recession and higher hotel and meal costs.





WASHINGTON - Some of the biggest names in America have been linked to a Texas Watergate scandal, which involves a bungled wiretap operation, a coverup attempt and some accompanying shenanigans.

The story is every bit as fantastic as the Washington Watergate drama. After weeks of investigation, we now have dug the details out of unpublished court records and sealed grand jury

The roots go back to the late oil curmudgeon, billionaire H. L. Hunt, whose children and aides split up in a classic struggle over his enormous wealth. One faction was led by the Hunt brothers, Bunker and Herbert, who suspected another faction of siphoning funds from the senior Hunt's empire.

To satisfy their suspicions, the government charges, they hired wiretappers who, in Watergate style, botched the job. A wiretapper, spotted outside the house of a former Hunt executive, was arrested on Jan. 16, 1970. The trail led to the two Hunt brothers, who began frantically pulling political wires to keep their names out of the scandal.

We already have reported the sworn testimony of two witnesses who told of a \$50,000 to \$60,000 "payoff" to the powerful Senate Judiciary chairman, Sen. James Eastland, D-Miss., whose committee has jurisdiction over the Justice Department. He made calls in behalf of the Hunt brothers to Richard Kleindienst, who was then the deputy attorney general, and to House Apwhose nephew, Eldon Mahon, was one of the prosecutors.

Kleindienst called both the head of the Criminal Division, Will Wilson, and Wilson's aide, Henry Petersen, about the case. Wilson and Mahon then spoke to Mahon's prosecutor-nephew. But all deny that they brought any political pressure to help Hunt. Eastland also swears he never received a cent from the Hunts, except a fair market price for some Charloais cattle.

The Hunt brothers managed to ward off an indictment for three years. But on Feb. 28, 1973, they were indicted. Both have pleaded not guilty. Bunker potential witnesses in the case, accord to largely undisputed testimony.

We have traced the Texas Watergate case from Capitol Hill in Washington to Houston's plush Maxim's restaurant, from The Hague and London to Hunt's headquarters in Dallas. The Justice Department is officially silent on the case. But their court filings in Dallas state that Burker Hunt and some of his henchmen "are the subject of the grand jury's investigation . . . of obstruction of justice."

HEMISPHERE REPORT-Runs Much Of Latin America

By WILLIAM GIANDONI Copley News Service

It is easy to understand why the United States objects to "the tyranny of the majority," if you observe what is going on in Latin America these days. There, it seems, those who are loudest in their denunciations of the

United States for keeping Latin America in semicolonial status, as the propagandists would have it, are loudest in their demands for the kind of help that insures their continued dependence on the United States. Those who are harshest in their

criticism of the military junta that has run Chile since the elected government of Marxist President Salvador Allende was toppled, for the most part, represent military dectatorships or regimes whose democratic purity is subject to considerable doubt. Those who are most ardent in their

apologies for Premier Fidel Castro's Communist dictatorship in Cuba admit that he has not stopped exporting revolution and, in fact, that he has reaffirmed his willingness to support armed revolution wherever it may be waged against

a capitalist regime. Take a careful look at Venezuela. all but drowning now in petro-dollars, where the estimated \$10 billion extra it will earn this year is that South

American country's biggest economic

President Carlos Andres Perez and his government have admitted that there is no way that sum of money could be put to work immediately in a country with a population of only 12.4 million people without causing horrendous in-

So what does Venezuela do? In truth, so far, not much more than talk. Talk of making \$500 million available to the Inter American Development Bank for loans to Latin countries. Talk of investing millions in Central America. Talk of financing cartels in other raw materials and commodities that Latin America produces, similar to the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC), of which Venezuela is a founding member. Talk of nationalizing the U.S.-owned iron mining and oil companies that earn Venezuela most of its dollar income and putting the foreign exploiters out of business.

Of course, when questioned more closely, Venezuelan spokesmen admit that, even after the government takes over the iron mines and oil fields, the companies will have to stay on long in the fulfillment of assumed obligations, enough to teach Venezuelans how to But, above all, Carlos Andres Perez

and economic unity." The group he en-

visions would not replace the Organization of American States of which the United States is a member. Rather it would be a body in which Latin America could "adopt fundamental decisions for its own development and the joint positions that should be discussed with the United States within the OAS'

The idea is not original. It has been tried before. But this time, the Venezuelans say, it is going to be "much more profound.

As at the recent high-level conference in Lima, organized by Peruvian dictator Gen. Juan Velasco Alvarado in commemoration of the 150th anniversary of the battle of Ayacucho, most Latin government spokesmen cloaked their sentiments in lofty language.

The Declaration of Ayacucho, for example, proclaims "our adhesion to the principles of the juridical equality of states, of their territorial integrity, of self-determination of peoples, ideological pluralism, of respect for human rights, of nonintervention and international cooperation, of good faith of peaceful solution of international controversies, and the prohibition of the use of threats, of the use of force and armed, economic or financial aggression in relations between states."

President Perez was the only head of state who signed the declaration whose government does not violate some or most of those principles.

The other executives who signed the declaration were Gens. Velasco, president of Peru: Hugo Banzer, president of Bolivia; and Omar Torrijos, chief of government of Panama, all of whom head regimes produced by military

The four remaining countries that participated in the three-day conference were represented by their foreign ministers or by presidential envoys. They were Argentina and Colombia, which have elected governments, and Chile and Ecuador, whose governments came to power by way of revolution.
